The serving wire center and hub V & H coordinates are also included in that tariff. When hubs are involved, mileage is computed and rates applied separately for each section of the Channel Mileage, i.e., Customer designated premises serving wire center to hub, hub to hub and/or hub to Customer designated premises serving wire center.
