4	ALJ AGRANOFF: The Ohio Power	
5	Siting Board has assigned for public hearing at	
6	this time and place Case No. 13-430-EL-BTX which	
7	is captioned In the Matter of the Application of	
8	AEP Ohio Transmission Company for a Certificate	
9	of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need	
10	to Construct the 138 kV Biers Run-Circleville	
11	Transmission Line Project.	
12	My name is Jay Agranoff, and I am	
13	the Administrative Law Judge assigned by the	
14	Ohio Power Siting Board to preside over this	
15	local hearing.	
16	As I mentioned previously, also with	
17	me today are Mr. Matt Butler and Mr. John Pauley	
18	from the Ohio Power Siting Board staff. Three	
19	of us are available if you have any questions	
20	concerning the application or any other utility	
21	matter. Please feel free to approach us at the	
22	completion of this evening's hearing.	
23	At this time I am going to take	
24	formal appearances on behalf of the parties in	
25	this particular case. On behalf of the	

1 Applicant. 2 Thank you, your Honor. MR. NOURSE: 3 I am Steve Nourse and I represent AEP Transmission Company. My business address is 1 4 5 Riverside Plaza, Columbus, Ohio 43215. Thank 6 you. 7 ALJ AGRANOFF: Are there any other 8 parties that are present this evening that would 9 like to make an appearance on the record? 10 There being none, the subject of 11 this evening's public hearing and the one to be 12 held tomorrow night in Circleville, is 13 the application filed on June 2nd, 2014 as 14 amended on October 13th, 2014 to construction a 15 138 kilovolt transmission line between the 16 existing Circleville substation in Pickaway 17 County and Biers Run substation that is 18 currently under construction in Ross County. 19 I would note that adjudicatory 20 hearing in this proceeding is scheduled for 21 currently 10:00 A.M. on November 14th, 2014 at 22 the offices of the Ohio Power Siting Board in 23 Columbus. However, there is a pending motion 24 that has currently been filed by AEP requesting 25 that that particular adjudicatory hearing be

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rescheduled for a week later, and that is 1 2 currently awaiting a ruling from the Ohio Power 3 Siting Board. 4 I would point out that thiis 5 evening's hearing is not to address 6 the application that was filed in case 13-429-EL-BTX which concerns the request to 7 8 construct a 138 kilovolt transmission line from 9 the Biers Run substation to the existing 10 Hopetown-Delano substation. 11 That particular case is scheduled 12 for public hearing on December 16th, at 6:00 13 P.M. here in Chillicothe. 14 In this case the Applicant submits 15 that the purpose of the proposed project is to 16 improve and maintain the quality of electric 17 service and reliability to the south central 18 Ohio area. This area includes but is not 19 limited to the communities of southern Columbus, 20 Chillicothe, Circleville, Highland, Greenfield, 21 Waverly and others. 22 The Applicant notes that the 23 Circleville-Chillicothe load area is currently 24 served primarily by three 138 kilovolt lines 25 originating from the Columbus, Waverly and

1 Athens areas.

2	The Applicant states that the loss
3	of any two of these lines can result in a system
4	criteria violation in the area. According to
5	the application the project is located in a
6	rural setting consisting primarily of
7	agricultural parcels and open land with
8	scattered residential areas, wood lot and
9	minimal commercial, industrial and recreational
10	land uses.
11	175 residences have been identified
12	as being within a 1,000 feet of the preferred
13	route, and 270 residences has been identified as
14	being within a 1,000 feet of the alternate
15	route.
16	The Applicant plans to start
17	construction during the first quarter of 2015
18	with the estimated service date of approximately
19	the first quarter of 2017.
20	As I mentioned previously, the
21	purpose of this meeting is to hear specific
22	comments from the public regarding the
23	application in this case. It is not intended to
24	be a question and answer session, but instead it
25	is your opportunity to let the Ohio Power Siting

Board know as to what you think about 1 2 the proposal set forth in the application. 3 I would also note that the Board's staff filed its report of investigation on 4 5 October 21st, 2014. This is simply a recommendation of the Board's staff and does not 6 necessarily reflect what the Board's final 7 8 determination will be. 9 The Board appreciates your 10 participation in tonight's hearing and we want 11 everyone who is interested to have the 12 opportunity to testify. 13 As I mentioned previously, I have a 14 list of individuals that have expressed an 15 interest in testifying. When I call your name 16 please come forward. And as I mentioned 17 previously, I will swear you in, and then you 18 will have the opportunity to provide your 19 testimony. 20 Please be as specific as you can 21 when providing your responses, and to make sure 22 that you provide all of your responses in a 23 verbal form and not simply, as I mentioned 24 before, a non-verbal nodding of the head or 25 shaking of your head.

1	If there are no other questions then	
2	at this point we will begin and I will call my	
3	first witness.	
4	Mr. Kevin Chester. Please come	
5	forward.	
6	(WITNESS SWORN)	
7		
8	KEVIN CHESTER	
9	called as a witness, being first duly sworn,	
10	testified as follows:	
11	MR. CHESTER: We own a parcel of	
12	land across the mid point that is in the part	
13	of the preferred route that AEP is planning with	
14	this. And we have already been impacted by the	
15	transmission maintenance that is already there.	
16	It's to be a parallel line.	
17	From my understanding that parallels	
18	the existing line as a 150 foot right-of-way	
19	within that. From the little bit of contact	
20	that I have had with AEP or there	
21	representatives they are asking for another 100	
22	feet outside of this land, this existing	
23	easement, which would make it a 250 wide swath.	
24	And according to your estimates here for 3.8	
25	miles across that parallel.	

That is an awful large burden to put 1 2 on property owners to ask them to have 50 feet 3 shy of the length of a football field across their property. 4 5 The impact as far as that goes on 6 banks and embankments and trees and stuff being 7 cut they say is minimal. I disagree with that. 8 The parcel that we own has lost ground over a 9 50-year period to now, you know, the banks 10 eroded away to trees and stuff like that, trees 11 have been cut outside of the right-of-way width. 12 Things, large trees have fell outside which has 13 caused the problems into that creek bank. 14 It's just a large impact and it's a 15 lot to ask of a property owner to take that 16 width across along with the one that is already 17 there. 18 ALJ AGRANOFF: If I can ask a 19 follow-up question. 20 MR. CHESTER. Sure. 21 ALJ AGRANOFF: What is your feelings 22 or preference with respect to the alternative 23 route that is being proposed? 24 MR. CHESTER: I feel for anyone that 25 has to have a route come across the impact that

1	is there. I understand the affected, you know,	
2	if doesn't go through the path for the preferred	
3	route, I just to ask someone to give up that	
4	width of right-of-way across their property,	
5	that is a large impact, and it doesn't take a	
6	very long stretch to add up to several acres	
7	that basically you have lost control over.	
8	ALJ AGRANOFF: So would it be your	
9	preference that the alternative route be	
10	selected over the preferred route?	
11	MR. CHESTER: Of course, it would	
12	be.	
13	ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. Ms.

18	called as a witness, being first duly sworn,	
19	testified as follows:	
20	ALJ AGRANOFF: Please state your	
21	full name and address.	
22	MS. BOWDLE: Amanda Bowdle, 11049	
23	Egypt Pike. My husband and I own land on	
24	Westfall Road that would be impacted. It runs	
25	across the front. We bought the land intending

1	to build a home. So with this impact it would	
2	impact any entry we have onto our property, and	
3	it could cause major impact as far as building a	
4	house and we would not be able to build there.	
5	Also impact or livelihood because we	
6	farm that land across the road, and we also have	
7	several properties down where the preferred	
8	route is. So I do have major concerns.	
9	Also we do not have AEP power as our	
10	power provider. We are actually on South	
11	Central. So that is another concern if they	
12	piggyback or South Central wishes to do	
13	anything.	
14	ALJ AGRANOFF: Would your preference	
15	be that the alternative route be selected?	
16	MS. BOWDLE: Of course.	
17	ALJ AGRANOFF: Mr. Nourse, do you	
18	have any questions of this witness or the prior	
19	witness? I forgot to offer you	
20	MR. NOURSE: No. Thank you.	
21	ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. Mr. Rich	
22	Simpson.

25	RICHARD SIMPSON	

called as a witness, being first duly sworn, 1 2 testified as follows: 3 ALJ AGRANOFF: Please state your full name and address, please. 4 5 MR. SIMPSON: Richard Simpson, 675 6 Albright Mill Road, Chillicothe. 7 I too have a parcel of land where 8 the existing 345 line crosses and the new 138 9 preferred route is going through, parallel it. 10 I would prefer the alternative 11 route, naturally. However, I ask that the --12 instead of 100 feet being cleared on the 13 preferred route that right-of-way be overlapped 14 with the existing 150 foot right-of-way to cause less impact on my property. 15 16 I live on a parcel of land with 17 mature Sugar Maple, large trees. And our home 18 is relatively close to the line. 19 A 100 foot clearing is going to 20 substantially impact negatively on my property 21 values, and the visual impact is going to be 22 great from my property along with my neighbors' 23 properties. 24 So, I request that should 25 the preferred route be chosen that consideration

2	called as a witness, being first duly sworn,	
3	testified as follows:	
4	ALJ AGRANOFF: Please state your	
5	full name and address.	
6	MS. BRADBURY: Barbara Lapp	
7	Bradbury. My home address is 2722 Thompson Hill	
8	Road, Otaway, Ohio.	
9	I am now the owner of my mother's	
10	farm which is on Albright Mill Road along with	
11	my sisters. The farm is up for sale this coming	
12	Saturday.	
13	We understand that the alternate	
14	route of the line will go through the boundary	
15	of my mother's land. My mother spoke with AEP	
16	reps a couple times this year. I attended a	
17	recent meeting with mom here.	
18	She didn't want to see a line go	
19	through her land. Her view is unparallel	
20	probably in Ross County. And she wanted AEP	
21	reps before they made a decision to come down	
22	the driveway and see it themselves. So I state	
23	that for her since she can't say it.	
24	It is unparallel. It's a view, I	
25	understand that. But the farm has been in the

1	family for a hundred years. It's the Lapp farm,
2	it's an agricultural farm and we hope it stays
3	that way, although it is for sale.
4	It's possible I would be an owner
5	depending how Saturday goes. That is not the
6	preference, but it's possible.
7	So, our preference is that the route
8	remain the alternate route, not the preferred
9	route, because the preferred route does not
10	cross my mother's boundary. However, we were
11	going to be affected possibly by the Hopetown
12	route, but that is not under discussion today.
13	That is all.
14	ALJ AGRANOFF: If I understood
15	correctly, I thought you said that the alternate
16	route was the one that was going to actually
17	cross onto the property.
18	MS. BRADBURY: Yes, it's in the view
19	of the unparalleled view, yes. The alternate
20	route is. We prefer it remain the alternate
21	route and not the preferred route.
22	ALJ AGRANOFF: So, if one of the two
23	routes were selected by the Ohio Power Siting
24	Board you would prefer that the preferred route
25	be selected?

17 1 MS. BRADBURY: We would prefer that 2 the preferred route remain the preferred route. 3 ALJ AGRANOFF: Okay. Thank you. Mr. Nourse. 4 5 MR. NOURSE: Nothing. Thank you. 6 ALJ AGRANOFF: Mr. Matthew Kunsman. 7 (WITNESS SWORN) 8 9 MATTHEW KUNSMAN 10 called as a witness, being first duly sworn, testified as follows: 11 12 ALJ AGRANOFF: Please proceed. 13 MR. KUNSMAN: My name is Matthew 14 Kunsman, I am an attorney in Newark, Ohio. I am 15 here tonight because the property owners 16 couldn't be here. 17 They are Mark and Jennifer Dunn. My 18 address is 33 West Main Street, Newark, Ohio. 19 I am part of the firm MorrowGordonByrd. 20 Mark and Jennifer reside at 3375 21 Willow Road in Eleva, Wisconsin. 22 The property they own, which is 23 the affected property, are tax parcel No. 24 37091217002 through 37091273009. I understand because I am here on 25

behalf of the Dunns and I am not here in person 1 2 that the Board may have to adjust the weight of 3 my testimony. 4 But the Dunns and I have reviewed 5 the application provided by AEP and they are in 6 the process of a contract, real estate contract 7 for these parcels I mentioned. 8 They have been in negotiation with 9 that contract since April of 2014. They are set to close at the end of this month with an 10 11 individual with the sole purpose of building a 12 house on that property. 13 We examined the proposals and maps 14 provided by AEP as part of this application, and 15 concerned that the alternate route will travel 16 directly through the parcels owned by Mark and 17 Jennifer Dunn. As a result the alternate route 18 will have a significant impact on the current 19 contract for sale of this property, including 20 likely rescission of the contract or 21 cancellation of that contract. 22 Based on this my clients wish to express their support and preference for the 23 24 preferred route as indicated on the maps 25 included as part of AEP's filing. Thank you.

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19 1 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. Mr. 2 Nourse. 3 MR. NOURSE: No questions. ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you, sir. 4 5 Matthew Noble. 6 (WITNESS SWORN) 7 8 MATTHEW NOBLE 9 called as a witness, being first duly sworn, 10 testified as follows: 11 ALJ AGRANOFF: Please state your 12 full name and address. 13 MR. NOBLE: My is name Matthew 14 Noble. My address is 17933 Westfall Road. I am 15 one of the 11 residents that live within 100 16 feet of the preferred route. 17 And my concerns are the impacts of 18 honestly the line crossing right in front of my 19 property, that the property values in that area, 20 what the impacts of those will be. 21 I prefer the preferred route due to 22 those -- I just bought this property there, so, 23 you know, it would be a big impact on what I do 24 there, or what I may do with it later on. 25 ALJ AGRANOFF: Your preference would

be the alternative route? 1 MR. NOBLE: Correct. The 2 3 alternative route, yes, sir. ALJ AGRANOFF: Mr. Nourse. 4 5 MR. NOURSE: No. Thank you. 6 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you, sir. Mr. 7 Michael Hubay. 8 (WITNESS SWORN) 9 10 MICHAEL HUBAY called as a witness, being first duly sworn, 11 12 testified as follows: 13 ALJ AGRANOFF: Please state your 14 full name and address. 15 MR. HUBAY: I am Michael Hubay, 623 16 Albright Mill Road. 17 I would just like to state that the 18 preferred right-of-way will come about, well, 19 touch my deck I think in the back of my house. 20 Pretty close. And I just would like to see the 21 alternate route used. But there is a lot of people that is 22 23 I think the opposite. That is all I have got to 24 say. 25 ALJ AGRANOFF: Mr. Nourse.

1	MR. NOURSE: No, thank you.	
2	ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you, sir. Mr.	
3	Rick I believe Hartt. Please come forward if	
4	you would like to testify.	
5	(WITNESS SWORN)

7	RICK HARTT	
8	called as a witness, being first duly sworn,	
9	testified as follows:	
10	ALJ AGRANOFF: Please state your	
11	full name and address for the record.	
12	MR. HARTT: My name is Rick Hartt. I	
13	live at 915 Betts Lane, Chillicothe, Ohio. And	
14	I am really affected by the alternate route. My	
15	brother and I and my family, my wife and my	
16	sister-in-law, we own several acres through the	
17	alternate route and it will split our farm in	
18	half.	
19	We also raise cattle on this	
20	property, and we heard stories, and I think	
21	there is a record, that there has been some	
22	studies even done that transmission lines does	
23	affect the production of beef cattle, milk cows	
24	and such. Okay. That is one of my concerns on	
25	the alternate route.	

1	My other concern is that I was at a
2	meeting here when they first proposed this
3	route. I asked the people two things.
4	Have they done an archaeological
5	survey on this area on the alternate route.
6	Because we actually have properties registered
7	with the National Archaeological Society of the
8	United States. There is mounds, Indian mounds
9	on our property.
10	And they wouldn't give me an answer
11	how far they would put the line close to these
12	mounds which is registered. Okay.
13	Second thing was I am also on the
14	Zoning Appeal Board of the Ross County Airport.
15	They did not know that there was zoning law that
16	related to the Ross County Airport.
17	There is a buffer area of three mile
18	that has something to do with height
19	restrictions. I asked the question, nobody knew
20	the answer. They said they didn't know anything
21	about it, and they never got back with me.
22	So, at this point two things on
23	concerns of the alternate route. So, you know,
24	that is my concerns.
25	I didn't get some answers and I

     personally, I don't like either route because

     even the preferred route affects some of our

     property in the family on a small way. But, the
     alternate route will split our farm in half.

     Cormany. I live at 3464 Biers Run Road,

     Chillicothe, Ohio.

                  And I am for the preferred route.
22
      I am not for either route, but preferred route
23
     runs, according to AEP maps, and my analysis,
     which I do for a living, runs 77 percent of the
24
25
     run along existing right-of-ways, which the
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alternate route only runs 26 percent through 1 2 existing right-of-ways. 3 That is the main reason why I prefer the preferred route. I know the impact on 4 5 people along that route will be felt, but it's 6 not putting development where there is no development. The alternate route runs through 7 8 rural farm ground, wood lots, forest, crosses 9 creeks. 10 There is no road that goes along it. 11 It's just open space. If AEP or the Ohio Power 12 Siting Board selects the preferred route at 13 least it's putting it along an existing roadway 14 along an area that has customers to serve. 15 It's been mentioned before, someone 16 in the audience, they don't get their power from 17 AEP, they get it from South Central. AEP 18 provides the power for South Central. 19 I wouldn't even call this a 20 necessary evil. It's my understanding that 21 electric usage has been stagnant in this area 22 for decades. I am not sure why AEP is pursuing 23 this as aggressively as they are. 24 Again, my preference is for the 25 preferred route simply because it runs along an

1	transmission line to Chillicothe. And the
2	alternate route to Circleville would run
3	parallel to our boundary line. It crosses what
4	some people would consider open land, but as
5	Barb mentioned it's beautiful virgin, unspoiled
6	by any other power lines.
7	And we would really hate to see the
8	area scared by a power line which could be
9	routed in a direction that parallels the
10	existing power lines, would impact everyone I
11	understand.
12	But, the power line is already
13	there. They can use that route or near it for
14	77 percent of the route. It would not in our
15	opinion impact, as great an impact, as an
16	entirely new route for the transmission line.
17	The idea of the need for this I too
18	question. It's like the second backup to the
19	backup to the power lines they already have.
20	And yet and we do not use AEP power, we are on
21	South Central line, yet they are going to be
22	putting power lines in to take the power
23	elsewhere.
24	It doesn't all these impacts that we are
25	suffering does not benefit us.

1	So, aside from the questionable	
2	motives of this whole project, we object to the	
3	alternate route because it transgresses a	
4	beautiful virgin territory, comes very close to	
5	our property, and does not take advantage of the	
6	existing right-of-ways and roadways that could	
7	be used in the project.	
8	ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. Mr.	
9	Nourse.	
10	MR. NOURSE: No, thank you.	
11	ALJ AGRANOFF: I appreciate it, sir.	
12	That's all the individuals on my list that	
13	indicated a desire to testify. I know there was	
14	at least one gentleman, I believe, that had not	
15	put his name on the list that said they would	
16	like to testify now. Is there anybody else who

1	MR. ARLEDGE: My name is Gary	
2	Arledge. I live at 3967 Pennyroyal Road,	
3	Chillicothe, Ohio.	
4	I have two farms over on Pennyroyal.	
5	There is about 2000 foot of right-of-way going	
6	through the corner of one and the majority of	
7	the other one.	
8	It's on ground, I spent 13 years,	
9	two to three months a year clearing, and that is	
10	where they want to put it right through my	
11	farmland. Didn't make any effort to follow any	
12	boundaries, any fence line or wood lines. Going	
13	to put it right through where I have cleared the	
14	ground. That would adversely affect farming	
15	from now on.	
16	And I am very much opposed to the	
17	alternative route. The alternative route is the	
18	one that would impact me. The other one is not	
19	close to me.	
20	ALJ AGRANOFF: So your preference	
21	would be the preferred route.	
22	MR. ARLEDGE: I don't have a	
23	preference on that. I just have one that	
24	don't if I had to say a preference, yes, it	
25	would be the preferred route.

SIMMONS: My name is Arlene 16 Simmons. My address is 3099 State Route 207, 17 Chillicothe. 18 I live on the alternate route. And 19 I am hoping they pick the preferred route. The 20 way the wire runs it would come up across my 21 back yard. Not talking far away, I am talking 22 right smack in my back yard. 23 I have concerns with cancer, 24 technology interference. It sounds like they 25 are going to have to do a clear cut right behind

30 our house, and my understanding 100 foot clear 1 2 cut if it goes through this route. There is a hill there. I don't know 3 how it could possibly be mowed, so I assume it 4 5 would be sprayed. So, all that would run down. 6 We have a pond right there right close to the house. It's an acre. I am 7 8 concerned for fish kills. The effect on just all the wildlife that would come to use this 9 10 pond. We also have a registered Indian 11 12 mound. Property value decrease. I just think 13 it's ugly, you know. So my preference is the 14 preferred route. 15 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. Mr. 16 Nourse. 17 MR. NOURSE: No, thank you. 18 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. Sir. 19 (WITNESS SWORN) 20 21 JOHN BOWDLE 22 called as a witness, being first duly sworn, 23 testified as follows: 24 ALJ AGRANOFF: Please state your 25 full name and address.

BOWDLE: Map page 1 on 13-04. 13 Ackley Road is listed here by the preferred 14 route for the power line. It has an incorrect 15 name. 16 ALU AGRANOFF: So the record is 17 clear, you are looking at the Staff Report that 18 was filed in this particular proceeding on 19 October 21st, 2014? 20 MR. BOWDLE: Yes. That's correct. 21 ALJ AGRANOFF: And you are looking 22 at the first map identified on page 1? 23 MR. BOWDLE: Yes. 24 ALJ AGRANOFF: Thank you. 25 MR. BOWDLE: Okay.
