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ALJ MCKENNEY: Good evening. The Ohio Power Siting Board calls for hearing at this time and place Case No. 13-522-EL-BSB being In the Matter of the Application of the AEP Ohio Transmission Company for Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for the 138 kilovolt Melmore Substation Project.

My name is Bryce McKenney, and I am an Administrative Law Judge assigned by the Ohio Power Siting Board to preside over this hearing.

At this time I am going to take an appearance from the company.

MR. ALAMI: Thank you, Your Honor.

Here tonight on behalf of the company, myself,

Also with me here is the Project Manager, Todd Sites. Thank you.

23 ALJ MCKENNEY: Thank you.

Tonight's public hearing is only one part of the overall proceeding. The adjudicatory hearing

will commence on April 3rd, 2014, at the offices of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. At the hearing AEP Ohio Transmission Company and the Ohio Power Sitting Board staff will have an opportunity to present evidence regarding whether AEP Ohio Transmission Company's application should be approved.

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Tonight's public hearing provides an opportunity for members of the general public to present their views on AEP's proposed project.

We will not be hearing from AEP or the Staff this evening.

Tonight is the public's opportunity to let the Ohio Power Siting Board know what you think about the proposed project.

As you may have noticed there is a court reporter present and he will be transcribing the hearing. Basically that means that the court reporter will be recording in typewritten fashion the statements that are made today. All of tonight's hearing will be part of the record in the case and will be part of the Board's consideration of the application.

I would ask that if you give testimony this evening please speak up so the

court reporter can hear you clearly.

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When you arrived there was a sign-up sheet for anyone who wishes to testify. We will take the witnesses in the order that they signed up first. After I take those witnesses I will call on anyone else who did not sign up and I will ask if you wish to give testimony.

Should you decide that you do not want to testify when I call your name merely pass or simply not volunteer to testify. When you do testify I will ask you to please stand up and just project loudly just to make sure that I can hear you clearly, the Power Siting Board Staff can hear you clearly, and most importantly the court reporter so he can get your comments down.

At the beginning of the statement I will also ask that you please state your name clearly and your address for the record. At this time I am going to begin with the witnesses.

The first person that I have that has signed in is Mike Feasel. Mr. Feasel, do you care to give a statement?

MR. FEASEL: Just a couple

questions, I guess.

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ALJ MCKENNEY: That is okay. Mr. Feasel, before I have you do that I am going to ask you to raise your right hand and swear or affirm the truth.

(WITNESS SWORN)

ALJ MCKENNEY: Thank you.

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#### MIKE FEASEL

called as a witness, being first duly sworn, testified as follows:

MR. FEASEL: I just had a couple questions here. When we received, I think it was in maybe from FedEx or the mail, we got a big three-ring binder about all this. See, we farm right next to this.

And in there they had alternate sites in there, and we didn't know anything about this. It said the landowner was approached. We never was approached. We had no idea that all these other sites was coming up. See, that is the whole deal. We were kind of mislead, you know.

But, from the paper one day, what is all this about, you know. And nobody ever told

us anything about that. It just come out in that book, you know. I had no idea. Kind of floored me, you know.

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And then another thing, they had down no residence, like a house, within a thousand feet of this. Well, the old farm house is bad. We want to replace it, but I don't know if it's a good thing to do that now or not with this coming. I just kind of wait and see what is going to happen, I guess.

That is the couple things that I can think right off the bat here.

Thank you, Mr. Feasel. I would like to clarify, I am not going to answer any questions, but there are representatives of the Ohio Power Siting Board

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ALJ MCKENNEY: Thank you.

MS. FEASEL: The farm buildings are going to be real close to where this thing comes. And we wondered if there is any limit as far as the distance between where this fence is going to be and the building.

And another thing is that they -- are they actually going to use these alternate sites or not? You don't know?

ALJ MCKENNEY: Sorry, Ms. Feasel, I am not going to answer any questions this evening. If you would like there are representatives of the Power Siting Board and the company here.

MS. FEASEL: Another thing I wanted to know is when you put this line in is the tile going to be replaced, or what? Because we have got tile in that one field that they are going to put this line down to.

ALJ MCKENNEY: Okay. Is there anything else you would like to address for the record?

MR. FEASEL: No, that is -- realize you guys own the land there, but we are right --

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it's in our back yard, you understand. And we got, you know, looking at that every day. That is the whole thing. We got to -- kind of like to know what the plans are in mind a little more. The size of it too, yes. That was the other thing. We was kind of mislead on that.
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They said last May it would be 300 by 350. Now the book is saying like 415 by 400 or something. It got bigger in the process, you know. It seems like they are using up a lot of the square footage of that field. There isn't going to be much left the way it's looking. They are really trying to squeeze it all in, make it operational, I guess.

But, that is, you know, that is just what we are looking at. We are right on top of it. That is what it comes down to.

ALJ MCKENNEY: Okay. Does that conclude your statement for the record then?

MR. FEASEL: Yes. As far as I know that is the main thing.

ALJ MCKENNEY: Thank you for providing testimony.

MR. FEASEL: You are welcome.

ALJ MCKENNEY: Those are the only two names that I have signed up to testify this evening. Is there anyone else here that would like to give a statement for the record? Please.

called as a witness, being first duly sworn,
testified as follows:

ALJ MCKENNEY: I will ask you if you could, if you could state your name for the record and then when you are finished I will ask for your name and address, if that is all right.

MS. BERG: Dorothy Berg, and I live about a mile and a half from where this site is. My question is, to the AEP representative, has there been any type of environmental impact study done there?

ALJ MCKENNEY: Ms. Berg, the opportunity this evening is to give testimony, not specifically to ask questions of the company and the Power Siting Board on the record. There will he questions asked of them at the

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adjudicatory hearing, but this opportunity here this evening is to give statements on the project, thoughts on the project. Any questions can be addressed outside of the context of the formal testimony.

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MS. BERG: So, then I will amend my statement. Instead of asking the question, I will just declare that I am concerned about an environmental impact in the area.

ALJ MCKENNEY: Thank you. Is there anything else?

MS. BERG: No.
