# 'Fastest Nun in the West' on path for sainthood

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) — The Archdiocese of Santa Fe announced Wednesday it is exploring sainthood for an Italian-born nun who challenged Billy the Kid, calmed angry mobs and helped open New Mexico territory hospitals and schools.

Archbishop Michael Sheehan said he has received permission from the Vatican to open the "Sainthood Cause" for Sister Blandina Segale, an educator and social worker who worked in Ohio, Colorado and New Mexico. It's the first time in New Mexico's 400-year history with the Roman Catholic Church that a decree opening the cause of beatification and canonization has been declared, church officials said.

"There are other holy people who have worked here," said Allen Sanchez, president and CEO for CHI

Victoria Marie Forde of Sisters of Charity of Cincinnati

St. Joseph's Children hospital in Albuquerque, a facility Segale founded. "But this would be a saint (who) started institutions in New Mexico that are still in operation."

Segale, a nun with the Sisters of Charity of Cincinnati, came to Trinidad, Colorado, in 1877 to teach poor children and was later transferred to Santa Fe, where she co-founded public and Catholic schools. During her time in New Mexico, she worked with the poor, the sick and immigrants. She also advocated on behalf of Hispanics and Native Americans who were losing their land to swindlers.

Her encounters with Old West outlaws later became the stuff of legend and were the subject of an episode of the CBS series

"Death Valley Days." The episode, called "The Fastest Nun in the West," focused on her efforts to save a man from a lynch mob.

But her encounters with Billy the Kid remain among her most popular and well-known Western frontier adventures.

According to one story, she received a tip that The Kid was coming to her town to scalp the four doctors who had refused to treat his friend's gunshot wound. Segale nursed the friend to health, and when Billy came to Trinidad, Colorado, to thank her, she asked him to abandon his violent plan. He agreed.

Another story says The Kid and his gang attempted to rob a covered wagon traveling on the frontier. But when the famous outlaw looked inside, he saw Segale.

"He just tipped his hat," said Sheehan, the archbishop. "And left."

Many of the tales she wrote in letters to her sister later became the book, "At the End of the Santa Fe

Trail." "She was just amazing," said Victoria Marie Forde of the Sisters of Charity of Cincinnati. "It's tough to live up to her example."

Segale founded St. Joseph's hospital in Albuquerque before returning to Cincinnati in 1897 to start Santa Maria Institute, which served recent immigrants.

Her work resonates today, with poverty, immigration and child care still high-profile issues, Sanchez said.

Officials say it could take years — possibly a century — before Segale becomes a saint. The Vatican has to investigate her work and monitor for any related "miracles."

Those miracles could come in the form of healings, assistance to recent Central American immigrant children detained at the U.S. border or some other unexplained occurrences after devotees pray to her, Sanchez said.

"She's going to have to keep working," Sanchez said. "She's not done."

AEP Ohio Transmission Company (AEP Ohio Transco) proposes to upgrade an existing 69-kVolt (kV) transmission line in Jefferson and Harrison counties.

The purpose of the Miller Switch-East Amsterdam 138-kV Transmission Line Rebuild Project is to provide electric to Momentum, Access Midstream, and South Central Power. AEP Ohio will rebuild the new line using standard 138-kV monopole structures, but will operate at 69-kV. The Miller Switch-East Amsterdam transmission line will be approximately 10 miles long and rebuilt within existing right of way. The project will traverse Springfield Township in Jefferson County, and German and Groen townships in Harrison County. This project will be an approximate \$19 million investment by AEP Ohio Transco. Construction is scheduled to begin in October 2014.

The project is known as the Miller Switch-East Amsterdam 138-kV Transmission Line Rebuild Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.11-01, AEP Ohio Transco has filed a Letter of Notification with the Ohio Power Siting Board, under Case No. 14-0531-EL-BLN. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this project.

This project meets the requirements for a Letter of Notification because it is within the types of projects defined by item (1)(k) of Attachment A of the interim process defined in the OPSB's Sept. 4, 2012, Finding and Order in Docket 12-1981-GE-BPD. This states that a project qualifies for a Letter of Notification if the project is:

- (1) Relocating, extension or new construction of single or multiple circuit electric transmission lines;
- (2) Primarily needed to meet the requirements of a specific customer or customers.

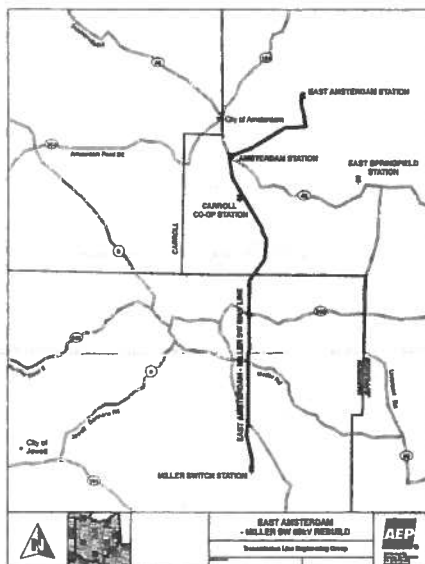

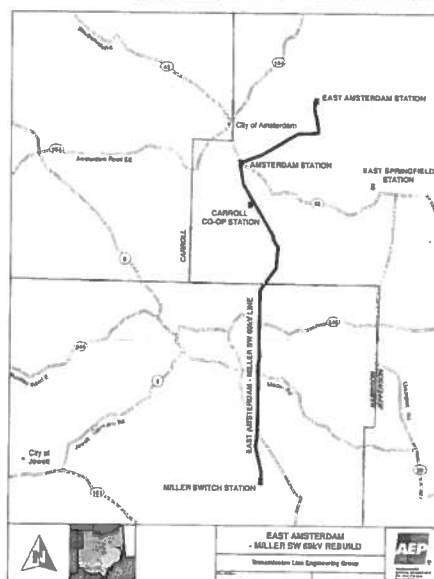

## CRITERIA USED TO REVIEW THE APPLICATION

The following eight criteria are set forth in Section 4906.10 (A) of the Revised Code and will be used, along with additional information, by the board in reviewing the application for a certificate to construct, operate and maintain the Miller Switch-East Amsterdam 138-kV transmission line:

- The basis of need for the facility;
- The nature of the probable environmental impact of the proposed facility;
- The facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology, the nature and economics of alternatives and other pertinent considerations;
- In the case of electric transmission lines, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving Ohio and interconnected systems, and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability;
- The facility will comply with chapters 3704, 3734 and 8111 of the Revised Code and all rules and standards adopted under sections 1501.33, 1501.34 and 4561.32 of the Revised Code. In determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and standards adopted under Section 4561.34 of the Revised Code, the board shall consult with the office of aviation of the division of multi-modal planning and programs of the Department of Transportation under Section 4361.341 of the Revised Code;
- The facility will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity;
- The facility's impact on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929 of the Revised Code that is located within the site of the proposed major utility facility; and
- The facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the board considering available technology and the nature and economics of various alternatives.

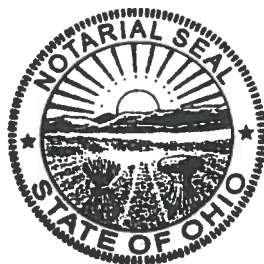
