Pipeline Construction)

Dominion East Ohio is planning to Dominion East Ohio (DEO) is planning to replace approximately 4,465 feet of existing 10-inch diameter pipeline, with 5,515 feet of new 12-inch diameter natural gas pipeline within existing DEO right-of-way ("ROW"). The pipeline will run in a South East to North West direction on Woodland Avenue between Bottom Avenue to McCook Avenue, in a South West to North East direction on McCook Avenue between Woodland Avenue and Gardner Avenue, and West to East on Penn Road up to DEO's McCook Border Station. The proposed new pipeline will be entirely within an existing DEO right-of-way.

The location of the proposed new pipeline is shown on the map below:

A Letter of Notification ("LON") has been filed with the Ohio Power Siting Board ("Board") as Case No. 16-651-GA-BLN in order to construct, operate and maintain the proposed pipeline described above.

The Ohio Power Siting Board will review the Letter of Notification in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.10(A) which states that the Board shall not grant a certificate for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a major utility facility, either as proposed or as modified by the Board, unless it finds and determines all of the following: (1) The basis of the need for the facility; (2) The nature of the probable environmental impact; (3) That the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives, and other pertinent considerations; (4) In the case of an electric transmission line, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability; (5) That the facility will comply with Chapters 3704, 3734, and 6111 of the Revised Code and all rules and standards adopted under those chapters and under Sections 1501.33, 1501.34, and 4561.32 of the Revised Code. In determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and standards adopted under Section 4561.32 of the Revised Code, the board shall consult with the office of aviation of the division of multi-modal planning and programs of the department of transportation under Section 4561.341 of the Revised Code; (6) That the facility will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity; (7) In addition to the provisions contained in divisions (A)(1) to (6) of this section and rules adopted under those divisions, what its impact will be on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929 of the Revised Code that is located within the site and alternative site of the proposed major utility facility; rules adopted to evaluate impact under Division (A)(7) of this section shall not require the compilation, creation, submission, or production of any information, document, or other data pertaining to land not located within the site and alternative site; and (8) That the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the board, considering available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives.

In Greece, reforms ready, despite pause in bailout talks

ATHENS, Greece Talks between Greece and its bailout creditors over the country's next economic reforms efforts have been suspended until next week but Athens said Tuesday that an agreement that would trigger debt relief discussions was getting nearer.

Finance Minister Euclid Tsakalotos said the meetings in Athens would resume Monday, with an aim to reaching an agreement by April 25-26 when he is due to meet with his peers from the 19-country eurozone.

"We are very close to

reaching an agreement. We have a credible package of measures that is ready," Tsakalotos said after overnight negotiations failed to yield a breakthrough.

HTC's new phone focuses on camera quality

NEW YORK HTC is promising a better camera — along with refinements in audio and design — as it unveils its latest flagship phone, the HTC 10.

The camera has long a weak point in HTC devices. At first, HTC sacrificed image resolution and made the size of individual pixels larger to capture more light. But the resulting 4 megapixel images were often

fuzzy, especially when cropped or enlarged. HTC went with smaller individual pixels in a 20-megapixel camera last year, but it still underperformed in extreme situations, such as indoors and close-ups. The HTC 10 tries to strike a balance — larger individual pixels, but not as large as before.

Demand for SUVs boosts China auto sales by 10 percent

HONG KONG Chinese auto sales rose by nearly 10 percent in March, led by strong demand for SUVs that more than offset slipping passenger car sales, an industry group said Tuesday.

Finance officials face weak global economy

WASHINGTON World finance officials who meet in Washington this week confront a bleak picture: Eight years after the financial crisis erupted, the global economy remains fragile and at risk of another recession.

"Growth has been too slow for too long," Maurice Obstfeld, chief economist of the International Monetary Fund, warned on the eve of the spring meetings of the IMF, the World Bank and the Group of 20 major economies Thursday through Saturday.

The IMF on Tuesday downgraded its outlook for growth for most regions and for the global economy as a whole. It now foresees a weaker financial landscape than it did in January. Like the World Bank and the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, the IMF has repeatedly overestimated the

strength of the world economy in the aftermath of the 2008 financial crisis.

Problems span the globe. China's sharp slowdown has hurt commodity-exporting countries by driving down demand for everything from iron ore to coal. Prices of raw materials have sunk as a result.

A rising dollar has pinched American factories by making their goods more expensive in foreign markets and contributing to a sharp deceleration in U.S. growth since late 2015. The 19 countries that use the euro currency have struggled to gain any momentum despite aggressive easy-money policies from the European Central Bank. Japan's economy is hobbled by consumers wary of spending.

Obstfeld expressed concern about volatility in financial markets, the refugee crisis caused by violence in the Middle East and the

possibility that the United Kingdom will leave the European Union — a prospect that could undercut Europe's political and economic stability.

In the United States and Europe, Obstfeld said that "a backlash against cross-border economic integration threatens to halt or even reverse the postwar trend of ever more open trade."

The dangers could "pull the world economy below stalling speed," Obstfeld said.

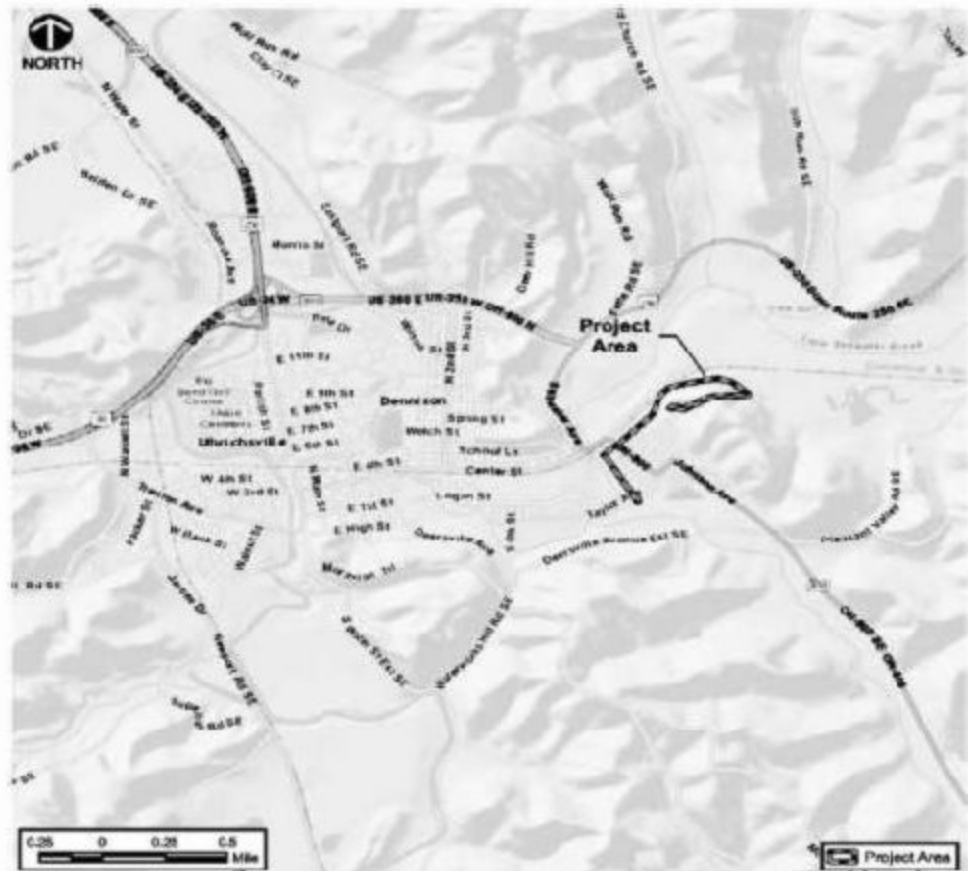
Experts have been confounded since the financial crisis by trends that in some ways have defied economic history.

Wages haven't risen significantly in advanced economies even though unemployment has fallen. Inflation has remained dangerously subpar despite ultra-low borrowing rates engineered by major central banks.
