#### MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

This proceeding concerns the annual review and audit of the costs of the Ohio Power Company's (AEP-Ohio) Distribution Investment Rider (Rider DIR) for 2014. The Commission established Rider DIR as part of its modification and approval of AEP-Ohio's application for a second electric security plan. Through a request for proposal, the Commission selected Baker Tilly to perform the audit and investigation of Rider DIR. On August 6, 2015, Baker Tilly issued a final report detailing the results of its audit and investigation. That same day, the Staff also issued its own analysis of Rider DIR, which was limited to Rider DIR's performance as measured by capital expenditures and reliability impact. As explained below, OMAEG has a real and substantial interest in the results of the review and audit of Rider DIR's costs for 2014.

Ohio Adm. Code 4901-1-11 permits intervention by a party who has a real and substantial interest in the proceeding and who is so situated that the disposition of the proceeding may impair or impede its ability to protect that interest and whose interest is not adequately represented by an existing party. Likewise, R.C. 4903.221 authorizes intervention where a party:

may be adversely affected by the proceeding; will contribute to a full development and equitable resolution of factual issues; and will not unduly prolong or delay the proceedings.

OMAEG is a non-profit entity that strives to improve business conditions in Ohio and drive down the cost of doing business for Ohio manufacturers. OMAEG members and their representatives work directly with elected officials, regulatory agencies, the judiciary, and the media to provide education and information to energy consumers, regulatory boards and suppliers of energy; advance energy policies to promote an adequate, reliable, and efficient supply of energy at reasonable prices; and advocate in critical cases before the Commission. OMAEG members purchase electric power services from AEP-Ohio, pay for Rider DIR, and will be affected by the Commission's determination in this proceeding. OMAEG has been an active participant in AEP-Ohio's electric security plan proceedings where Rider DIR has been established. OMAEG has also participated in other cases involving AEP-Ohio's rider filings. 6

OMAEG has a direct, real, and substantial interest in the issues raised in this proceeding and is so situated that the disposition of the proceeding may, as a practical matter, impair or impede its ability to protect that interest. OMAEG is regularly and actively involved in Commission proceedings and, as in previous proceedings, OMAEG's unique knowledge and perspective will contribute to the full development and equitable resolution of the factual issues

in this proceeding. OMAEG's interest will not be adequately represented by other parties to the proceeding and its timely intervention will not unduly delay or prolong the proceeding.

Because OMAEG satisfies the criteria set forth in R.C. 4903.221 and Ohio Adm. Code 4901-1-11, it is authorized to intervene with the full powers and rights granted by the Commission to intervening parties. OMAEG respectfully requests that the Commission grant this motion for leave to intervene and that OMAEG be made a full party of record.
