To the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio:


Air pollution affects all of us. So do energy costs.

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Members of PUCO:

FirstEnergy and Duke have submitted plans to PUCO to benefit from financial bailouts at some of their most outdated and expensive coal plants. Their goal is to force consumers to continue to purchase power from these old, expensive, and highly polluting plants for another 15 years. Firstly, these plants need to be shut down and replaced by "greener" energy solutions, not in 15 years, but in 5 years or less. We need to force energy suppliers to participate in the reduction of CO2, that has been scientifically proven to be the culprit in the worldwide climate change, a climate change that is causing expansive droughts, colder, longer winters, melting of the ice caps, all of which results habitat destruction for some of the world's most treasured animals, including the polar bear.






