I am writing to ask that the PUCO deny the First Energy Request for a rate hike. My husband and I are retired. In spite of having had a geothermal furnace installed, good home insulation, keeping the thermostat at 69 degrees, and all other measures to save energy; including use of back up heat in the winter from a gas fireplace, our electric bill this month is \$325.84. This is lower than the past two winters. We have had bills in the \$400.00 monthly range, some approaching \$500.00/month during the past two very cold winters. A real challenge to pay on a fixed income. (No, we do not qualify for any of the heating assistance programs.)
