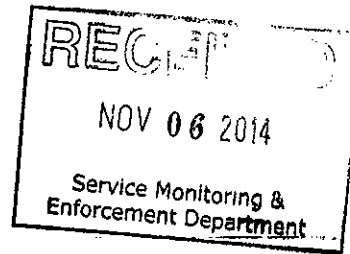

We need to encourage energy providers to utilize clean energy alternatives. Our money could be better spent on clean energy alternative, rather than nursing along old, outdated equipment.

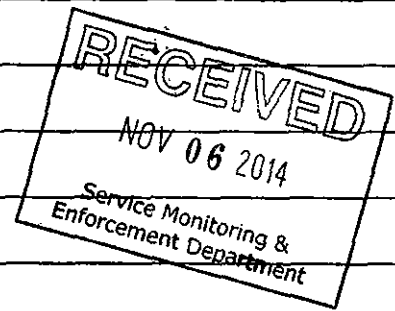

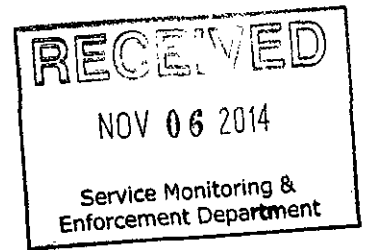

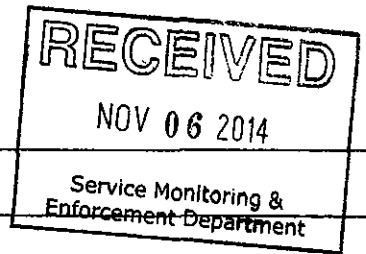
