

The Utilities Group, Inc. has developed strategic business relationships with several Commission certified suppliers (Natural Gas and Electric) in providing or potentially providing service under the Ohio Choice programs



### Exhibit A-16 "Company History"

The Utilities Group, Inc was incorporated in the state of Ohio in October, 1999.

Since 2000, The Utilities Group, Inc. has been providing end-use customers with aggregation, brokering and consulting services in the field of energy consumption, conservation and procurement. The entity has provided end-use customers with the opportunity to make informed selections regarding electric and natural gas supply based on reliability of service, pricing and services offered.

From 2000 until 2007, under a Joint Venture Agreement with The Procter & Gamble Distributing Company, The Utilities Group, Inc. was charged with the duties of marketing and executing the P&G Supply Chain Energy Program. Under this program, small to medium size commercial and industrial entities in the Duke Ohio territory were aggregated for procurement of natural gas and electric and leveraged along with the P&G requirements.

In 2007, the Agreement between P&G and The Utilities Group, Inc. was terminated due to a lack of viable alternate electric supply and savings in the Duke Ohio service territory and an overwhelming volatility in the natural gas market. Since that time, The Utilities Group, Inc. has continued to serve and grow its customer base under its own subsequently issued PUCO certifications as an Aggregator/Broker of Electric and Natural Gas.

Over the years, The Utilities Group has solidified its client and supplier base and formed strategic relationships with third party vendors and subcontractors. Today the company's offerings include energy audit and procurement as well as consulting services covering the areas of energy efficiencies, demand-side projects, green initiatives and market and regulatory intelligence.



### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned, Michael Catanzaro, who is a citizen of the United States, desiring to form a corporation, for profit, under Sections 1701.01 et seq. of the Revised Code of Onio, hereby certifies that:

FIRST: The name of said corporation shall be THE UTILITIES GROUP, INC.

SECOND: The place in Ohio where its principal office is to be located in Hamilton County.

Ohio in the City of Cincinnati.

THIRD: The purposes for which it is formed:

To engage in any lawful act or activity for which corporations may be formed under Sections 1701.01 to 1701.98 inclusive, of the Ohio Revised Code.

In addition to the general powers conferred by the laws of the State of Ohio and the purposes herein set forth, but not in limitation or restriction thereof, it is expressly provided that this corporation shall also have the following powers to wit:

To purchase or otherwise acquire, lease, assign, convey, mortgage, picdge, or otherwise dispose of property, real or personal, tangible or intangible.
