Notice of Public Information Meeting for Proposed Major Utility Facility

AEP Ohio Schedules Open House to Outline Plans to Reinforce Transmission System in Ross County

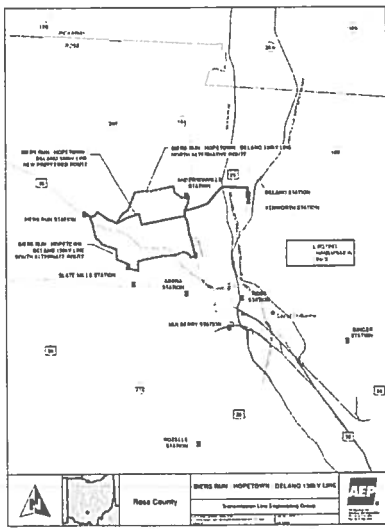
AEP Ohio, a unit of American Electric Power (AEP), and the AEP Ohio Transmission Company invite residents of Ross County including the residents of Union and Green townships to attend an informational open house regarding plans to construct a new high-voltage 138-kilovolt (KV) electric transmission line in Ross County.

The public open house to discuss the proposed Biers Run-Hopetown-Delano line will take place from 6 to 8 p.m., July 22, 2014, at Pioneer School of Developmental Disabilities, 11260 County Road 950, Chillicothe, Ohio, 45601.

After considering comments from the public and proactive meetings with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, AEP Ohio is supplementing its application to the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB) to propose a new transmission line route through the Pleasant Valley Wildlife Area.

The Biers Run-Hopetown-Delano Project is part of the overall Biers Run Project, which is a major transmission reinforcement effort to help AEP Ohio maintain transmission reliability in south central Ohio. Upgrades are needed in the Chillicothe and Circleville areas to address power plant retirements and issues identified by PJM Interconnection (PJM), an independent regional transmission planning organization.

The new Biers Run-Hopetown-Delano line will extend from the new Biers Run Substation to the existing Delano Substation, passing through Hopetown Substation, a proposed distribution substation that will replace the existing Camp Sherman Substation. The Biers Run-Hopetown-Delano line will be approximately



12 miles long depending on the route selected and will be located entirely in Ross County. The line primarily will run through Union Township with a short section in Green Township.

\$500,000 in property tax annually for the community.

The OPSB is responsible for reviewing information related to the project - including input from the public - and determining whether the proposed project should be approved. AEP Ohio is required to propose at least two routes - a preferred and alternate - to the siting board. The siting board will make the final decision regarding which route is selected. The accompanying map depicts the preferred and alternate routes the company submitted to the siting board. It should be noted that due to reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide.

AEP Ohio filed its application for the Biers Run-Hopetown-Delano transmission line with the OPSB in January 2014. If the application is approved, construction of the line could begin in the spring of 2015 and would be targeted for completion in the fall of 2016.
