The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio has set for hearing at this time and place two cases, 12-218-GA-GCR and 12-318-GA-UEX, Duke Energy Ohio's GCR case and their uncollectible expense rider case.

My name is Kerry Sheets. I'm an Attorney Examiner for the Commission. I have been assigned to hear these cases. May I now have the appearance of the parties, please.

MS. WATTS: Okay. Your Honor, we docketed a stipulation on Friday, and today we have an amended stipulation to offer into the record. And the only change between the two documents we have deleted the Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel as a signatory party.

EXAMINER SHEETS: Very good. Do you have a witness to call?

MR. LINDGREN: Yes, your Honor, but first I would like to move into evidence as a Commission-Ordered Exhibit No. 3 the Independent Accountants Report applying agreed upon procedures filed on November 14, 2012, in Case No. 12-318-GA-UEX.

I would also like to note for the record the stipulation that we have signed says that the two

- Q. Thank you. Mr. Sarver, were you involved in the negotiations that led to the signing of the stipulation or the amended stipulation filed in this case?
  - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Thank you. And was the settlement a product of serious bargaining among capable, knowledgeable parties?
  - A. Yes.

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- Q. And can you explain how that was so?
- A. Staff worked with Duke's technical experts and legal counsel to craft a stipulation that resolved in the recommendations and issues raised in the three audit reports.
- Q. Thank you. In your professional opinion does the settlement as a package benefit ratepayers and the public interest?

A. Yes, sir.

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- Q. Thank you. And can you explain those benefits?
- A. The benefits for Duke's ratepayers will be to increase accuracy and efficiency of the company's accounting systems along with forecasting methodology changes that will determine how much pipeline capacity Duke will contract for in the future. These pipeline capacity contracts are recovered through the company's gas cost recovery mechanism.
- Q. Thank you. And are you familiar with the regulatory principles and practices that apply to proceeds such as this?
  - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. And based on this knowledge, does the settlement violate any important principle or practice?
  - A. No, sir.
