Dear Ms. McNeal:

The September 17, 2015, Opinion, Order, and Certificate ("Certificate") approving Clean Energy Future-Lordstown, LLC ("CEFL") Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to Construct the Lordstown Energy Center established a set of conditions as part of the Certificate.

Within this set of conditions, **Condition No. 11** requires that:

Prior to the commencement of construction, the Applicant shall finalize coordination of the assessment of potential effects of the proposed facility on cultural resources, if any, with Staff and the OHPO. If the resulting coordination discloses a find of cultural or archaeological significance, or a site that could be eligible for inclusion in the NRHP, then the Applicant shall submit an amendment, modification, or mitigation plan to Staff. Any such mitigation effort, if needed, shall be developed in coordination with the OHPO and submitted to Staff for review.

In compliance with **Condition No. 11**, attached to this letter is correspondence from the Ohio Historic Preservation Office indicating that the property is not eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, and that no further coordination is required at this time. As such, CEFL is in compliance with Condition 11.

This is in response to the receipt, on March 5, 2015, of A Phase I Archeological Investigations for the Approximately 12.6 ha (31.15ac) Lordstown Energy Center in the Village of Lordstown, Trumbull County, Ohio. Also submitted was Cultural Historic Investigations and Assessment of Effects for the Proposed Lordstown Energy Center Power Generation Facility, Village of Lordstown, Trumbull County, Ohio. The comments of the State Historic Preservation Office are submitted in accordance with the provisions of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended.

Intensive visual inspection and subsurface testing of the project area did not identify any archaeological remains. Therefore, based on the information provided, I agree with the recommendation that no further archaeological work is necessary in the proposed project area. Re: Lordstown Energy Center Power Generating Facility, Trumbull County, Ohio

This is in response to the receipt, on June 2, 2015, of *Phase I Cultural Resource Management Investigations for the Approximately 59.1 ha (146 ac) Lordstown Energy Center Expansion Areas in the Village of Lordstown, Trumbull County, Ohio.* The comments of the State Historic Preservation Office are submitted in accordance with the provisions of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended.

Subsurface testing and intensive visual inspection of the project area resulted in the identification of one previously unrecorded archaeological site. This site, 33 TU 269, is a small historic artifact scatter associated with an early 20<sup>th</sup> century farmstead. This site is not likely to yield additional information about Ohio history. Based on the information provided, it is my opinion that this property is not eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. Therefore the project will not affect historic properties. No further coordination is required unless the project changes or additional archaeological remains are discovered during the course of the project. In such a situation, this office should be contacted as per 36 CFR 800.13.
