Regarding your question about requests for rehearing from parties that failed to request intervention prior to the Board's initial decision: <u>Ohio Revised Code 4903.10</u>includes the provision that allows a party to file such an application for rehearing. However, they would have to show that their failure to enter an appearance before the order was for just cause *and* that their interests were not adequately considered in the initial proceedings.
