Please consider the effect this has on us and the carbon footprint we are leaving for the next generation and us as well. You are polluting your own air by not standing up to support clean energy practices.

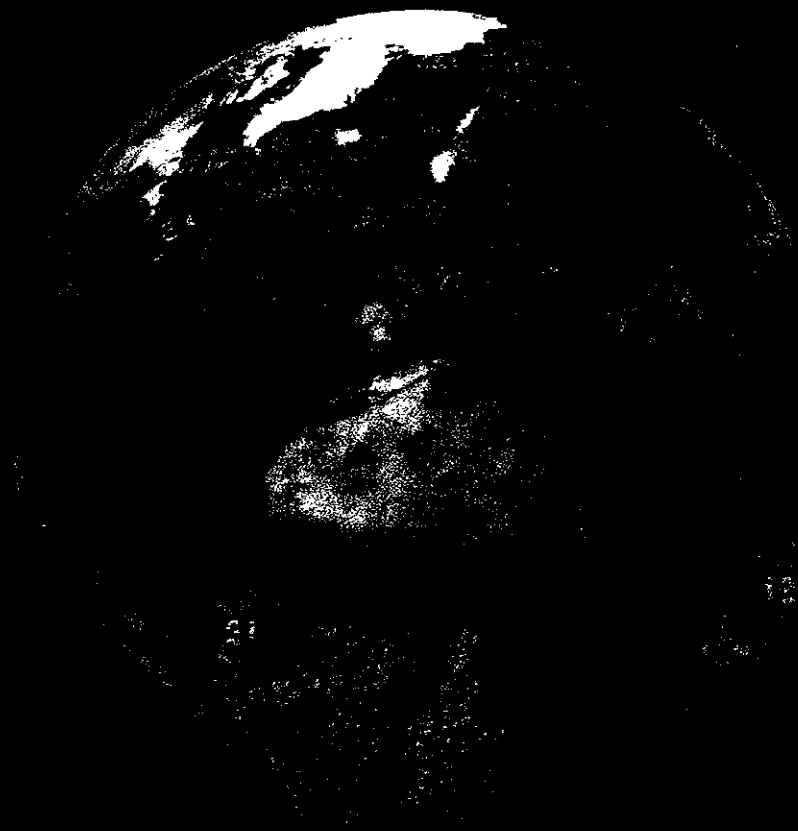

I am writing to express my opposition to policies that limit the advancement of clear air and energy standards. Specifically in regards to the freeze of Ohio's clean energy standards and several waivers for older power plants before the Ohio public utilities commission (14-1297-EL-SS0 and 14-1693-EL-SS0). Oil and gas prices are currently lower, creating greater short-term opportunity costs to investment in safe, efficient, and clean energy infrastructure. Despite this, it should continue to be a priority to invest in this important resource. Both in order to contain future costs and susceptibility to price volatility, but more importantly, to maintain the clean air and healthy environment that ensure public health and well being. There are many unallocated costs that are not within the current energy pricing structure. For instance, there is a growing literature on the association between premature birth and maternal exposure to particulate air pollution, such as that created by coal power plants. These findings have been repeatedly demonstrated, and are clearly laid out in many articles, including Sram et al., Environ Health Perspec, 2005 (NIEHS) and Sun et al., Pregnancy and Childbirth, 2015. Preterm birth is the largest cause of childhood mortality in Cincinnati and many cities, as well one of the largest causes of morbidity and child health care cost. This is only one example of the real material and human costs of excess air pollution. I strongly believe that maintaining and advancing these standards is both cost effective and ethically right. As a pediatrician who studies the often devastating effects of prematurity, I must oppose policies that put the protection of the environment for future generations at risk. 


