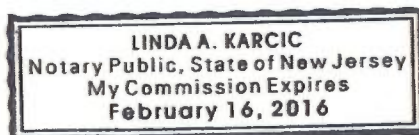

The applicant is a wholly-owned subsidiary of IDT Energy, Inc. which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Genie Retail Energy, Inc. which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Genie Energy International Corporation which is owned almost entirely by Genie Energy Ltd., a publicly traded company.

Affiliates that supply retail or wholesale electricity or natural gas to customers in North America:

IDT Energy, Inc., - immediate parent of applicant - is a retail supplier of electricity and/or natural gas to customers in NY, NJ, PA, MD, DC and IL.

Evergreen Gas & Electric, LLC - affiliate of applicant - is licensed as a retail electricity and natural gas supplier in NY but is not currently active.

Diversegy, LLC – affiliate of applicant – broker of electricity and natural gas to commercial customers in numerous jurisdictions throughout the US. Licensed as an Aggregator/Broker of both electricity and natural gas in Ohio under license numbers 12-605E(2) and 12-279G(2).

EPIQ Energy, LLC – affiliate of applicant - broker of electricity and natural gas to residential and small commercial customers in numerous jurisdictions throughout the US. Licensed as an Aggregator/Broker of both electricity and natural gas in Ohio under license numbers 13-713E(1) and 13-315G(1).

Exhibit A-14 "Company History"

Provide a concise description of the applicant's company history and principal business interests.

The applicant was formed in the State of New York on March 4, 2010, under the name New Energy Services, LLC. The New York Public Service Commission ("NYPSC") deemed it eligible to serve as a natural gas supplier (ESCO) on April 2, 2010. Sometime thereafter it began serving natural gas customers in the ConEdison and Keyspan territories in New York City. On July 26, 2011, the NYPSC deemed the Company eligible to serve as an electricity supplier.

On April 26, 2011, the applicant received its natural gas supplier license from the NJ Board of Public Utilities ("NJBPU"). It began serving natural gas customers in the PSE&G territory of New Jersey sometime thereafter.

The founders of the applicant then decided that they did not wish to pursue growth and they allowed the customers to migrate back to the utilities and/or other suppliers.

On August 7, 2012, all of the membership interests in the applicant were purchased by IDT Energy, Inc. ("IDTE"), a Delaware corporation headquartered in Newark, New Jersey.

In March of 2013, IDTE changed the name of the applicant to Residents Energy, LLC, and its headquarters address to Newark, New Jersey. On March 21, 2013, The New York Public Service Commission issued a new Eligibility Letter acknowledging the applicant's name change.

On April 23, 2014, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities issued Electric Power Supplier and Gas Supplier Licenses to the applicant as Residents Energy, LLC.

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission granted the applicant a license to serve as a Natural Gas Supplier on November 13, 2014 and a license to serve as an Electric Generation Supplier on December 18, 2014.

After completion of the application process and the appropriate EDI testing, the applicant began serving electric and natural gas customers in the majority of the New York utility territories during the 4th Quarter of 2014.

At this juncture, the applicant is in the process of getting set up to do business with numerous utility companies in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.



The applicant's parent company, IDT Energy, Inc. ("IDTE"), has been an active retail energy supplier since 2004, and currently serves more than 350,000 electric and natural gas meters in five states and in the District of Columbia. The applicant has only recently re-entered the New York utility markets, after a two-year hiatus, under the new ownership of IDTE, and with the new name, Residents Energy, LLC. As a wholly-owned subsidiary of IDTE, the applicant will leverage the considerable experience of IDTE's executive leadership team, and its dedicated back-office operations staff, as it develops its brand.

The plan is for the applicant to market its products to Ohio customers through a variety of channels including direct mail, internet advertising, and the use of both in-house and outside telemarketing and door-to-door marketing teams. Outside marketing vendors will be cautiously selected after a substantial vetting process. The individual sales agents hired by the vendors for door-to-door marketing will be subjected to criminal background checks. All sales agents will be required to be properly trained before they will be permitted to participate in any marketing campaigns on behalf of the applicant. Lists for telemarketing campaigns will be appropriately scrubbed against the "do-not-call" registry. Marketing activities of all outside vendors will be heavily monitored by an in-house Quality Assurance team and an inspector in the field. Misrepresentations or deceptive communications of the applicant's products and offers, or any similar violations of the Commission's rules, will not be tolerated.

The enrollment of Ohio customers will be done in accordance with the rules set forth in 4901:1-21-06. Door-to-door sales will be validated by third-party verifications made after the sales agent leaves the premises of the customer. Hard copies of the terms and conditions will be provided to the customer at the time of sale, or electronic copies when permitted. Telephonic enrollments will also be validated by third-party verifications and the written terms and conditions will be sent to the customer thereafter. The applicant's website will be set-up to accept internet enrollments as well.

With respect to customer billing, the applicant does not intend to bill its customers directly. Rather, customers will be billed by their local utility companies, pursuant to Commission-approved tariffs, for both the utility's delivery charges and the applicant's supply charges. EDI communications between the applicant and the utilities will be handled by an outside, experienced EDI provider.

With respect to customer inquiries and complaints, the applicant will initially leverage the existing knowledgeable in-house Customer Service team of IDTE, based in IDTE's satellite

facility in Jamestown, New York. There are currently more than forty representatives on staff and they take calls from 7:30 am to 7:30 pm seven days per week. There are representatives on staff who are fluent in Spanish. Additional staff will be added as needed to accommodate growth. Every effort will be made to resolve all customer complaints in the most expeditious and amicable manner.

IDTE has been an active participant in the retail energy marketplace for more than a decade. All of the complaints related to marketing contacts initiated by IDTE's independent, third-party sales agents.

IDTE fully cooperated with I&E throughout the course of the investigation and the parties negotiated the terms of a settlement agreement.
