LATE-FILED DIRECT TESTIMONY OF DAVID C. RINEBOLT ON BEHALF OF OHIO PARTNERS FOR AFFORDABLE ENERGY

- Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME, TITLE, AND BUSINESS ADDRESS.
- A. My name is David C. Rinebolt. My business address is 231 West Lima Street,
 Findlay, Ohio 45840. I am the Executive Director of Ohio Partners for Affordable
 Energy (OPAE), and I appear in this case as a witness on its behalf.
- Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE YOUR BACKGROUND AND QUALIFICATIONS FOR YOUR TESTIMONY IN THIS PROCEEDING.
- A. My career has covered a broad spectrum of activities in the energy industry including policy analysis at both the federal and state levels; design and management of energy efficiency and renewable energy deployment programs; and, extensive involvement in utility regulatory systems at the state and federal level. I have worked with alternative fuel implementation and distributed generation and have extensive knowledge of energy and environmental policy, including renewable energy development and sustainability. My resume is appended to this testimony as Exhibit DCR-1.

I have a Bachelor of Liberal Studies degree with concentrations in Communications, English, Political Science, and Russian Literature from Bowling Green State University (1978) and a Juris Doctor degree from the Columbus School of Law at The Catholic University of America (1981). I have also received training in utility regulatory policy through the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners' ("NARUC") Summer Study Program at Michigan State University. I am the author of several works on biomass energy and a regular

lecturer on regulatory policy at the National Community Action Foundation
Energy Leveraging Conference; Affordable Comfort; and the National Energy
and Utility Conference. I have also been a presenter at NARUC conferences; the
National Association of State Utility Consumer Advocates; and, the Mid-America
Regulatory Conference. In 1994 I worked for the Department of Energy on
assignment in the design and deployment of the program that made up the
Clinton Administration's Climate Change Action Plan, and was a presenter at the
White House Conference on Climate Change.

- Q. HAVE YOU PREVIOUSLY TESTIFIED BEFORE THE OHIO PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION ("PUCO" or "COMMISSION")?
- A. Yes. I testified in Duke Energy Ohio, Inc.'s Standard Service Offer Case No. 11-3549-EL-SSO, et al. (January 7, 2011) in support of the stipulation and recommendation filed in those cases. I also testified in Dayton Power and Light Company's Standard Service Offer Cases, 12-426-EL-SSO, et al., (March 1, 2013) in support of a continuation and expansion of a fuel fund to assist low-income residential customers to pay their electric bills.
- Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE THE PURPOSE OF YOUR TESTIMONY.
- A. The primary purpose of my testimony is to adopt the Direct Testimony of Stacia

 Harper that was pre-filed by OPAE in this proceeding on September 9, 2013.

 Ms. Harper is in Michigan at a NARUC conference and is unable to testify in this proceeding on the scheduled date. Through this testimony, I adopt the direct

testimony of Ms. Harper, which recommends the proper treatment of evaluation, measurement and verification ("EM&V") costs of energy efficiency ("EE") programs in the calculation of shared savings and an adjustment to Duke's calculation of shared savings based upon the proper treatment of EM&V costs.
