Dear Sirs And Madame:

I am writing to you today regarding case numbers 14-1297-ES-SSO and 14-1693-ES-SSO pending before the Public Utilities Commission Of Ohio to grant rate increases to electric companies who continue to use coal-fired plants to generate energy. My family and I care deeply about the state of our sources of fresh water including Lake Erie and streams and are concerned about any toxic pollution generated. As commissioners, I call upon you to call for a rejection of the following items before the commission:

1) Granting of rate increases to utilities that do not agree in writing to change their methods of energy creation from dirty coal burning plants to other sources that are more sustainable, profitable and capable of employing more Ohioans. Such sources do exist now. Only political will is lacking to implement this needed change.

2) An indefinite freeze on clean energy standards as they now stand. The freeze amounts to telling an overweight person that they may continue to eat poorly and maintain an unhealthy lifestyle. Such individuals die or suffer preventable health problems through inaction.

3) Giving a subsidy or bailout to old utilities who insist on using old, antiquated technology. The Ohio Constitution now prohibits granting a monopoly to any party where they and only they gain a financial interest in a project. By not pursuing renewable energy sources, you are in direct contravention of this new amendment by granting an uncontested license to operate in only the interest of shareholders and not Ohioans as a whole.

By reducing dependence on coal and other fossil fuels, we can find other fuel sources that can give ultimate energy independence from nations that do not always share our national goals. Such approaches help sustain Lake Erie and the Ohio River for future generations to use and enjoy to the fullest. In addition, the pursuit of such ideas will burnish Ohio as a home to innovations which we have had in the past. China and India, our newest rivals for power and influence, look to us for cues as to which strategy works best. Personal health and economic health are not mutually exclusive. With proper planning, both goals can be achieved simultaneously to the benefit of all you serve.
