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
## **Notice of Proposed Major Utility Facility**

Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc. Raymond Golf Course Replacement Project COLUMBUS, OHIO

Ohio Power Siting Board Case No. 13-2227-GA-BLN

Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc. ("Columbia") is proposing to construct, own and operate a natural gas pipeline facility in Columbus, Ohio. Columbia is a natural gas distribution company with its principal office in Columbus, Ohio.

The project is identified as the Raymond Golf Course Replacement Project located in Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio. The proposed project involves the installation of approximately 5,400 feet (1.02 miles) of 12-inch diameter, coated steel high pressure gas main along with the replacement of a District Station located on Trabue Road, Columbus, Ohio. The proposed facility is a critical part of Columbia's long-term plans for maintaining safe, reliable service to Columbia's customers throughout Franklin County. The pipeline project begins on the east side Dublin Road and Limestone Way and ends onto the Raymond Memorial Golf Course at Columbia's regulator station. It will be buried under a minimum of 3 to 4 feet of soil cover. The general location of the proposed project is shown in the accompanying map in this notice.

Affected persons may file comments or motions to intervene in this matter with the Board up to ten (10) days following the publication of this notice. Comments or motions should be addressed to the Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793 and cite Case No. 13-2227-GA-BLN.

The Ohio Power Siting Board will review the Letter of Notification in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.10(A) which states that the Board shall not grant a certificate for construction, operation, and maintenance of a major utility facility, either as proposed or as modified by the Board, unless it finds and determines all of the following: (1) The basis of the need for the facility; (2) The nature of the probable environmental impact; (3) That the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives and other pertinent considerations; (4) In the case of an electric transmission line, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power drive of the electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability; (5) That the facility will comply with Chapters 3704, 3734, and 6111 of the Revised Code and all rules and standards adopted under those chapters and under Sections 1501.33, 1501.34, and 4561.32 of the Revised Code. In determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and standards adopted under Section 4561.32 of the Revised Code, the board shall consult with the office of aviation of the division of multi-modal planning and programs of the department of transportation under Section 4561.341 of the Revised Code; (6) That the facility will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity; (7) In addition to the provisions contained in divisions (A)(1) to (6) of this section and rules adopted under those divisions, what its impact will be on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929 of the Revised Code that is located within the site and alternative site of the proposed major utility facility; rules adopted to evaluate impact under Division (A) (7) of this section shall not require the compilation, creation, submission, or production of any information, document or other data pertaining to land not located within the site and alternative site; and (8) That the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the Board considering available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives.

## Scots urged to stick with U.K.

LONDON — British Prime Minister David Cameron waded forcefully into the debate over Scottish independence yesterday, making a fervent call to keep the United Kingdom together just seven months before Scots vote on whether to break up the 3-century-old union.

On political, economic and military grounds, Cameron argued, Scotland is better off as a part of Great Britain. But Cameron also made an unusually emotional appeal, invoking Scotch whisky and the British Olympic team as examples of suc-cessful collaborations that would be diminished by a

"This is our home and I could not bear to see that home torn apart," he said. "I love this country. I love the United Kingdom and all it stands for. And I will fight with all I have to keep us together.

Polls suggest that most

Scots agree that they should stick with their southern neighbors, and that Scotland will opt to remain a part of Great Britain in the Sept. 18 vote.

Cameron and his Conservative Party are not popular in Scotland, which tilts left politically. He badly needs to keep the United Kingdom from coming unglued, but he also risks alienating Scots if he becomes the face of the campaign against independence. His intervention could be seen as just the sort of English arrogance that the Scots are seeking to escape.

Cameron has insisted that the choice is one the Scots must make themselves, and that they should be the primary players in any debate.

He acknowledged yesterday, "Some people have even advised me to stay out of this issue - and not to get too sentimental about the U.K.

But, he said, "I care far too much to stay out of it. This is personal."

## American moved to N. Korea labor camp

WASHINGTON — A U.S. missionary being held in North Korea was moved from a hospital back to a labor camp last month on the same day he publicly appealed for Washington to help get him home, a State Department official said yesterday.

Kenneth Bae, 45, has been held for more than a year in North Korea since being sentenced to 15 years of hard labor for trying to overthrow the state. From last summer until January, he had been kept at Friendship Hospital in Pyongyang, his familv said.

"On Jan. 20 he was moved back to a labor camp, according to a Swedish Embassy representative who met with him," a State Department official said.

Bae, a Korean American. last appeared in public at the hospital on Jan. 20 when he was paraded in front of a group of foreign and local reporters and asked Washington to help him get home.

Bae's 23-year-old son, Jonathan, said his father suffers from health problems, including diabetes.

The United States has offered to send its humanrights envoy for North Korea to secure Bae's release, but North Korea has rejected this.
