ALLIANCE **ARRESTS** Police arrested two Franklin County men accused of stealing from Lowe's stores in three counties. The men were arrested at 7 p.m. Monday at the Lowe's store at 2424 W. State St. on felony receiving stolen property charges. Stark County Jail records said they stole \$1,174 in merchandise and drove away with it in a car owned by the brother of one of the men.

August trial date set for Castro

CLEVELAND A man accused of kidnapping three women and holding them in his home and raping them over a decade was given a late summer trial date Wednesday.

Ariel Castro, 52, appeared in court for a brief hearing as the judge mentioned the possibility of a plea deal raised last week by the defense and asked that any deal that emerges be submitted by attorneys in writing.

Prosecutor Tim McGinty left court without comment.

Castro faces another pretrial hearing June 26.

As in previous court appearances, Castro had his wrists and ankles shackled and kept his chin tucked in his chest. He answered "yes" and "no" to the judge's questions about his understanding of the proceedings.

The judge mentioned the possibility of a plea deal raised last week by the defense and asked that any deal that emerges be submitted by attorneys in writing.

Prosecutor Tim McGinty left court without comment.

Outside court, Castro attorney Craig Weintraub said the defense was focused on whether the prosecution had enough evidence to get an aggravated murder conviction for an allegedly forced marriage involving one of the women.

The prosecutor hasn't said whether he would pursue the death penalty. Weintraub hinted last week that a plea agreement to avoid a trial was possible if the death penalty was taken off the table.

"That's the most important aspect of the case to us and obviously whether or not the death penalty would be applicable," he said. "It's been shifted to the prosecutor's office as to whether or not they want to pursue this. But as of right now, we haven't received any of the evidence that would support an aggravated murder conviction."

McGinty told the judge that his office was working to provide the defense with required access to the evidence on a timely basis.

Also Wednesday, lawmakers in Columbus briefly addressed a bill that would provide the women years of relief payments, college tuition and medical assistance.

Ex-chief of VA Medical Center indicted

CLEVELAND A former director of the Veterans Affairs medical center in Cleveland is accused of accepting bribes and has been indicted on federal charges in a long-running county corruption investigation. Federal authorities allege William Montague took bribes in exchange for influencing VA decisions and development projects. Montague pleaded not guilty Wednesday to 36 counts, which include bribery, wire and mail fraud, and disclosing public contract information.

A statement from the VA inspector general's report in charge in Cleveland said there is no tolerance for violating public trust for personal gain. Montague's attorney didn't immediately return a message seeking comment. Montague, 61, led the Cleveland VA Medical Center from 1995 until 2010. He then served as acting director of the Dayton VA Medical Center for part of 2011 before retiring.

Federal judge dismisses suit over ballot issue

COLUMBUS A federal judge has dismissed a lawsuit filed against Ohio's election chief over a declined 2012 ballot issue.

The group Fair Elections Ohio had sought to have voters decide last November whether certain election rules in the state should be rejected. The group's issue qualified for the ballot, but state lawmakers later repealed the underlying law. Secretary of State Jon Husted then didn't consider the group's issue for the ballot. The group sued for damages and another chance for the ballot. U.S. District Court Judge George Smith said Wednesday the group failed to show a clearly established right to place a referendum on the ballot regarding a repealed statute.

Smith said Husted acted "rationally and constitutionally" when he decided not to place the referendum before voters.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

AEP Ohio and AEP Ohio Transmission Company (AEP Ohio) propose to improve the transmission system in Stark County by installing a second conductor circuit and replacing several transmission structures on several power lines in the Canton area.

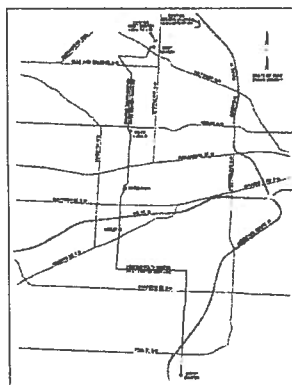
The purpose of the project is to install a second conductor circuit to the vacant portion of the South Canton - West Canton 138 kV line (BVI) line for approximately 4.6 miles, replace 19 structures along the South Canton - West Canton 138 kV line, install one new structure at the West Canton Station and replace one existing structure on the Bolton Village 138 kV Extension. Construction is scheduled to begin in September 2013.

The project is known as the Canton Area Improvements Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.11, C1, AEP Ohio has filed a Letter of Notification with the state of Ohio Power Siting Board.

The project qualifies as a Letter of Notification filing because it meets the requirements outlined in Item 4(B)(a) of the Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 4906-01, Appendix A "Application Requirements Matrix for Electric Power Transmission Lines."

The Letter of Notification for the Canton Area Improvements Project is pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board. This application has been assigned Case Number 13-0757-EL-BVI. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this proceeding.

Persons to intervene in or comment on the Letter of Notification are encouraged by the filing board up to 10 days following the publication date of this notice.

The South Canton - West Canton 138 kV transmission line is an existing 138 kV electric transmission line, and the project activities will take place in existing right of way (ROW) corridor between South Canton Station and West Canton Station. The total length of the 138 kV line is approximately 4.6 miles, and 19 structures will be replaced. The West Canton 138 kV line consists of installing one new structure on AEP Ohio

Travaco property at the West Canton Station to route the new Wayview - West Canton 138 kV circuit and the new South Canton-West Canton 138 kV circuit into West Canton Station. The Bolton Village 138 kV extension consists of replacing one existing structure.

The project will be an approximate \$2.5 million investment by AEP in its transmission system in the area. The project will allow AEP to continue to provide the level of service its customers expect.

The accompanying map depicts the project area. It should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail,
