ALJ AGRANOFF: Why don't we go on the record at this time.

The Ohio Power Siting Board has assigned for public hearing at this time and place Case No. 12-1361-EL-BSB which is captioned in the Matter of the Application of AEP Ohio Transmission Company, Inc., For a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the Construction of the Biers Run Station.

My name is Jay Agranoff, and I'm the Administrative Law Judge assigned by the Ohio Power Siting Board to preside over this evening's local public hearing. Also with me this evening are Mr. Steve Irwin and Mr. Matt Butler from the Ohio Power Siting Board staff. The three of us are available if you have any questions concerning this application or any other utility matter. Feel free to approach us after this evening's public hearing, and we'll be happy to discuss any matters that you might have.

At this time we'll have the appearances of the parties in this particular proceeding. On

behalf of the Applicant.

MS. MILLER: Thank you, your Honor. Erin Miller on behalf of AEP Ohio Transmission Company, One Riverside Plaza, Columbus, Ohio 43215. At this time I would also like to enter an appearance on behalf of my colleague who couldn't be here this evening, Matthew Satterwhite.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you.

MS. MILLER: Thank you.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Is counsel from the Ohio Power Siting Board here this evening?

Let the record reflect that there is no counsel here on behalf of the Ohio Power Siting Board.

Are there any other entities who would like to make a formal appearance in this proceeding?

Let the record reflect that there are no such entities.

As I had explained earlier when we were off the record, the subject of today's hearing is limited to the application filed on December 20, 2012, by AEP Ohio Transmission Company, Inc., seeking approval for the construction of a new 345/138/69 kV substation near Chillicothe, Ohio. The Applicant submitted that the new substation facilities will

improve reliability, reinforce the 138 kV and 69 kV systems in the area to mitigate low voltage in the event of an outage and address thermal loading issues during peak load and outage conditions.

The Applicant proposes to locate the new substation on an approximately 102 acre piece of property located about 4 miles northwest of the City of Chillicothe between Biers Run Road and State Route 35. According to the Applicant the size of the substation will be approximately 8.5 acres, will go back 3.5 acres for an access drive.

According to the application the

Applicant plans to start construction of the

substation in the third quarter of 2013 beginning

with the station access road and associated bridge.

The estimated in-service date is approximately second quarter of 2015.

The purpose of this evening's public hearing is to receive comments from you regarding AEP Transmission Company's application in this case.

This is not a question and answer session but instead is your opportunity to let the Ohio Power Siting Board know what you think about the proposal set forth in the company's application.

There is also, as I mentioned previously,

an evidentiary hearing scheduled to be held in this case on June 25, 2013, at the Board's offices in Columbus.

I would also note that the Board's staff filed its Report of Investigation on May 23, 2013. This is simply a recommendation of the Board's staff and does not necessarily reflect what the Board's final determination will be in this case.

Now, before we actually go forward, I would like to get an update from the Applicant regarding the notifications that were filed that were provided to the adjacent landowners.

MS. MILLER: Yes. Your Honor, pursuant to Section 4906-5-08 of the Ohio Administrative Code AEP Ohio Transmission Company did, in fact, mail out letters of notification pursuant to that rule on May 28, 2013, and proof of service of those letters of the -- of the return receipts were docketed -- were filed in this docket yesterday on June 10.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. And do you know approximately how many landowners that encompasses?

MS. MILLER: Yeah. There are four landowners affected, landowners that received the letters.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Okay. Thank you.

MS. MILLER: Thank you.

ALJ AGRANOFF: The Board appreciates your participation in tonight's hearing, and we want everyone who is interested to have the opportunity to testify.

As I mentioned earlier, I have a list of individuals that have indicated their desire to testify. I'll call your name as it appears on the sign-up sheet, and when I call your name, please come forward, I will swear you in, and then you'll have the opportunity to testify. When you do so, please remember to give your full name and your full address.

And with that why don't we begin. If Mr. Paul Martin can come forward, please. And, sir, if you want to use the mic, you are more than welcome. Please raise your right hand, sir.

PAUL MARTIN

being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

ALJ AGRANOFF: If you could please state your full name and address.

THE WITNESS: Paul Martin, 514 Golfview 1 2 Drive. I'm here initially out of concern for the 3 route, the blue route. I didn't know this was a 4 separate issue so I have nothing that is relevant to the substation. 5 6 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you, sir. 7 Mr. Ray Shorts -- I'm sorry, Storts. Please come forward, Mr. Storts. 8 9 MR. STORTS: Mine was just not to testify 10 as such but just to represent Unioto. ALJ AGRANOFF: Okay. Thank you, sir. 11 And Mr. Cormany. 12 13 MR. CORMANY: Cormany. 14 ALJ AGRANOFF: Yes. Please come forward, 15 sir. Right there, sir. Please raise your right 16 hand. 17 18 RICHARD CORMANY 19 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 20 examined and testified as follows: 2.1 DIRECT EXAMINATION 22 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. Your full 23 name, sir, and your full address. 24 THE WITNESS: Richard Earl Cormany, 3287 25 Biers Run Road, Chillicothe, Ohio.

We represent the closest house in proximity to the alternate site, and if you go to the page 11 in the Staff Report Investigation, it says there are no residents located within a thousand feet of the preferred site. One residence is located approximately 700 feet from the alternate footprint. This residence is located to the east of the site across Biers Run Road.

Well, that's us so we would be the most impacted resident to the site on the alternate site so naturally of the two, if we have to have the substation at all, we would prefer that it be the one that the -- that AEP also prefers which in the picture is the red site. It is furthest from our house. It's also the furthest distance from any house so it impacts the residents to a much lesser extent than this what they now call the alternate site.

If they were to choose the alternate site, it would impact us along the entire distance of our farm boundary line on the west. It would be right up against our farm boundary, go across Biers Run Creek, and continue past our house along the -- what would that be, the east side for the entire distance of this western boundary of our farm. Our

house is this little yellow dot located right here. This farmhouse here is abandoned. No one lives in that so we definitely prefer the site that AEP has selected as their preferred site.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Sir, just so I can clarify the record, when you are referencing the dot, can you just identify the document that you are looking at?

THE WITNESS: Okay. The document is in the overview map 12-1361-EL-BSB, Biers Run Substation Report, and it's an AEP document, I assume.

ALJ AGRANOFF: That was part of the Staff Report?

THE WITNESS: It's part of the handout tonight. It is not in the purple investigation.

ALJ AGRANOFF: It's included as part of the staff's.

THE WITNESS: Okay. Then, yes, it is.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you.

THE WITNESS: To AEP we are this little yellow dot right here. In addition, I would also like to point out that the -- one of the routes of the power line would follow our boundary line from the -- whichever substation they choose along this side and then turn a 90-degree angle at the end of our property and follow our boundary line another

mile -- quarter mile or so along the backside of it so the -- one of the proposed routes which they call the red route to the power line would impact one-half of our total boundary line of our farms, the east side, the west side, and the northwest side, and the east side, northeast side of our farm, each of which in the range of maybe a quarter of a mile. So we would be doubly impacted by the substation and the power lines, particularly in most -- particularly if they chose this alternate site, the yellow one, so we are sincerely hoping that they choose what's on here is a red site which is their preferred site tonight. Thank you.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you, sir.

Ms. Miller, do you have any questions?

MS. MILLER: No, thank you, your Honor.

Thank you.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Appreciate that.

Mr. Scott Cormany.

MR. CORMANY: Yeah.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Please come forward, sir.

Please raise your right hand.

1 SCOTT CORMANY being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 2 3 examined and testified as follows: 4 DIRECT EXAMINATION 5 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. If you could 6 state your full name and address, please. 7 THE WITNESS: Scott Cormany, 3464 Biers Run Road, Chillicothe, Ohio. 8 9 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. 10 THE WITNESS: I don't have any of the documents. Yeah, can I see that? 11 12 But to follow the previous speaker, my father, I prefer the red site as well which is the 13 14 AEP preferred site. I do not prefer the yellow site. It's closer to my parents and it's closer to me and 15 my wife and my wife's pregnant, 16 weeks pregnant. 16 17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: For the record. 18 THE WITNESS: For the record. 19 (Applause.) 20 THE WITNESS: And it would not only --2.1 you know, it's extremely close to my parents, but it 22

site as well. If it were up to me, we wouldn't have a substation there at all because we were given two options. It was the red and blue sites. Now, it's the red and yellow. But it's two sites on the same farm which impacts the same people, so to me it's not two options. It's the same option.

It's not a good option for us. It's going to hopefully not adversely affect our health, but I'm pretty certain it's going to affect our land values and our quality of life. So I just want to state for the record that the red site is my preferred site if a substation has to go next door to me.

As far as the power line, same thing,
AEP's preferred route which actually goes south of
U.S. 35 runs the majority of its track along existing
easements and an abandoned railroad and existing
utility poles, existing right-of-ways, so it has the
least amount of impact to me because it already
follows existing right-of-ways, and it leads to an
existing substation. So that's really all I have.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you, sir. Any questions, Ms. Miller?

MS. MILLER: No, I don't. Thank you.

THE WITNESS: Thank you.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Erica Cormany.

Is there anybody else that came in late or suddenly had a change of mind and would like to speak?

Yes, sir.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It's not sworn testimony. Your distance as report it's more than 4.1 miles, probably closer to 8 miles.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Okay. Thank you.

I would like to thank everybody for attending, and at this time, as I mentioned earlier, we will wait probably about another 20 minutes or so to see if anybody else may come in that would be interested in testifying.

The other issue that I did want to raise if there is anybody here from the media and they would like to be on our service list for the purposes of getting any releases that we may make in this proceeding or any orders that are issued, we would be happy to take your name and address and make sure that you did receive those. So to that extent, if you could let Mr. Butler know and he will be happy to take that information back.

If there isn't anything else, then we'll just be in recess for about another 20 minutes, and I

We were told that the new 25 transmission lines would be coming into our area. I

guess that project hasn't been approved but then I came down here and I saw the plans and, you know, I talked to a bunch of people and I was a little disturbed, first of all, that we are given two options here on the place where we are going to be putting the plant and it's -- it's like A or B. It's not A, B, or even possibly C. They are basically the same option. It's kind going to slightly affect or even heavily affect one family, it sounds like.

But then I found out that this is totally unrelated to the transmission lines which to me is a little ridiculous that we have this -- we are putting in this giant plant, it's going to be affecting people, and there is a secondary plan to put in transmission lines. Obviously it's worthless without the transmission lines. And one of the options is going to put power lines within 200 feet of my house which is obviously very concerning to me and my family along with all of my neighbors.

So, first of all, I would like to say I think it's unfair to the public and to the people who live in this area that we're separating these two projects. They are not put together and that we're only giving -- getting kind of one option on where to put it so no matter what it's not going to have any

alternate plans for the transmission lines so what I would like -- I would propose that we -- we don't put the transmission line -- or we don't put the substation in until we can come up with an alter -- I'm sorry, alternate site that's fair to everyone involved, so.

I think that's all I have to say on the matter. So thank you very much for listening.

ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you, sir.

Ms. Miller?

MS. MILLER: I do have one question.
