



Please hold Duke accountable. Stop this now, and don't make the little guy (me) pay for big businesses dirty deal.

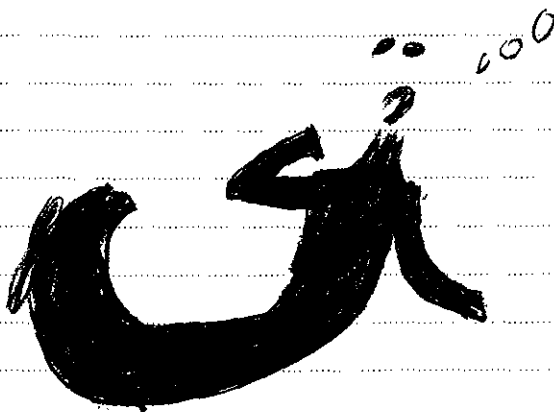

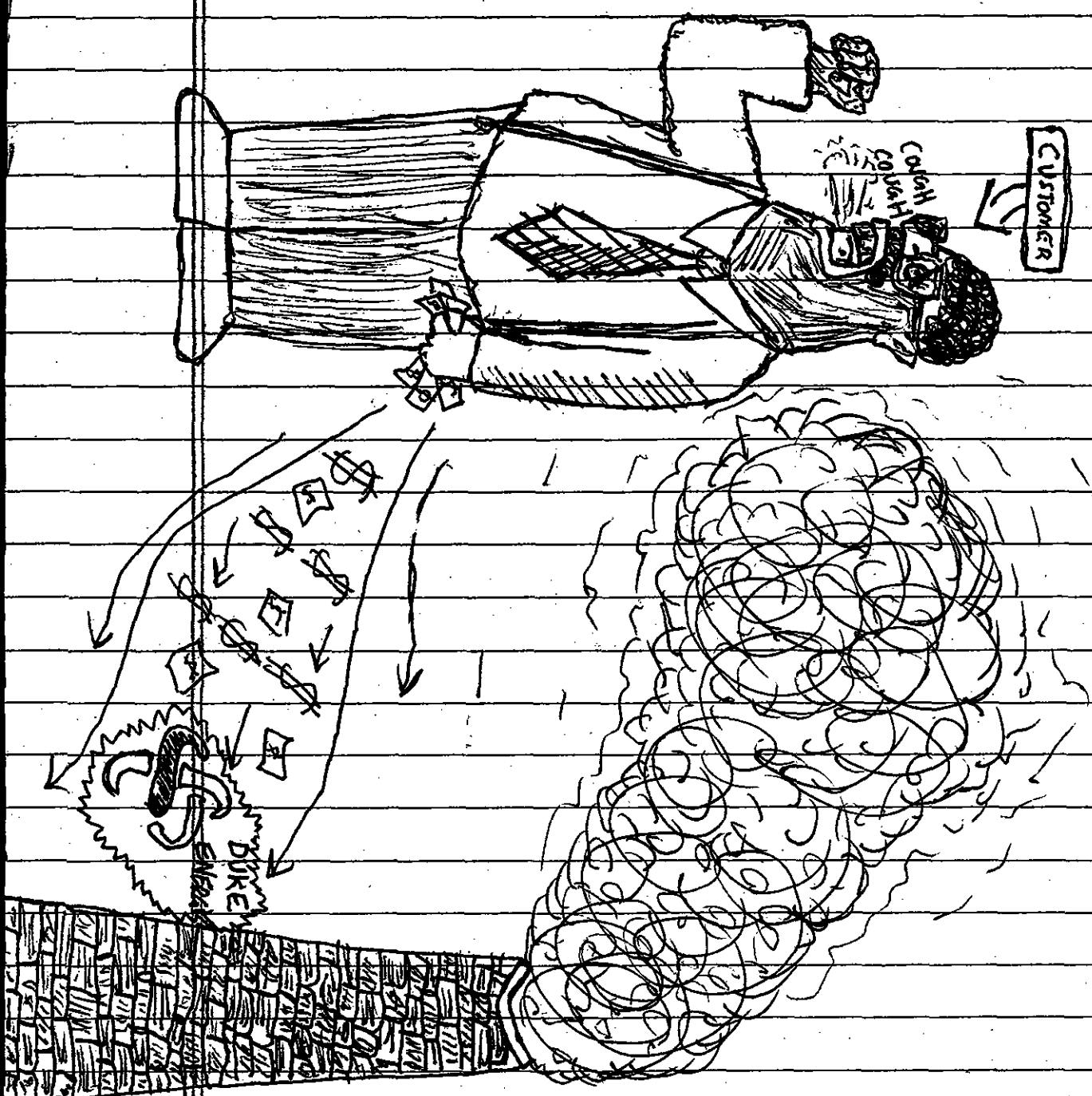
I ask that financial support not be authorized for outdated coal plants in Ohio.


