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MS. SEE: It's a little after 6:00, so let's get started. My name is Greta See. I am an Attorney Examiner with the Commission's legal department. Joining me this evening are Commissioner Trombold, and my colleague in the legal department, Sarah Parrot.

Scheduled for hearing at this time before the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio is Case No. 13-2385-EL-SSO, which is entitled In The Matter of the Application of Ohio Power Company for Authority to Establish Standard Service Offer Pursuant to Revised Code Section 4928.143 in the Form of an Electric Security Plan, and Case No. 13-2386-EL-AAM, captioned In the Matter of the Application of Ohio Power Company for Approval of Certain Accounting Authority.

As I noted before, joining us this evening is Commissioner Trombold. Commission Trombold.

COMMISSIONER TROMBOLD: Thank you. Good afternoon or good evening, everyone. Thanks for coming on this beautiful day. I just wanted to let you know that the commission is attending -- commissioners are attending the public hearings that are being held in

the AEP service territory in a listening capacity and we are very interested in the views of the public on this case, and I look forward to hearing testimony and hearing from you and your thoughts tonight. Thank you.

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MS. SEE: In addition, there are other personnel from the Commission representing the Department of Public Affairs and Service Monitoring and Enforcement Department. There are Tammy Mitchell that's at the back who greeted you when you came into the venue and also Sara Ziegler and Erin MacLellan that are also at the back of the room. They're here and available if you have questions on how the Commission will process this case or if you have a question for the Commission on other utility matters.

At this time, I'd like to take appearances of the parties, starting with the Company.

MR. NOURSE: Thank you, your Honor. My name is Steve Nourse. I'm here for the Ohio Power Company. I'm an attorney. Would you like me to introduce the other AEP folks that are here?

MS. SEE: Would you, please?

MR. NOURSE: I'll let them each stand up and introduce themselves.

MR. SPITZNOGLE: I'm Gary Spitznogle with AEP Ohio. I'm with Regulatory Compliance.

1 MS. SHUMATE: Renee' Shumate. I'm in 2 Community Affairs for Central Ohio. 3 MR. RENNIE: Jeff Rennie, AEP for Ohio Corporate Communications. 4 MS. WHITE: Fay White, AEP Ohio, Corporate 5 Communications. 6 7 MS. JOSEPH: Maxine Joseph, customer 8 service rep with AEP Ohio. 9 MS. SEE: There's also counsel here for a number of the interveners that are filed for 10 intervention in the case. For Ohio's Consumers' 11 12 Counsel? 13 MS. GRADY: Thank you, your Honor. On 14 behalf of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel representing the residential customers of AEP Ohio, I'm Maureen R. 15 16 Grady, with Consumers' Counsel, Mr. Bruce J. Weston. 17 MS. SEE: Is there counsel for any of the 18 other interveners at the hearing tonight? Let the record reflect there are no counsel for the other 19 2.0 parties present. 2.1 I note that there are approximately 30 22 interveners in the case representing, as Ms. Grady 23 indicated, residential customers, commercial customers, 2.4 industrial customers and other consumer advocate

organizations. Each of these parties represents the

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various constituents before the Commission.

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In this case, on December 20th, 2013, Ohio Power Company filed its application with the Commission to establish a standard of service offer in the form of an electric security plan, or what we refer to as an ESP, for the plan to be in effect from June, 2015 through May, 2018. There have been five local public hearings scheduled. This is the first. They will be held in Lima. There will be one in the afternoon here in Columbus. There is one scheduled to take place in Canton, Ohio, and one in Marietta, Ohio.

The purpose of this evening's hearing is to receive comments from the public regarding Ohio Power Company's application in this case. It's not a question and answer session. So if you have a question about the application, I would recommend that you approach some of the personnel from AEP that have indicated that they're here to assist you this evening.

Tonight's hearing is being transcribed by a court reporter. If you plan to testify, please speak clearly so that the court reporter can accurately reflect your comments on the record. Also, if you have a prepared written statement, it would be helpful if you provide that statement to the court reporter.

When you arrived, you were offered the opportunity to sign up to offer testimony. After I finish my introduction, I'll begin calling the witnesses that have signed up to offer testimony. I chuckle, because only one person has said that they want to offer testimony tonight.

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After I finish the introduction, I'll be calling the witness forward. I will ask each witness to come up to the table, face the court reporter.

Before you give your comments, I'll ask you to state and spell your name for the record. Before you present your testimony, I will ask you to take an oath or affirmation that what you're about to state is true. Your testimony will be considered part of the record, and it will be reviewed by the Commission before a final decision is made on the application.

Additionally, counsel for the intervening parties and I will be permitted to ask you questions about your statement.

Should you decide that you do not want to testify when I call your name, you can simply indicate that you pass.

Also, once you finish testifying, if you are just here to observe, you may leave at any time.

The Commission appreciates you taking time out of your

MR. SCHOTTENSTEIN: I just like working with the people. They've been very helpful and, you know, I'd like to see programs like this continue.

MR. SCHOTTENSTEIN: Thank you.

MS. SEE: Thank you very much. Is there anyone else present that wishes to offer testimony this evening? Okay. We will take a brief recess to see if anyone else appears that wishes to offer testimony tonight. We'll reconvene at 6:30.
