MOTION TO EXTEND PROTECTIVE ORDER

Waterville Gas Company ("Waterville" or "Applicant"), hereby moves pursuant to Rule 4901-1-24(F), Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") for the extension of a protective order entered by the Commission in its Finding and Order dated November 22, 2011 to preserve the confidentiality of volume and price information contained in Exhibit A attached to the "Full Requirements Natural Gas Transportation Service Agreement" submitted as Attachment A to the Application by Waterville for approval pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code §4905.31. The basis for this motion is set forth in the accompanying Memorandum in Support. Movant submits that the non-disclosure of this confidential information is not inconsistent with the purposes of Title 49, Ohio Revised Code. Furthermore, Waterville submits that public disclosure of individual shipper's volumes and costs will continue to have a deleterious effect on competition. In conformance with Rule 4901-1-24(D) (2), OAC, three unredacted copies of the document containing the information for which extended protection is sought were filed under seal in this case on October 13, 2011.

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MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO EXTEND PROTECTIVE ORDER

Waterville requests that the price and volume information contained Exhibit A appended to the agreement set forth in Attachment A to its Application continue to be protected from public disclosure. Waterville submits that both parties to the agreement might be harmed by such public disclosure by providing competitors with proprietary trade secret information. Waterville notes that Johns Manville International, Inc. requested that Waterville seek protection for this trade secret information. Waterville agrees that the price and volume information needs to be kept confidential. Waterville competes directly with another public utility that has a direct connection with another nearby manufacturing facility of Johns Manville.

In its Finding and Order entered on November 22, 2011, the Commission found that this information contained in Waterville's application contained trade secret information; that its release is not prohibited under state law; and that the nondisclosure of this information is not inconsistent with the purposes of Title 49 of the Ohio Revised Code (Finding and Order, p. 2,

release is not prohibited under state law; and that the nondisclosure of this information is not inconsistent with the purposes of Title 49 of the Ohio Revised Code (Finding and Order, p. 2, ¶10). Waterville submits that the information continues to constitute trade secret information and that the Commission's findings remain valid.

The Commission's Order also properly noted that the protective order granted on November 22, 2011 would automatically expire after 18 months from the date of entry of the Order, unless Waterville filed this motion at least 45 days in advance of the expiration date, pursuant to Ohio Admin. Code Rule 4901-1-24(F). Waterville has now complied with that requirement by the filing of this Motion and Memorandum in Support.

WHEREFORE, Waterville respectfully requests that the protective order granted in the Commission's Finding and Order in this case on November 22, 2011 be extended for an additional eighteen months for good cause shown.
