After talking to the driver Larry Aynes, he said the officer checking the load told the driver that he did not have the right binders to secure the lcad. Though, he was talking about the securements in the floor not the binders. So the driver put on another chain and the officer was satisfied and said he would check the load and he barely checked them from the ground not getting up on the trailer.

We then inspected the chains and binders and the weight rating on each one them. First the binders are rated at 6,600 lbs. the size doesn't matter. Second we checked the chains and knew the chains where 3/8 and are also rated at 6,000 lbs. So having four chains securing the load is within the load bearing weight of 26,400 lbs. The load, was 44,600 lbs. and to secure the load you must have enough chains to secure half the weight which is 22,300 lbs. and the four chains secure 26,400 lbs. thus having plenty of chains to properly secure the load.

As a company we assure that each driver knows how to secure any load he is hauling. We have been in business for 40 years we have a knowledge and the no how to secure each load safely and properly. We follow the Fleet Safety Compliance Manual reading and knowing the safe and proper way to secure a load, especially steel coils or anything related to the steel business. The driver Larry Aynes has been working for us for over 22 years and has one of the best safety ratings of all are drivers. Safety is one of our top priorities. Don Carpenter also dispatched the load personally and was the President of the Pennsylvania Motor Truck Association.

I have checked and calculated several different ways to see how the officer came up with his findings. And still can't figure out how he came up with his deductions. If I could, I would like an explanation of how he came up with what he came up with. We are a small company so any misunderstandings that are on our safety report can make us look worse than what is true.

I would like a hearing to straighten out any misunderstandings and to hopefully avoid this incident to be put on Trux Transportation, Inc. Safety Report.


