PETITION OF CINCINNATI BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY LLC FOR REVIEW OF A DECISION OF THE POOLING ADMINISTRATOR

Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company LLC ("CBT") hereby requests that the Commission review and overturn a decision of the number Pooling Administrator ("PA") which denied a CBT request for numbering resources. On February 6, 2013 CBT filed a request with the PA seeking an entire NXX in the Cincinnati rate center to meet a specific customer request that CBT was unable to satisfy with its existing numbering resources. The PA denied CBT's request on the grounds that CBT does not meet the months-toexhaust and utilization criteria established by the Federal Communications Commission. Under the federal numbering rules, a state commission may overturn the PA's decision based on its determination that the carrier has demonstrated a verifiable need for the numbering resources and has exhausted all other available remedies.¹ For the reasons set forth below, CBT submits that the Commission is justified in overturning the PA's decision and granting CBT's request for a new NXX to meet this customer's needs.

The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), in its Third Report and Order in the Numbering Resource Optimization proceeding, found that "a carrier should be able to get additional numbering resources when there is a verifiable need due to the

carrier's inability to satisfy a specific customer request."² It also clarified that states may grant requests by carriers in such circumstances, as long as the request is for a customer seeking contiguous blocks of numbers and not vanity numbers.³ Therefore, this Commission has the authority to overturn the PA's decisions under the appropriate circumstances.

Catholic Health Partners' Request

In the immediate case, CBT has a request from Catholic Health Partners ("CHP") for 10,000 numbers to be used for a new hospital and medical offices currently under construction in Cincinnati, Ohio (see Attachment A). Construction of the new Mercy West Hospital is nearing completion and the hospital is scheduled to open in the fall of 2013. The medical office building being constructed next to the hospital is scheduled to open in 2014. CHP expects to use approximately 5,000 numbers at the hospital and another 2,000 – 3,000 numbers at the medical office building. The remaining numbers would be held by CHP and used for additional growth at its facilities in the Cincinnati region.

CHP has requested a full NXX, with the third digit of "5" ("NX5") so that it can incorporate these new numbers into its corporate-wide 5-digit dialing plan. Securing this NXX may also enable CHP to convert some numbers at its other Cincinnati facilities to this NXX and retire the old numbers. Any existing numbers that are retired would be returned to CBT and any uncontaminated thousands-blocks would be donated by CBT to the number pool in the Cincinnati rate center.

CBT has reviewed its number inventory and has no unopened NXXs in the

Cincinnati rate center. However, as shown on the attached Pooling Administration

System Worksheet, CBT's request for a new NXX for this customer was rejected because

it does not meet the MTE and Utilization threshold (see Attachment B).

Conclusion

For the reasons set forth above, CBT requests that the Commission overturn the PA's decision and direct the PA to grant CBT's requests for a full NXX in the Cincinnati rate center to satisfy the needs of its customer.

Please accept this letter as a formal request for a 10,000 consecutive DID block of numbers. If possible we would like the prefix to end in the number "5", and please use (513)xx5-xxxx as reference. This will enable us to create new internal extensions, and then look to retire existing numbers that we can return to Cincinnati Bell. The request for numbers is driven by Catholic Health Partners continued growth in Ohio, and commitment to patients we serve. The block of numbers will be used for Mercy Health's new Mercy West Hospital that is under construction in Cincinnati, Ohio, and for our corporate dialing plan. Mercy Health is the Cincinnati Division of Catholic Health Partners.

The new Mercy West Hospital located at 3300 Mercy West Boulevard in Green Township opens in 2013, and will be a 250-bed facility with the latest in advancements designed for patient care. The Hospital will have approximately 5,000 employees that will include staff, physicians, nurses, volunteers, etc...with an estimated 4,000 numbers required. The new Hospital will include:

- Inpatient and Outpatient care
- Heart care with open heart surgery
- Cancer center
- Orthopaedics center
- Women's health center
- OB/maternity care
- Family Birth Center
- Primary and Specialty care physician offices
- Community Center
- Education Center

Mercy West Hospital will serve as the center of our growing network of healthcare services throughout the West Side of Cincinnati to enhance access to quality medical care through a variety of services and locations – both inpatient and outpatient. We are committed to providing a network of care that makes it easier than ever for patients to receive the care needed, in a setting they prefer right in their community. Catholic Health Partners telephony strategy is to deploy Cisco IP telephony equipment for new facilities, and when legacy end of life phone systems need to be replaced. The block of numbers will allow us to implement a corporate wide 5 digit dialing plan, account for growth in staff or new physician offices and patient care support. One of our goals is to reduce the confusion to our patients, their families, doctors and staff. The approval of this request will help accomplish this goal by allowing for a single prefix. As
