REPLY COMMENTS OF THE KROGER CO.

I. REPLY COMMENTS

A. If The Commission Approves A Storm Cost Recovery Rider For DP&L, Staff's Recommendation To Charge A Fixed Rate Per Customer Per Month Is Reasonable.

The Kroger Co.'s ("Kroger") initial comments in this docket opposed Dayton Power &

Light Company's ("DP&L") proposal to recover the Storm Cost Recovery Rider ("SCRR") for Secondary Electric Distribution Service through an energy charge, and instead, Kroger recommended redesigning the SCRR as an equal percentage rider, or, alternatively, incorporating a demand charge component for the Secondary Electric Distribution Service tariff. The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("PUCO" or "Commission") Staff's comments in this docket filed June 17, 2013 recommend charging a fixed rate per customer per month for storm recovery expenses. To the extent the Commission approves a SCRR for DP&L, Kroger believes that Staff's recommendation to recover expenses through a fixed rate per customer is also reasonable alternative to DP&L's proposal.
