With this disruption of the farm proposed by DP&L the paycheck would be decreased by $\frac{1}{3}$. I'm sure you would not like or could afford a $\frac{1}{3}$ reduction of your yearly income. With that note this project would be effecting 4 families: Ronald Rason, Karen Torxley, and the farming team of Ken Angle and his son and partner Lee Angle. Also this reduction of income would not

tilable field. Now again this farm will
be distraided. Valuable farm land just taken
away for other pleasure. At least the
reconstruction of the road was for safety of
lives because of an installation of a traffic light.

This invasion of private property and
income has no value to us. This farm
and many neighbors are serviced by Pioneer
Rural Electric Company. Pioneer Rural is
a Co Operative Company. Key word "Co Operative".
Pioneer co operates with their customers
and others. They really listen to concerns
and work to preserve farm land & family
values.

Entering private property without permission
is trespassing. This invasion will not be
taken lightly. The logistics of the Pole

placement is next to impossible. The field is the only field on the farm which is not broken up by an easement, lane or building. With the placement of your poles in this field would mean the Angles that farm the whole farm would not be able to navigate their equipment around the poles or spray their crops because of the wires.

In conclusion the co owners of this farm are extremely dissatisfied with the project and will do anything in their power to stop the inconsiderate invasion of their (my) property. It would be in your best interest to reevaluate your idea and find another route. Perhaps along a road that already has obstructions and better access for repairs if needed. But not through our property and Annual Income. Again this is not a year or two but a lifetime
