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**MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT**

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On December 30, 2013, the Dayton Power and Light Company (“DP&L”) filed an application for authority to transfer or sell its generation assets. Section 4903.221, Revised Code, and Rule 4901-1-11, Ohio Administrative Code, establish the standard for intervention in the above-captioned proceeding. Section 4903.221, Revised Code, provides, in part, that any person “who may be adversely affected” by a Commission proceeding is entitled to seek intervention in that proceeding. Section 4903.221(B), Revised Code, further requires the Commission to consider the nature and extent of the prospective intervenor’s interest, the legal position advanced by the prospective intervenor and its probable relation to the merits of the case, whether the intervention by the prospective intervenor will unduly prolong or delay the proceeding, and the prospective intervenor’s potential contribution to a just and expeditious resolution of the issues involved.


Rule 4901-1-11, Ohio Administrative Code, permits intervention to a party who has a real and substantial interest in the proceeding and who is so situated that the disposition of the proceeding may impair or impede his ability to protect that interest and whose interest is not adequately represented by an existing party.

The OMAEG is a non-profit entity created by the Ohio Manufacturers' Association for the purpose of education and providing information to energy consumers, regulatory boards and suppliers of energy; advancing energy policies to promote an adequate, reliable, and efficient supply of energy at reasonable prices; and, advocating in critical cases before the Commission. The OMAEG's members are all members of the Ohio Manufacturers' Association. OMAEG members purchase electric power services from DP&L and will be affected by the Commission's determination in these matters. Therefore, OMAEG has a direct, real, and substantial interest in the issues raised in this proceeding and is so situated that the disposition of the proceeding may, as a practical matter, impair or impede its ability to protect that interest. OMAEG is regularly and actively involved in Commission proceedings, and as in previous proceedings, OMAEG's unique knowledge and prospective will contribute to the full development and equitable resolution of the issues in this proceeding, and OMAEG's interest will not be adequately represented by other parties to the proceeding. Finally, this timely intervention will not unduly delay or prolong the proceeding.

OMAEG satisfies the criteria set forth in Section 4903.221, Revised Code, and Rule 4901-1-11, Ohio Administrative Code, and is, therefore, authorized to intervene with the full powers and rights granted by the Commission to intervening parties.

WHEREFORE, OMAEG respectfully requests that the Commission grant this motion for leave to intervene and that OMAEG be made a full party of record.


