Dear Governor Kasich:

I wholeheartedly support OhioCitizen.org in the push to clean up Ohio's air and water.

As you probably know, Northeast Ohio has one of the highest rates of breast cancer in the state; Ohio is one of several states to suffer most from this disease. (I was the campaign manager for two years for Mercy Hospital's "Pink Campaign" to raise awareness of breast cancer in Northeast Ohio.)

Oberlin is one of those "secret" communities where cancer rates are hidden from the public (as are poverty rates). My mother died of lung cancer in 2002, even though she didn't smoke. She practiced yoga, she walked two miles a day – she took care of her health. Her death was devastating to us, her family. In speaking with her hospice nurse, I learned that there were several blocks in Oberlin that had higher cancer rates than others: one, in particular, had a 90% cancer rate. Ninety percent of the residents in one particular block died from cancer.


In the 1960s in Oberlin, there was one block where three children with Down Syndrome were born: West College Street. That is highly unusual.

In Wellington, Ohio, there is/was an abnormally high incident of people diagnosed with multiple sclerosis.

I learned that not only people die from cancer in Northeast Ohio, but pets do, too. Both my dogs died from cancer when they were only 10 years old. (I lived in New York City for 25 years, where dogs and cats seem to die more "natural" deaths.)

This is the aftermath of industry and its unregulated policies of chemical dumping in the earth, the water and air. Over generations of families, there is a devastating effect that those policies have on families and their pets. All of this must be exposed and dealt with. If you don't, we, the public, will.
