ENTRY

The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) Petitions for closure of railroad crossings are governed by R.C. 4907.474 and 4907.475. Pursuant to these sections, in order to grant a closure petition, the Commission must find that there is no demonstrable need for the crossing to exist.
- (2) On March 1, 2016, an Entry was issued scheduling a March 29, 2016 evidentiary hearing in this matter. Since then, a scheduling conflict has arisen for the attorney examiner on March 29, 2016.
- (3) Accordingly, the new date for the evidentiary hearing shall be April 5, 2016, at 1:00 p.m. in Hearing Room 11-D at the Commission offices, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793. At the hearing, Ohi-Rail Corp. (OHIC) will be expected to present relevant evidence and witnesses in support of its petition. In addition, the village of Minerva will be permitted to present into the record relevant expert witness testimony and evidence it deems necessary.
- (4) Any party intending to present direct, expert testimony should comply with Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-29(A)(1)(h), which requires that all such testimony to be offered in this type of proceeding be filed and served upon all parties no later than seven days prior to the commencement of the hearing.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That the evidentiary hearing is rescheduled to April 5, 2016, at 1:00 p.m. in Hearing Room 11-D at the Commission offices, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793. It is, further,

ORDERED, That any party intending to present expert testimony comply with Finding (4). It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served on the administrator of the village of Minerva, the Ohio Rail Development Commission, OHIC and its counsel, and interested persons of record.
