

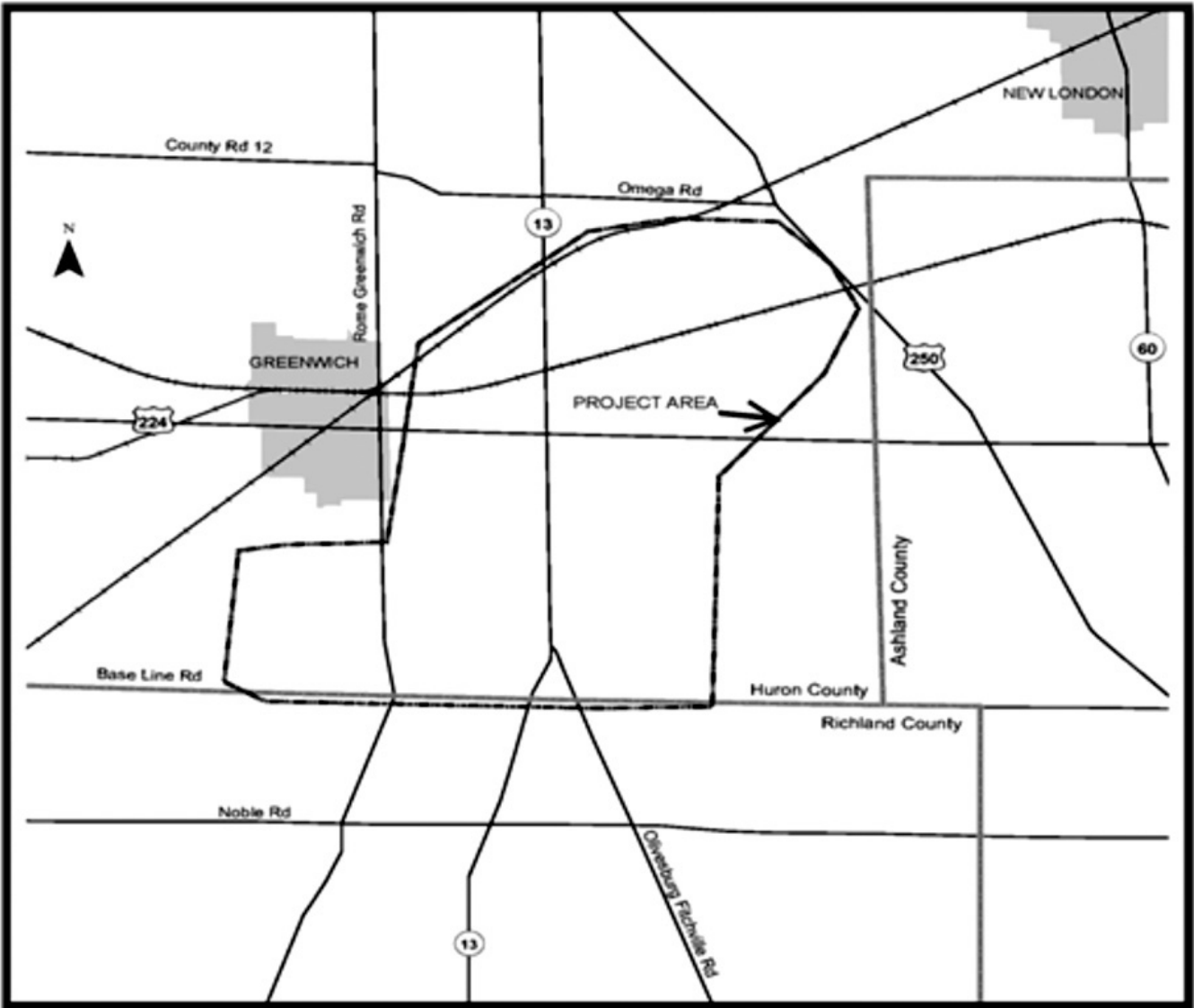
Notice of Amendment to Proposed Major Utility Facility

FACILITY DESCRIPTION

The Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board") issued a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need on August 25, 2014 in Case No. 13-990-EL-BGN authorizing 6011 Greenwich Windpark, LLC to construct, own, and operate up to 60 MW wind-powered electric generation facility consisting of up to 25 2.4 MW wind turbines at the Greenwich Wind Farm within approximately 4,650 acres in Greenwich Township, Huron County, Ohio.

AMENDMENT NOW PENDING

6011 Greenwich Windpark, LLC has an Application for an Amendment of its Certificate of Environmental Compatibility pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board") for approval of three additional turbine models that could be selected for this project. SC Dinner theatre “tapping” into the potential of the cast

Dinner and a show just does not do justice to the annual Dinner Theatre Production put on by the South Central choir members. This year will mark the 16th annual production made possible by choir director Linda Jackson. The production will feature 15 numbers from Broadway shows - complete with the notorious tap-dancing which takes hours of practice and patience for students to master. Those students being “some of the busiest students” Jackson knows, “many are athletes, work jobs, and maintain good grades at school. I marvel at how some of them make it all fit.” Despite their overflowing plates, the cast members devote hours of their time to getting things just right. Jackson runs a

nine week rehearsal schedule to accommodate the hectic agendas of her students. Jackson stated “the most time-consuming part of rehearsals is staging the production numbers, as they entail not only choreography, but full chorus parts that need to be learned.” The choreography for the entire show is done by none other than Jackson herself, and not just because she enjoys it, but because the students feel more comfortable with her leading the dances. “I know my students’ dancing experience and ability pretty well, and I want them to feel successful as soon as possible in the rehearsal run,” although “I am by no means a professional,” she added. The tap dancing numbers that have become a staple to each show is “definitely the most challenging.” Jackson utilizes demonstration videos and

even YouTube for at home practicing. Although the tap dancing may come easier to some than others, “the students are all supportive of each other.” The effort put forth by members each year has yet to disappoint Jackson. Any high school age student is welcome to audition for the show, but others wish to participate in a different light. The entire choir program from sixth grade up is asked to act as the wait staff for the shows. “I owe a great deal of its continued success not only to the great cast and crew who have come through the program,” Jackson stated, “but to the tireless teamwork of the South Central Music Parents Organization. I absolutely could not mount a production of this magnitude without their leadership and vision. It is truly a pull-together, family oriented operation, and I couldn’t feel more blessed by it.”

Conaway, Blanton, survive the Waite’ing game

South Central duo headed to State Wrestling tournament after pair of third place finishes at Toledo Waite District

But the paths of South Central freshman, Dakota Blanton, and senior, Cam Conaway, will each share the same destination this week, as the Trojans’ wrestling duo will both be headed to the OHSAA Division III State Wrestling Tournament.

The battle-tested veteran

bouts over his sophomore and junior seasons. He advanced in similar fashion as his 2015 District tourney, winning three of four matches, falling one bout shy of the District finals, with his lone blemish in the championship semifinals. Conaway pinned Zech Thompson of Montpelier (1:36) and Nick Devore of Van Buren (1:22) to set up a rematch with Delta’s Devon Richard in the semifinals. Conaway defeated Richard, 4-2, in the fifth place match at State last season, but the Delta star won Saturday’s bout at Waite by fall (5:36). A rebound victory by fall over Thompson (4:43) boosted Conaway to third and gave him six pins amongst his six postseason wins. Blanton (31-5) needed to fight his way to the 30-win plateau at 113 in order to secure his first State berth.
