Thank you for contacting the Ohio Power Siting Board regarding the Greenwich Windpark. Your correspondence will be docketed in the public comments for case number 13-0990-EL-BGN

On September 23, 2014, Omega Crop Company filed an application for rehearing in this case. On October 22, 2014, the Board's administrative law judge issued an entry granting Omega Crop Company's application for rehearing for the limited purpose of affording the Board additional time to consider the issues raised in the application.

It is important to note that the Board does not plan to hold an additional public hearing in this case. Following a complete review of the issues raised by Omega, the Board will issue a final Entry on Rehearing at a yet to be scheduled Board meeting in Columbus.
