The following information is in accordance with the procedures set forth in Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Chapter 4906-6 Accelerated Certificate Application Requirements of the Rules and Regulation of the Ohio Power Siting Board ("OPSB" or "Board").

4906-6-05 APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

4906-6-05(B)(1): Name and Reference Number

The applicant is the Dominion East Ohio ("DEO"). The name of the pipeline replacement project is Line 1745 Piggability Project (2016). The Line 1745, 7,300 feet natural gas pipeline that runs between DEO Franklin Station and valve #4853, consists of 8-inch and 12-inch pipeline. The Line 1745 Piggability Project (2016) proposes to replace 1,700 feet of 8-inch diameter natural gas pipeline with 12-inch diameter natural gas pipeline between valve #4853 and valve #6653; install a pig launcher/receiver for pigging operations; and replace some existing fittings (i.e., valves, tees and elbows).

The 1,700 feet of natural gas pipeline proposed to be replaced and the receiver to be installed are located within Stark County, Ohio. The fittings to be replaced and the launcher to be installed are located within Summit County, Ohio. The DEO Reference/Project Number is 400090072 with MWO #63250266.

4906-6-05(B)(1): Brief Description of Project

The Line 1745 Piggability Project (2016) proposes to replace 1,700 feet of 8-inch diameter storage pipeline with a new 12-inch diameter natural gas pipeline between valve #4853 and valve #6653 within existing DEO right-of-way ("ROW"). The new pipeline will have a maximum allowable operating pressure ("MAOP") of 1,565 pounds per square inch gage ("psig"). Line 1745 runs north to south direction and will be laid in the same place as the existing pipe to be removed.

The Line 1745 Piggability Project also proposes to install a launcher at DEO's Franklin Station and a receiver at 10399 Persimmon Street, Lawrence Township so that the pipeline can be assessed internally.

Additionally, some of the existing 12-inch fittings (valves, tees and elbows) which are not suitable for pigging, will also be replaced with fittings suitable for pigging.

The proposed pipeline is located within the City of New Franklin in Summit County, Ohio and Lawrence Township, in Stark County, Ohio as described above. Existing public roadways, private roadways, and DEO ROW will provide the required equipment access. A Google Earth (aerial map) project map which shows streets, a station and existing pipelines is included as Attachment A.

4906-6-05 (B)(1): Why the Project Meets the Requirements for a Construction Notice

This project qualifies as a Construction Notice because it fits the criteria of OAC Rule 4906-1-01, Appendix B (1)(a) which provides for the replacement of an existing pipeline segment if it is not greater than one (1) mile in length. In this instance, the replacement project is less than one mile in length and entirely within DEO's existing ROW.

4906-6-05(B)(2): Statement of Need for the Proposed Facility

Once a launcher and a receiver are installed, 1,700 feet of the existing 8-inch natural gas pipeline will be replaced with a 12-inch steel pipeline. The existing fittings are not suitable for pigging and will be replaced with proper fittings suitable for pigging Line 1745 between Franklin Station and valve #4853. When completed, all of the approximately 7,300 feet will be piggable to internally assess the natural gas pipeline.

4906-6-05(B)(3): Location of the Project

Attachment A contains a map that illustrates the location of the proposed project in relation to the existing line and substations. The replacement pipeline will be located entirely within DEO's service area. A pipeline easement will be amended to include the receiver location at 10399 Persimmon Street at the south end of the project in Stark County. DEO is currently working with a property owner to acquire additional easement at that location. DEO owns and operates the existing line that will be replaced and will continue to own and operate the replacement pipeline. The new pipeline will be placed in the same place as the existing pipeline, which will be removed.

4906-6-05(B)(4): Alternatives Considered

As mentioned earlier, in order to achieve piggability for approximately 7,300 feet to internally assess the natural gas pipeline, there are no practical alternatives available. DEO considered two alternatives which would involve construction of another 1,700 feet segment of pipeline on new ROWs. The ROWs would have to be near the existing one in order for the segment to connect with the pipeline that serves the Franklin Station where a launcher will be installed. These alternatives would involve not only surveying two other swaths of land on multiple landowner properties but also mean new construction either the back of the property owners where the existing pipeline is sited or on the front of their properties. In either case, but especially if the alternative were in the front of the properties, the construction would be an extreme inconvenience to the property owners. In particular, if the alternative route were in the front of the properties, driveways would be disturbed as well as the lawn and possibly trees. Engineers would have to expend much more time and work and incur more expense in identifying phone lines, electric lines,

water and sewer lines, as well as natural gas laterals and service lines in order to plan a pipeline in such a way as to assure that none of these conditions would be an impediment to either alternative route. From an ecological viewpoint, either of these alternatives would cause severe ecological consequences as well as cause socio-economic disturbance to the property owners. Either of these alternatives would also be significantly more expensive and would add considerable delay to the project. The construction would be far more intrusive and would take longer than the planned project.

In short, the only other somewhat possible alternatives would involve the complete replacement of the line resulting in the existing line being removed and a new line being constructed in another location. Moreover, the removal of the existing pipeline would be a separate construction project that would be of great disturbance to the landowners. Thus the other options would impact more land, take a longer period of time, disrupt more homeowners, and cost nearly double the replacement project expense.

4906-6-05(B)(5): Description of Public Information Program

A copy of the model notification letters included as Attachment B-1 were sent to property owners and tenants listed on Attachment C informing them of the nature of the project, the proposed timeframe of the project construction, and restoration activities.

Another set of letters will be sent prior to construction relating to construction activities being conducted and restoration of disturbed areas in the vicinity of the property owners or tenants are included as Attachment B-2.

4906-6-05(B)(6): Anticipated construction schedule, in-service date

The design of the proposed project began in April 2015 and is projected to end in January 2016. Tree clearing and grubbing for the project is planned to commence in

March 2016, with construction of the project has been tentatively scheduled to start in July 2016.

The new pipeline is expected to be in service by September 6, 2016. Schematic Construction Plans are included as Attachment D.

4906-6-05(B)(7): Project Area Map and Directions

A Google Earth map that shows an aerial view and is at least of a 1:24000 scale that depicts roads, streets, highways, and the station and launcher site is attached as Attachment A.

4906-6-05(B)(8): **Property Owner List**

As previously mentioned, replacement of the existing pipeline will occur within the existing 60-foot wide DEO ROW and existing station property. The property owners for both permanent and temporary existing ROWs as well as the one property owner where there is an amended easement pending are listed on Attachment C. As is customary with DEO's projects, after the contractor is selected, the contractor selects areas for laydown and arranges for the temporary easements directly. DEO will require the contractor to make those arrangements as soon as DEO selects the contractor and will provide the Staff with the selected laydown site information. DEO requests that the submission of the laydown information be made a condition set forth in the Staff Report. With the exception of tree cutting, construction of the project will not begin until the Staff has approved the laydown area(s). DEO expects that the contractor will select two (2) 100 foot by 200 foot temporary laydown areas for pipeline and equipment storage.

4906-6-05(B)(9)(a): Operating Characteristics, Required Structures, and Right-of-Way and/or Land Requirements

During the winter season Line 1745 provides the main connection between storage wells in DEO's Group 7 and Franklin Station. Franklin Station provides the measurement and regulation of gas into either TPL #8 or Line 3399. This line may operate at a pressure from 350 psig to 1500 psig. During the summer season Line 1745 is the main line used to convey injected gas from Chippewa Station to wells in DEO's Group 7. During this time the storage line may operate from 700 psig to 1500 psig.

The 12-inch nominal diameter pipe will be coated with fusion bond epoxy. Its steel pipe wall thickness will be 0.500 and the grade will be X52. The MAOP will be 1,565 psig. The proposed pipeline segment is located entirely within the 49 existing DEO easements. Approximately twenty (20) fittings (elbows, tees, valves) will also be replaced as part of this project.

4906-6-05(B)(9)(b): Electric and Magnetic Fields

This project involves the construction of a natural gas pipeline; therefore, this section is not applicable.

4906-6-05(B)(9)(c): Estimated Capital Costs

The estimate for the replacement by the 12-inch storage-gas line, the launcher, the receiver and fittings is approximately \$1,000,000.

4906-6-05(B)(10)(a): Land Use

The 1,700 feet of natural gas pipeline proposed to be replaced, and the receiver to be installed, are located within Stark County, Ohio. The launcher to be installed and fittings to be replaced are located within Summit County, Ohio. Land use associated with the project area consists of moderately populated residential area of approximately 45

parcels, of which 2.48 acres will be impacted by the project, and undeveloped and developed agricultural field. The agricultural land impacted will be about 0.57 acres. The forested area is located mainly along the perimeter of the ROW will not be affected. Clearing of some trees in residential areas will be required in order to construct the project.

The affected areas of the project—the pipeline, receiver station and launcher at the Franklin Station include the City of New Franklin, Summit County, Ohio, and Lawrence Township in Stark County, Ohio.

4906-6-05(B)(10)(b): Agricultural Land

As mentioned previously, land use associated with the project area consists of moderately populated, undeveloped residential, open field, and wooded property. A small portion at the southern end of the project area, where the receiver will be installed, is located on property that is actively farmed. The Stark County Recorder's Office was contacted via telephone on February 1, 2016 and indicated that the property is listed as agricultural and under the Current Agricultural Use Value ("CAUV") program, but did not list the property as falling under an Agricultural District as defined in R.C. 929.01. Stark County Soil and Water District was also contacted on February 1, 2016 via telephone and did not have records of the property being located within an Agricultural District.

4906-6-05(B)(10)(c): Archeological and Cultural Resources

In January 2016, DEO's consultant, EnviroScience, Inc., performed an Ohio Preservation Office Desktop Review of cultural resources for the study corridor (refer to Attachment E). The study corridor was 8,868 feet along the existing Line 1745 and 60 feet wide, approximately 30 feet to either side of the centerline. Their desktop review included a search for records of Determinations of Eligibility, Ohio Archaeological Inventory

("OAI") Properties, National Register listed Properties, Ohio Historic Inventory ("OHI") Properties, National Register Listed Districts, and Phase 1, 2, or 3 survey Areas within the study corridor and surrounding areas.

According to the records search, no Determinations of Eligibility, National Register Listed Properties, Ohio Archaeological Inventory Properties, OHI Properties, National Register Listed Districts, or Phase 1, 2, or 3 Survey Areas were identified within the study corridor. However, three (3) Phase 1 Survey Areas (Phase I Archaeological Survey of the Proposed 36.6 Acre Spring Valley No. 13 & Valley Allotment Project in Lawrence Township, Stark County and Franklin Township, Summit County, Ohio, Addendum Letter Report for the Phase I Cultural Resources Survey for the East Ohio Gas Company Franklin 20-Inch Storage Pipeline Project in Chippewa Township, Wayne County and Clinton Village, and Green and Franklin Townships, Summit County, Ohio, and Phase I Cultural Resources Survey for the Franklin 20-Inch Storage Pipeline Project in Chippewa Township, Wayne County and Clinton Village, and Green and Franklin Townships, Summit County, Ohio) and one (1) Ohio Archaeological Inventory site (SU0471) were identified in the area surrounding the study corridor.

Impacts for all of the project activities will be temporary and all work will be performed in previously disturbed ROW. In addition, no cultural resources were located within the project area or within the Area of Potential Effects (APE). It is the opinion of EnviroScience, Inc. that this particular project will not likely have an adverse effect on prehistoric or historic cultural resources per 36 CFR 800.5(b) (page 2 of 6 in Attachment E).

¹OHPO does not require coordination as this project does not have any federal ties. However, a Desktop OHPO Literature Review has been conducted to ensure no know listed properties will be impacted and is included as Attachment E.

4906-6-05(B)(10)(e): Federal and State Designated Species

In July 2015, DEO's consultant, EnviroScience, Inc., reviewed the study corridor for suitable habitat for federally listed species known to be located within Summit and Stark Counties, Ohio. The study corridor was 8,868 feet along the existing Line 1745 and 60 feet wide, approximately 30 feet to either side of the centerline. According to

²The Ohio EPA does not require a Notice of Intent ("NOI") for the NPDES General Construction Stormwater Permit as the activities associated with transmission and storage pipelines are covered by the Oil and Gas exemption.

³Since the activities are exempt from the NOI and are covered under the Oil and Gas Operation, Stark SWCD and Summit County SWCD do not require a SWPPP review. However, a SWPPP (although not required) has been prepared (Attachment F) and will be implemented during construction.

EnviroScience, Inc., four (4) federally listed species have ranges which include Summit and Stark Counties, including the federally endangered Indiana bat (*Myotis sodalis*), the federally threatened northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), the federally threatened northern monkshood (*Aconitum noveborancense*), and the federal species of concern bald eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*).

According to EnviroScience, Inc., ten (10) potential roost trees ("PRTs") for the Indiana bat and the northern long eared bat were identified within the study corridor. Due to the size of some of these trees and the amount of solar exposure to some of them, six (6) of the ten (10) may be considered potential maternity habitat by the USFWS.

According to EnviroScience, Inc., no suitable habitat for the northern monkshood was observed within the study corridor.

According to EnviroScience, Inc., no bald eagle habitat was observed during their field review of the study corridor. Additionally, Franklin Township in Summit County and Lawrence Township in Stark County have no known occurrences of bald eagle nesting sites.

On December 9, 2015, DEO submitted a letter to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services ("USFWS") requesting a finding from them regarding any adverse effect to any federally listed, threatened, or endangered species in the project area. This letter detailed the federally listed species that are on record within Summit and Stark Counties including the habitat information provided above.

The USFWS responded in an e-mail dated December 30, 2015 and stated that the proposed project is in the vicinity of confirmed records of Indiana bats. Since the Indiana bat presence has been confirmed, the presence of northern long-eared bats is assumed.

USFWS recommended that if there are no caves or abandoned mines in the vicinity and trees must be removed, clearing of any trees over three (3) inches in diameter needs to occur between October 1 and March 31. The USFWS also indicated that due to the project type, size, and location, adverse impacts to any other federally endangered, threatened, proposed, or candidate species are not anticipated. A copy of this submittal letter and response is included in Attachment G.

On December 10, 2015, DEO submitted a letter to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources ("ODNR") requesting a finding from them regarding any adverse effect to any state listed species and natural areas that a geological and/or ecological significance to them. A response form the ODNR was received on January 12, 2016. The ODNR indicated two (2) records within one (1) mile of the study corridor, including the state threatened spotted turtle (*Clemmys guttata*) and the Cooper Estate (managed by The Wilderness Center. The ODNR also indicated that, "We are unaware of any unique ecological sites, geologic features, animal assemblages, scenic rivers, state wildlife areas, nature preserves, state or national parks, state or national forests, or national wildlife refuges within the project area." The ODNR addressed eight (8) state and federally listed threatened and endangered species in their response. They recommended that clearing of potential habitat trees for the Indiana bat be cleared only between October 1 and March 31. The other seven (7) species were determined not likely to be impacted by project activities. The copy of this submittal letter and response is included in Attachment H.

4906-6-05(B)(10)(f): Areas of Ecological Concern

In October 2015, DEO's consultant EnviroScience, Inc. performed a delineation of wetlands and other waters for this project and is included in Attachment I. The study

corridor was 8,868 feet along the existing Line 1745 and 60 feet wide, approximately 30 feet to either side of the centerline. According to their assessment, three (3) wetlands, one (1) intermittent stream, and one (1) perennial stream were noted to exist within the study corridor. All three (3) wetlands eventually connect off-site. All of these water resources referenced to exist above are under the jurisdiction of the Ohio EPA and/or the Huntington District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. No wetlands or streams will be impacted for the proposed project activities.

As indicated by the ODNR, no unique ecological sites, geologic features, animal assemblages, scenic rivers, state wildlife areas, nature preserves, state or national parks, state or national forests, or national wildlife refuges are located within the study corridor. However, the portion study corridor between Fairpark Avenue NW and Nimisila Creek is located within Summit County MetroPark property. All onsite streams and wetlands are contained within the limits of the Summit County MetroPark property. The Summit County MetroParks indicated the presence of several rare plants and a known population of the state threatened spotted turtle within this wetland system. Therefore, all onsite wetlands fall within the range for Category 3 wetlands. According to EnviroScience, Inc., Category 3 wetlands are the highest quality, generally characterized by a high level of biological diversity and topographical variation, threatened or endangered species, large numbers of native species, or a high level of functional importance to its surroundings. No wetlands, including those within the MetroParks, will be impacted by this project. Temporary impacts within uplands on Summit County MetroPark property was discussed on January 6, 2016, and was approved by Summit MetroPark officials during the onsite meeting.

4906-6-05(B)(10)(g): Any Known Unusual Conditions Resulting in Significant Environmental, Social, Health, or Safety Impacts

This project does not involve any known unusual conditions resulting in significant environmental, social, health or safety impacts.

DEO is the owner of an easement/permit on or near your property pursuant to and within which it operates and maintains a natural gas pipeline.

Please be assured that during this project, all of DEO's Standard Safety and Operating Procedures and all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and ordinances will be fully adhered to.

Right-of-Way Project Timeline

Our survey work has been completed. DEO must clear the portion of its easement along its pipeline. This right-of-way, granted by the recorded easement or permit, provides the area necessary for the large equipment and materials used in the laying, maintaining and operating of the pipeline. DEO anticipates the right-of-way site preparation, i.e. tree, brush and stump removal, to occur in March, 2016. DEO personnel or its contractor has begun preliminary work on this project. Access to DEO's pipeline may be required for the following reasons:

- (2) DEO will be responsible for keeping a log book which registers every complaint that is received. The log book will contain all pertinent information about the person making the complaint, the issues surrounding the complaint and the date that the complaint was received. The log book will also contain the resolution that DEO suggests, the date the complaining party either agreed to the proposed resolution and the date when the proposed resolution was implemented or the date the complaining party declined the resolution.
- (3) After the complaint is registered, residents who register a complaint with DEO will receive a response summarizing the complaint, the requested relief and, if appropriate, a request to provide additional information. When the complaint is received, DEO will initiate reasonable action to resolve the legitimate interference that is a direct result of the construction or replacement of the pipeline segment.
- (4) If DEO finds that the reasonable action it has taken to ameliorate the disturbance but the mitigation action does not satisfy the complaining member of the public, DEO will provide a summary of the complaint and proposed resolution to the complaining member of the public, with a copy to the Ohio Power Siting Board Staff, so that the member of the public may bring the complaint to the Ohio Power Siting Board.

In January 2016, EnviroScience, Inc. completed a desktop review of cultural resources for the Line 1745 Piggability project. The project plans are to ensure 8,868 feet of Line 1745, between Franklin Station and Valve 4853 on Glencoe Street, is suitable to internally assess the existing natural gas line for abnormalities and internal corrosion. For this purpose, fifteen (15) existing fittings (elbows, tees and valves) will be replaced. Each dig location will require a ten (10) foot by ten (10) foot work area. In addition 1,650 feet of existing eight (8)-inch diameter pipeline between Glencoe Street NW and Fairpark Avenue NW will be replaced with twelve (12)-inch diameter pipeline and a pig launcher/receiver will be installed. Construction will be limited to the existing 60 foot wide (30 feet on either side of the pipeline) utility right-of-way (ROW). The project area is located in the City of New Franklin, Summit County and Lawrence Township, Stark County, Ohio.

In order to determine if historical properties exist within the proposed project area, a search of the Ohio Historic Preservation Office (OHPO) data was completed. The area searched included the project area and a surrounding area. The desktop review included a search for records of Determinations of Eligibility, National Register Listed Properties, Ohio Archaeological Inventory Properties, Ohio Historic Inventory Properties, National Register Listed Districts, and Phase 1, 2, or 3 Survey Areas. The following is a discussion of the results of the desktop search. Please refer to the maps in Attachment A for more details regarding this search.

No Determinations of Eligibility, National Register Listed Properties, Ohio Archaeological Inventory Properties, Ohio Historic Inventory Properties, National Register Listed Districts, or Phase 1, 2, or 3 Survey Areas were identified within the project area. However, three (3) Phase 1 Survey Areas (*Phase I Archaeological Survey of the Proposed 36.6 Acre Spring Valley No. 13 & Valley Allotment Project in Lawrence Township, Stark County and Franklin Township, Summit County, Ohio, Addendum Letter Report for the Phase I Cultural Resources*

Survey for the East Ohio Gas Company Franklin 20-Inch Storage Pipeline Project in Chippewa Township, Wayne County and Clinton Village, and Green and Franklin Townships, Summit County, Ohio, and Phase I Cultural Resources Survey for the Franklin 20-Inch Storage Pipeline Project in Chippewa Township, Wayne County and Clinton Village, and Green and Franklin Townships, Summit County, Ohio) and one (1) Ohio Archaeological Inventory site (SU0471) were identified in the area surrounding the project area.

Impacts for all of the project activities will be temporary and all work will be performed in previously disturbed ROW. In addition, no cultural resources were located within the project area or within the Area of Potential Effects (APE). 


Figure 1. OHPO Map – Line 1745 Piggability
