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## **ENTRY**

## The Commission finds:

- (1) On July 1, 2014, Jennifer Hines (Complainant) filed a complaint against The Dayton Power and Light Company (DPL), alleging that her May 2014 bill was too high. Complainant explained that she after she contacted DPL about the matter, DPL checked the meter on May 13, 2014, and found nothing wrong. Complainant added that she had expected her bill to be somewhat higher because of harsh winter weather in early 2014, but asserted that the meter should have been tested further.
- (2) DPL filed its answer on July 16, 2014. DPL denied Complainant's allegations and stated that it has complied with all relevant statutes, regulations, and tariffs.
- (3) On July 25, 2014, the attorney examiner issued an Entry scheduling an August 12, 2014, settlement conference. The parties met on the scheduled date and continue discussions afterwards.
- (4) Complainant filed a motion to dismiss the complaint with prejudice on September 10, 2014. Complainant explained that the parties have reached an agreement that has resolved all issues in the complaint.
- (5) The Commission finds that Complainant's request to dismiss the matter, with prejudice, is reasonable and should be granted.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the motion to dismiss the complaint, with prejudice, is granted. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
