- 1. ExteNet Systems, Inc. ("ExteNet") is required to comply with the requirements of the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC") Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (the "Report and Order") in WC Docket No. 07-135 et al., In the Matter of Establishing Just and Reasonable Rates for Local Exchange Carriers, dated November 18, 2001, which adopted a transitional intercarrier compensation restructuring framework for both intrastate and interstate telecommunications traffic exchanged with a local exchange carrier, and the subsequent Entry, cited in the header above, issued by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (the "Commission").
