Councilman Mark Hayes suggested moving the funding from the street sweeper toward street paving due to the condition of roads.

Montz said the streets have been destroyed due to the weather. Completing rebuilds on the streets would be more beneficial than repaving, but would require twice as much money, he said. He also suggested putting in curbs to help with

the life of the new pavement.

The decision to purchase a sweeper would have to be made soon, because if the city receives grant funding for additional improvement projects from the state, the city would have to pay up to \$1.6 million in matching funds, Montz also said. If the city decides to postpone the purchase, any additional funds could be put toward the grants instead of the sweeper.

"I think we need to talk about this truck and decide. Either we're going to have

to quit sweeping streets or we need to purchase it this year," he said. "If we kick it down the road any further, there's only going to be bigger purchases."

Legislation was moved to council to approve the funding for street paving and the additional funds to the parks department.

The committee is to look into meeting with the Parks Department and the Materials and Equipment committee to further discuss the purchase of a street sweeper.

The committee also dis-

cussed legislation to transfer funds and payment of bond and loan interest and principal.

Reinhart said the money was in the budget, but council is required to complete an ordinance to authorize the transfer.

The committee also approved Reinhart's request for \$15,000 for legal fees for fact finding related to union contracts.

Reinhart also said the server in the Finance Department is to be down from 1 p.m. until the end of the day today.

Manuel Chavez, the slain officer's uncle, said the shooting occurred after a man approached Chavez's wife and began arguing with her, then punching her in the face.

"My nephews jumped on this guy," Manuel Chavez told the Sandusky Register.

The man then left the bar and came back in a side door and began shooting, Manuel Chavez said.

The officer's wife, who would not provide her name, told The Toledo Blade she had been punched before the shooting started.

Wierma said Sunday the shooter had been in the bar for some time and may have gotten into a fight with another patron "when things went horribly wrong."

Jose Andy Chavez had been at a birthday party for his daughter Saturday night when Ramirez suggested they go out to celebrate the officer's birthday, which had been earlier in the week, Manuel Chavez said.

It is not known whether the two men had anything to do with the plane's disappearance. Criminals and illegal migrants regularly travel on fake or stolen documents.

Hishamuddin said biometric information and CCTV footage of the men has been shared with Chinese and U.S. intelligence agencies, which were helping with the investigation. Almost two-thirds of the passengers on the flight were from China.

The stolen passports, one belonging to Christian Kozel of Austria and the other to Luigi Maraldi of Italy, were entered into Interpol's database after they were taken in Thailand in 2012 and 2013, the police organization said.

Electronic booking

records show that one-way tickets with those names were issued Thursday from a travel agency in the beach resort of Pattaya in eastern Thailand. Thai police Col. Supachai Phuyakaoakorn said those reservations were placed with the agency by a second travel agency in Pattaya, Grand Horizon.

Thai police and Interpol officers questioned the owners. Officials at Grand Horizon refused to talk to The Associated Press.

Police Lt. Col. Raichapong Tia-wood said the travel agency was contacted by an Iranian man known only as "Mr. Ali" to book tickets for the men.

"We have to look further into this Mr. Ali's identity because it's almost a tradition to use an alias when doing business around here," he said.

The travel agency's owner, Benjaporn Kruait, told The Financial Times

she believed Mr. Ali was not connected to terrorism because he had asked for cheap tickets to Europe and did not specify the Kuala Lumpur to Beijing flight.

Malaysia's police chief was quoted by local media as saying one of the two men had been identified — something that could speed up the investigation.

Civil aviation chief Azharuddin Abdul Rahman declined to confirm this, but said they were of "non-Asian" appearance, adding that authorities were looking at the possibility the men were connected to a stolen passport syndicate.

Possible causes of the apparent crash include an explosion, catastrophic engine failure, terrorist attack, extreme turbulence, pilot error or even suicide, according to experts, many of whom cautioned against speculation because so little is known.

"Unanimous agreement in the U.S. Senate is pretty rare — but rarer still is the kind of sweeping, historic change we've achieved over the past year in the military justice system," McCaskill said after the vote.

Still, that unanimous support was in sharp contrast to last week, when military leaders vigorously opposed a measure by Sen. Kirsten Gillibrand, D-N.Y., that would have stripped commanders of their authority to prosecute cases and given that power to seasoned military lawyers outside the chain of command. The Senate voted 55-45 for that far-reaching bill, but that was five votes short of the necessary 60.

Though expressing cer-

tain reservations, the Pentagon had been generally accepting of the new bill.

The House could act on the legislation as a stand-alone measure or incorporate it into the massive defense policy bill that it pulls together in the spring.

This "is not the end of this," Ayotte said in brief remarks on the Senate floor after the vote. "We will make sure reforms that have been passed are implemented, that commanders are held accountable for a climate within their unit of zero tolerance and that victims of sexual assault are treated with dignity and respect."

The new legislation would change the military rules of evidence to prohibit the accused from using good military character as an element of his defense in court-martial proceedings unless it is directly relevant to the al-

leged crime. The "good soldier defense" could encompass a defendant's military record of reliability, dependability, professionalism and reputation as an individual who could be counted on in war and peacetime.

McCaskill described it as "the ridiculous notion that how well one flies a plane should have anything to do with whether they committed a crime."

The chairman of the Armed Services Committee, Sen. Carl Levin, D-Mich., said Monday the "military culture has been slow to grasp the painful truth that even a successful professional can also be a sexual predator."

Under the bill, the defense could still be used in the sentencing phase. The Pentagon has indicated that it is crucial as commanders adjust sentences to allow for plea agreements.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

AEP Ohio Transmission Company (AEP Ohio Transco) has proposed to improve the transmission system in northwest Ohio by upgrading an existing 138-kilovolt (KV) transmission line in Clinton and Pleasant townships in Seneca County and Ballville Township in Sandusky County.

The purpose of the Tiffin Center-Fremont Center 138 KV Line Improvement Project is to install a second circuit by rebuilding from existing single circuit H-frame structures to double-circuit single steel poles from the existing Tiffin Center Station to the existing Fremont Center Station. This project is a critical component of the Fremont Area Improvement project, which addresses a critical need for AEP Ohio Transco to reinforce its transmission system in the area. The project will help to accommodate growth in this region and to upgrade the company's transmission system in northwestern Ohio. Construction is scheduled to begin in June 2014.

The project is known as the Tiffin Center-Fremont Center 138KV Line Improvement Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906-11-01, AEP Ohio Transco has filed a Letter of Notification with the Ohio Power Siting Board, under Case No. 14-0143-EL-BLN.

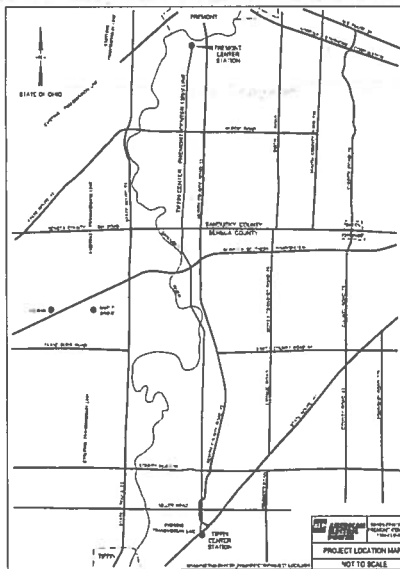
This project meets the requirements for a Letter of Notification because it is within the types of projects defined by Item 4(a) of Attachment A to the interim process described in the UPSB's September 4, 2012 Finding and Order on Docket 12-1901-GE-BRD. This states that a project qualifies for a Letter of Notification if the project is:

- (1) An electric transmission line that:
(a) consists of replacing electric transmission line structures with a different type of structure where less than two miles of new right of way is required.

The effect of Notification for the Tiffin Center-Fremont Center 138KV Line Improvement Project is pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board. This application has been assigned Case No. 14-0143-EL-BLN. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this proceeding.

Petitions to intervene in or comment on the Letter of Notification will be accepted by the siting board up to 10 days following the publication date of this notice required by Rule 4906-5-08(C)(1), OAC. Petitions should be addressed to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215-3793 and must cite Case No. 14-0143-EL-BLN.

The Tiffin Center-Fremont Center 138KV Line Improvement Project involves the installation of 22 self-supporting, single pole, dead-end structures and 123 direct embedded single



pole structures. New conductor, insulators and hardware will be installed on the structures.

The project will be an approximate \$5 million investment by AEP in its transmission system in the area. The project will allow AEP to continue to provide the level of service its customers expect.

The accompanying map depicts the project area. It should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide. show her the texts he's sending you — I presume they're time-stamped — she may believe you.

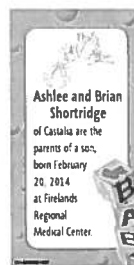

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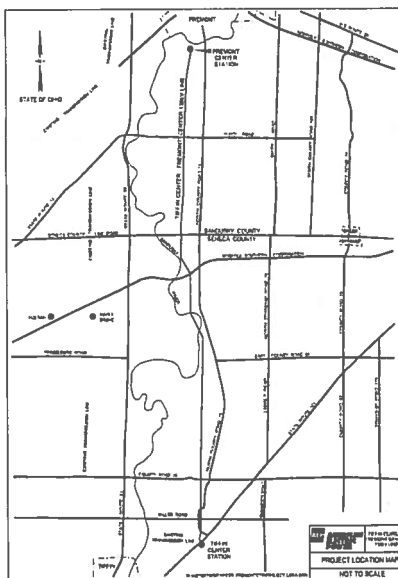
