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ALJ PARROT: The Ohio Power Siting
Board has assigned for public hearing at this
time and place Case No. 13-1651-GA-BTX which is
captioned In the Matter of the Application of
Vectren Energy Delivery of Ohio, Inc. for a
Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and
Public Need for the Dayton Airport Z-167
Pileline Rerouting Project.

Good evening, everyone. My name is Sarah Parrot, I am an Administrative Law Judge in the Board's Legal Department and will be presiding at the hearing this evening.

Also with me is Steve Irwin and Ed Steele sitting in the back there. They are reps of the Power Siting Board Staff.

And at this time we are going to get started with appearances on behalf of the parties to the case. And let's start with the Company.

ALJ PARROT: Thank you very much,
Mr. Miller. The subject of today's hearing is
an application filed by Vectren Energy Deliver
of Ohio for a certificate of environmental
compatibility and public need for the purpose of
rerouting a three-mile segment of the Z-167 gas
pipeline at the Dayton International Airport and
portions of the City of Vandalia and Butler
Township, Ohio.

Vectren filed this application as amended on November 15, 2013. I would also note that the Board's Staff filed a Report of Investigation on January 16, 2014. This is a recommendation of the Board's Staff and does not necessarily reflect what the Board's final

determination in this case will be.

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The purpose of this evening's local public hearing is to receive comments from the public regarding Vectren's application in this case. It is not a question and answer session, but it's your opportunity to let the Board know what you think about the proposed project.

And tonight's local public hearing is only one aspect of the process in this case. An evidentiary hearing is also scheduled to commence on February 24, 2014 at the Board's offices in Columbus.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter. If you plan to testify please speak clearly so that the court reporter can accurately reflect your comments on the record.

Also if you have prepared a written statement it would be helpful if you provide a copy to the court reporter.

When you arrived you were offered the opportunity to sign up to testify. After I finish with my introduction I will begin calling the witnesses forward that have signed the sign-up sheet and ask that you come up to

the table and face the court reporter. Before you give your comments I will ask you to state your name and your address. And before you present your testimony I will ask you to take an oath or affirmation that what you are about to say is the truth.

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Your testimony tonight will be considered part of the official record in this case, and will be reviewed by the Board before a final decision is made on the application.

Additionally, the parties to the case and I will be permitted to ask you questions about your statement. And primarily that would just be for purposes of clarification if necessary.

Should you decide that you do not want to testify, when I call your name just pass on to the next witness. And once you have finished testifying, or if you are just here to watch and you need to leave please feel free to do so.

The Board appreciates your participation in tonight's hearing, and we want everyone who wishes to testify to have the opportunity to do so. And at this point let's

be here to answer any questions pertaining to

qualifications and safety with our members.

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We have 4,000 operators doing pipeline work in the state right now out of 15,000 or so. We worked with Columbia Gas, Vectren.

We represent the operators that work for all the different energy companies, not any one in particular for that matter. It's Miller or Mid-Ohio or Michaels.

All of our operators that have worked on gas and pipeline have OQ safety, any other safety training that is required by the companies or the owners. I think Michaels has a different one that we do. Safety Training, Passport.

All these guys are qualified and skilled to work around the natural gas or natural gas pipelines in the area. So, there shouldn't be any safety problems at all.

I just wanted to show up to answer any questions if anybody had any questions about the qualifications or skills of the people doing the work.

ALJ PARROT: Thank you. If you wish to maybe stay around after we finish. If folks

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Vectren on this project, the City of Dayton, the

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Dayton International Airport's Director and staff. Also with Montgomery County TID and others on the alignment of this proposed gas line, transmission line project.
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The preferred route that we have worked so hard and diligently on is the one that the City of Union prefers. We fully support the installation of this gas line proposed by this project.

ALJ PARROT: Please continue.

MR. WEISS: All right. I live on Dogleg Road, and over the past several years a lot of land, farm land, there has been annexed into Union Township, and at much displeasure to the residents living out there.

Now we see Vectren gas pipeline wants to come along behind our homes, that is their preferred route. And I have e-mailed the engineers with Vectren and they e-mailed back to me stating that, no, Vectren doesn't want to go the preferred route, they want to go the alternate route which was on their website. And they had a preferred and alternate route. The alternate route was about .6 miles shorter than the preferred route.

And it went mainly along the airline fence line as opposed to behind all the residential homes on Dogleg Road. And I

spoke to a number of residents out there, and none of us want to have a gas pipeline running right on our property lines.

So, that is all I have.

ALJ PARROT: Any questions?

MR. STINSON: No questions, your

Honor.

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ALJ PARROT: Thank you, Mr. Weiss.

Is there anyone else who wishes to offer testimony?

I will give you a minute to think about it, maybe not a minute. A few seconds. It really is painless.

And, again, if you are here to have questions answered we will stick around once we wrap up for that purpose.

At this point I think we will go off the record just to give folks an opportunity to ask questions, then we will go back on the record at that point and see if anyone at that point has anything they wish to say. And if not we will wrap things up officially at that point.

And we have worked closely with

Vectren on locating, placing the preferred

location in this location. I think it's the

right one. It provides for the proper

relocation of the line in a way that doesn't

endanger the airport, obviously. And also is

sensitive to our comments about preserving the

amount of development land that was possible in

the area.

So, I think it's better in just about ever respect. And I would encourage you to proceed expeditiously.

STEVENSON: I just want to make 19 clear that we have an understanding whether it's 2.0 the preferred route or the alternate route, that 2.1 is between Vectren and the landowners, we just 22 want to make sure whichever way it goes we want 23 to be here to answer questions that it will be 24 done safely, productively, and on budget. And 25 make sure that it doesn't cause anymore

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inconvenience than necessary to anybody.
