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PETITION: Opposing the DP&L Blue Route West Milton to Eldean Project

We, the homeowners of Greenlee Road and those homeowners along DP & L'S "blue route" proposal, are asking OPSB to consider our opposition and concerns in regards to the "West Milton to Eldean 138kV Transmission Line Project" and vote against the "blue route" proposal.

1. The "blue" proposed route along Greenlee road in Miami County Ohio will require 65-90 ft poles to be placed on a property the Ohio Department of Agriculture has designated a "Bicentennial Farm." It has been farmed for 8 generations of Iddings and for over 200 years. This farm is located west of Greenlee Rd. between Horseshoe Bend Rd. and Fenner Roads. It is the oldest farm in Miami County. This property is listed on the Department of Agriculture's website. The original Benjamin Iddings log home is listed on the National Historic Register. The original log home was moved onto the neighboring non-profit, the Brukner Nature Center so that visitors could enjoy the architecture and see the continuing legacy of the Iddings as they pass the 160 acre working farm to enter the Brukner. The placement of the DP&L high voltage transmission lines along this property compromises the integrity of this historically significant property and destroys the nature of that which the Department of Agriculture has actively recognized as integral to Ohio's farm history.
2. The proposed high voltage power transmission line will negatively impact the view shed of this entire area. Greenlee Road embodies the quintessential Ohioan landscape which many residents (who have built or renovated along Greenlee) purposefully have preserved by placing all power lines underground.
3. The Brukner Nature Center is a 165 acre preserve less than 1/2 mile from the proposed Greenlee route. This privately funded, non-profit was established to assure this area of Miami County remains a pristine natural biosphere with viable habitats for Ohio's native species and to provide environmental educational opportunities to the public. These transmission poles will be visible from the hiking trails throughout the Brukner and could alter migration patterns, compromise navigational ability of deer and deter wildlife from the area.
4. The Greenlee route has a grade differential variable with a water easement that will require consideration from Rt 55 to Horseshoe Bend. The proposed alternate route is completely level and has poles in place along the Forest Hill ROW entirely, though a power company competitor services the area which DP&L has marked for overland on the Forest Hill red route from Fenner Road north.
5. The proposed Greenlee route impacts 57 homes as compared to 31 homes on the alternate route. There are 126 individuals residing in homes on Greenlee. There are many more individuals affected by placement of the transmission lines and well over 1/3 as many private properties on the Greenlee route.
6. Long term exposure to (EMF) electro-magnetic fields produced by these lines of high voltage pose serious health risks. Studies indicate increased risks for cancer related to EMF from power lines particularly for children. Most recently, the National Institute of Environmental Health cited the *British Journal of Cancer* (2011 Jan 4 104:128)..."magnetic fields are possibly carcinogenic." *British Journal of Cancer* (2010) 103, 1128-1135) researcher found "an association between magnetic fields and childhood leukaemia." The WHO web page also cites the 2011 reference under EMF topics. Most recently, in January 2014, a UK study identified low birth weight associated with EMFs and sub optimal growth in utero with stronger effects for females infants especially. *Bioelectromagnetics* (2014 Jan

31 ePub (ahead of print). Among the residents of Greenlee, from RT 55 to Lodge Rd there are 19 elementary school children or younger who will be at a documented increased risk of cancer because of these high power transmission lines. Among the residents of Greenlee, there are 27 females of childbearing potential whose pregnancies would be affected adversely by the proximity of these transmission lines.

7. In 2013 the National Association of Realtors and Zillow both identified proximity of power lines as significantly reducing resale opportunities for homes in the vicinity of high power transmission lines. Furthermore property values are diminished 12-30%. Values of homes more recently constructed are exponentially affected reaching the 30% reduction level while older established homes in good areas average 21% reduction of value. On Greenlee, along the proposed power line route, 48% of the homes are recently built and will lose 1/3 of their property values while the other 52% will lose up to 21% in value. And 100% of the Greenlee homes will suffer greatly in regard to resale opportunities.
8. Family owned, multigenerational farms are found all along the Greenlee route and farmers do not want these transmission lines by their homes or in their fields. Most have their farm houses very close to the road in order to keep the farm land open. The iconic American family owned farm is a disappearing landmark across the United States and yet family farms remain on this route and are very integral part of Greenlee Road. All of the residents here believe these farms should be uncompromised.
