- A. Yes. We went to schooling right at the beginning for -- one week schooling for the motor carrier part as far as vehicle inspection, one week for driver logbook inspection, and then one week for cargo tank inspection for hazmat, and one week for nonbulk inspection for hazardous materials.

- Q. Do you have any certifications as a result of that training?
 - A. Not on me, but, yes.
 - O. What are those certifications?
- A. It just shows that I completed those and passed those, all those courses.
 - Q. Do you have to update your training?
 - A. Then periodically we have updates.
- 9 We have -- we come to Columbus and we have
 10 updates on the new laws that come in, the
 11 changes, the out of service criteria and things
 12 like that that change.
- Q. Are you current with keeping your certification updated?
- 15 A. Yes.

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- Q. Okay. We are here today on the matter of Case No. 16-49-TR-CVF. How are you related to this case?
- A. I am the commercial inspector that stopped the commercial vehicle that Mr.
- 21 Geldmacher was driving, and did a commercial 22 safety inspection.

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- A. For driver, his logbook was not current. He was in violation of 395.8F1, which is logbook not current to the last chance of duty status.
- Q. So, could you tell us how you identified that violation?
- A. By asking for his logbook at the beginning of the inspection, and he has to hand it to us. And there it was, it was just right there.
- 11 Q. So you opened the logbook?
- 12 A. After he handed it to me, yes.
- Q. And you checked to see what the last change of duty status was?
 - A. That's correct.

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- Q. And what was the last change of duty status?
- A. September 30th, 2015 at 4:00 P.M. on duty status in North Canton, Ohio.
- O. What was the date for the last?
- A. September 30th. The last day of September, 2015. I stopped him on October 1st.
- Q. Okay. Now, you stopped him on October 1st. Where did you stop him at?
- 25 A. I stopped him in Wyandot County, US

30, mile post 21. That is about approximately five miles east of Upper Sandusky, Ohio.

- Q. And where was his last change of duty status? Where was he at at that time?
- A. His last change of duty status in his logbook showed North Canton, Ohio.
- Q. How far is North Canton, Ohio from Upper Sandusky where you did your inspection?
- A. It's near Canton, so it's approximately about two hours.
- Q. Okay. Now, what are the different duty status that you can have in your logbook?
- A. Well, we have -- it's a -- right now it's a graph, and on the graph it has off duty, sleeper birth, driving, and on duty.

And the driver fills these out by drawing the line. He starts at 12:00 o'clock, A.M. and starts drawing the line. So he should be showing like if he is off duty he should be showing the off duty and where he was off duty at.

And then when he does his pre-trip, when he starts to drive, and then any time he changes the duty status. Like if he stops to fuel then he should show himself on duty. If he

stops to unload he should be on duty until he has no responsibility of the truck or the load itself. Then he can show himself off duty.

And then he should be showing himself on duty when he starts to drive again.

- Q. Okay. And the time he said -- I am not sure if you mentioned the last time that he reported his duty status in Canton. What time of day was that?
- A. That was at 4:00 P.M. and he showed himself on duty in North Canton.
- Q. What was the last time -- what was the time of the inspection you did in Upper Sandusky?
- A. It was the next day. October 1st at 9:24 A.M.
- Q. So between 4 o'clock the previous day and 9:00 o'clock on the day of inspection there was nothing that showed that he was on duty, unloading, or off duty or sleeping or driving from Canton to Upper Sandusky?
- A. As far as the logbook just showed that he was still on duty in North Canton, where here I had him close to Upper Sandusky.
- Q. Okay. When you pointed this out to

the driver did he have any response?

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A. That I do not remember.

ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Mr. Geldmacher, do you have any questions for this witness?

MR. GELDMACHER: Yes. I told her --

                 MR. GELDMACHER: Now, the only

     thing -- my name is David Geldmacher.

                 The only thing I really came to talk

     about was the thing with the logbook violation,

    because what had happened was, and I explained

     to the police officer, I was over in Canton and

     I came over down to the Eagle truck stop in

     Canton. That's as far as I went, which is only
23
     like, you know, like 20 miles.

                 So then I went there and my wife
25
     came and picked me up and took me back to my
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garage. Because what had happened, a few days, like I don't know how many days before, but a couple days before and I was getting my police report ready, the oil field workers robbed my garage and stole me antique tool collection.

And I advised her of that.

And I was really mad. And I am still very angry, because the tools I had cannot be replaced. I went everywhere, they cannot be replaced.

not -- you cannot get them. I had little wrenches. I had little crescent wrenches that were only this big (indicating). Pipe wrenches barely this big. And square wrenches that were only this big. All different makes and all -- lots of them. Like I am talking about like 100 of them that I collected in a collection.

So oil field workers stole some other tools. She picked me up and took me to the house. I went through to see what all was missing because I was so wound up and mad because they had robbed me. It was my collection.

And it's gone, it's all gone. And

now I got some junk back, but not from this, but I got some junk back. But I don't have the tool collection like I had. It's gone forever, it's gone.

2.1

So, anyway, then she took me back to the truck. I rode up to -- you know, she said it was Nevada, you know, over there by Rainbow, I stopped there, because I was so wound up I couldn't even drive because I was pissed because my tool collection was gone.

I made the report to the Dennison police and filed a report about all my tools missing. But they didn't take my Craftsman tools which I could have replaced.

They only had a short time. They looked through the other side of the garage where they have an apartment and they could see my antique tool collection laying out. I had them all on this table in piles on this table and they could see them.

So then when I was cutting the grass, I was only like 10 minutes cutting the grass, a little strip of grass, they went in there and stole my antique tool collection.

And I know it was Joe that lives

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there said he is tired of looking for his tools,
which means I know he took my tools. Okay?

So then I went back to see what they
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took, and they took a few other things. Sockets and things for my house. But I was pissed off.

6 | I was mad. I was so mad I couldn't even drive.

2.1

I was that mad. And I am still angry about this. Because I liked my little tool collection. I know it sounds insane, but I liked it.

So, anyway, then I drove from the Eagle truck stop up there, went to sleep and slept so many hours. That's how all that time elapsed. I wasn't riding around delivering freight or nothing. Okay?

And then I went to do my logbook and it was overcast, very cloudy that day, dark clouds like black clouds floating around in the sky.

So I could not read like close like this. I couldn't write my log without my flashlight. I bought an expensive flashlight, a LED light, to see what I am writing because I need a lot of light.

Well, I let somebody use my truck

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one day, of course, my flashlight comes up broken. So then -- so my flashlight wouldn't work.

I told her, I said I am going to the McDonald's up here and sit down and watch the news and drink some coffee and do my log and catch up. But I couldn't catch it up under the circumstances because I cannot write the lines unless I have bright light to see what I am doing.

I even have a magnifying glass and all to see, but I needed light. There is no light because it come on in my truck but it's dim, it's like very dim. So I can't see to do the log.

will tell you at my company, I am the only guy
that runs legal and runs a legal log. And then
the Department of the Public Utilities
Commission did something because of something my
company made me do, then they got me for
falsifying, but I wasn't even falsifying
anywhere, but I did do something wrong, I can't
lie to you.

I am going to admit to it, but I

don't care. Because I didn't do it, I didn't choose to do this, they made me do it, they made me ride from Indiana back to Illinois, come back from Illinois, back to Indiana, just for the hell of it.

So they said I would be meeting another driver, something. But then I just did that, all that riding for just to be doing it in the thin air, just to be doing it.

So then that's the only thing they ever jacked me up on the log. I am the only person that runs a legal log in that company.

And then the reason I end up in

Kuntzman Trucking, that's how I ended up there,

because Rodney Gordon Transport or Gordon

Trucking or whatever name he is under now, he

had us running -- he wanted us to log 700 and

some miles per day on our log, which you have to

go like close to 70 miles an hour all day long,

which is impossible.

So I turned him into the DOT. So the DOT told Rodney Gordon that I turned him in. I was the one who did it.

So I go down to Nestle Foods in Danville, Virginia, it was me and the other

driver, the other driver was in front of me, and the other driver got my license back. So he had my license and he had his license back.

Well, Rodney Gordon and John Enfe said, well, bring it back to us and they deny it went to the people at Danville, Virginia. I said where's my license?

So nobody got my license. So I leave and I get a major violation because I get a ticket because Rodney Gordon had the other driver take my license and steal it and bring it back to him, then they acted like they knew nothing about my license.

And Nestle Foods said we gave it to your other driver. And he was in front of me and I was behind him. He got my license and took off with it. Okay? Because Rodney Gordon done that because I turned him into the DOT for telling me I had to log 700, like 730 miles a day on my log, which you can't do.

Plus that was before the speed limit changed. It was still 55 and stuff. There ain't no way you can log 700 miles going 55 miles an hour and stuff and 60. No way you could do it.

So I turned him in, then I get a major violation. Then I had one other major violation. And even have a witness on this one.

I was out in Pennsylvania and there was a Judge Alloway and I was riding with my wife was in the truck. She was in the truck with me riding on the PA, I think on the Turn Pike, Pennsylvania Turn Pike, going through the tunnel.

Before you get through the tunnel they have one lane, truck turnoff lane. I was in the right lane where I was supposed to be.

Here comes a truck, pulls right in front of me, my wife can even witness this, and slams on his brakes.

So there was a concrete wall on the right side so I have to go to the left to avoid hitting him because he pulled in front of me and slammed on his brakes.

So then the guy circled and then riding in the wrong lane. So that is what I am charged with, riding in the wrong lane.

Well, anyway, I sent the ticket to TRL Incorporated because we had to report all of our tickets we got. So TRL sent the ticket to

the court where Judge Alloway was. Anyway, he said we throw that stuff away. That is what he said, they threw it away already.

And I am charged with this whole paragraph, I am not charged with what he circled me for, riding in the wrong lane, because the cop wrote the wrong ticket out.

So then I got another major violation then that's how I ended up working where I work. I wouldn't even work for a company like that.

ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Mr. Geldmacher, let me stop you right there. Let's focus on the date of inspection, October 1st, 2015. The violation that you were charged with, which is logbook violation.

MR. GELDMACHER: Yes, sir.

18 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Can we focus on

19 that?

MR. GELDMACHER: Yes. I know, but what I tried to explain to her was when she pulled me over, she wanted to pull me over because I was Kuntzman, not because I was violating the law. And I told her, I said I am going to McDonald's, I am going to do my log at

McDonald's because I can't see because my light is broke.

2.

I told you I bought a new flashlight with LED lights so I could see. I cannot do my log without a light. It was overcast, like black clouds that day. I couldn't see. I could not see to write the lines.

So I said I am going to McDonald's,
I am going to go in there and drink my coffee
and do my log, catch everything up. But
the reason there was all that time was because I
had that 10-hour break in there where I went to
sleep, and I slept like 10 hours. I didn't
sleep like 8 because I was so upset because my
tools were gone.

And I don't think, even my wife will tell you if you call her up right now, she will tell you I have been a hellion for weeks because my tools are gone. I am pissed off about my tools being gone.

I went out and tried to replace them. I went all over, different states and I cannot get my tools back. I am talking about buying other tools that are similar back. I cannot find my tools. They are not --

ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Okay. With regard to the logbook violation, your testimony is that you couldn't see to fill it out?

2.1

MR. GELDMACHER: When I stopped I was only like two or three miles from where she pulled me over and I was sleeping. Then I got up, then I couldn't see, my flashlight wouldn't work because another driver had used my truck and he dropped the LED light and then the LED light was flickering. And I bought another LED light like that too and if you dropped it just one time it will flicker, it will not work.

So I bought two of those. Now I bought my third light just in the past three to six months, I have had like three big lights I bought and now I just bought another one. I bought a plain one this time and it's still working.

But the guy dropped my light and it was flickering so I couldn't see. I cannot see without a light. And the light in my truck is not bright enough. I cannot see without a light. I told her that. I cannot see to draw the lines, I cannot do it.

I could see -- my vision is 20/20

straight out, but up close, I have a problem
seeing up close like reading, like I need
reading glasses up close. You know what I am
saying? That is what I am talking about. And I
cannot see to make the lines to do my log.
That's why I was going to McDonald's where I
could see.

And I use a magnifying glass and hold it over the log and then I make my lines and I make sure, I put the ruler down, I look in the magnifying glass to see it's all straight and the lines all match up where they are supposed to be. Because I cannot do that.

And I told her that. I said I have to go to McDonald's, it's too dark. And that's what I am saying. I wasn't riding around for like 14 hours or whatever. I wasn't riding around. I stopped, my wife picked me up, we went to the house, I went looking for my tools because I had to finish the police report to go to the Dennison police about what all is missing.

And then never got nothing back.

They got my tools. And she took me back to the truck, I rode and I went to bed because I was

mad. And even when she pulled me over I was mad.

I hadn't even went to the bathroom yet. I told her I had to go to the bathroom because there was no bathroom where I was at. So I wanted to go in there and use the restroom because, you know, I had been 14 hours sitting in the truck, you know. I had been two hours going to my house or whatever, two hours riding over there, 10 hours -- I had my 10-hour break, more than a 10-hour break.

So from like, I don't know, I don't remember what time, it was 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon or something, until midnight, however long that is, like six, seven hours, then I had until like 9:00 o'clock the next morning. It was like 16, like six hours and nine hours, it was like 15 hours I didn't even -- I only drove the truck two hours out of the 15.

And I was sitting. I was sleeping.

Then I actually slept the whole ten hours

because I had been worked up, so upset about my

tools being ripped off.

It was more than a thousand dollars worth of tools. Way more than that. I don't

know how much money worth of tools it fully was because I never appraised them.

So I kind of got ripped off because I have an antique spot and the woman selling some wrenches like the ones I had in there and she is getting like 50, 60, \$70 apiece for them. And I had a hundred of them and the oil field workers robbed me.

ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Okay. With regard to logbook violation, do you have anymore testimony dealing with that?

MR. GELDMACHER: No. I just wanted you to hear what I was upset about. That is why I was upset because I wasn't riding around doing nothing like delivering freight or, you know what I am saying, I wasn't driving the truck or delivering freight. I was sleeping.

And then I got up, and she pulled me over because she said you are Kuntzman is why I pulled you over, which they did. The State Patrol has pulled me over and in the last couple of years like 25 times and said we just stopped you because you are Kuntzman, not because I was getting a ticket, because you are Kuntzman.

Because we have the ability of

putting Kuntzman out of business. But the only person getting put out of business is Dave Geldmacher because my driving record is so bad nobody will give me a job if I don't stop working for that bastard.

2.1

And that is the truth and he hates me and I am getting ready to lose my job. He already threatened to fire me. I might even be fired today. So I have no job at all.

And even worst stuff than this has been happening. And it's all him and his garbage. And I told him, I told him everything he owns is shit. That is what I told him right to his face. That is why he really hates me.

And that's the truth. He made \$3 million last year and in 2015 he reported he made \$3 million in profits for himself. And he drives shit down the road. That is the truth.

And I ended up because of Rodney

Gordon, I wouldn't even work for a man like that

because of what he is, what he has done with his

equipment. And you write it up, it doesn't get

fixed, nothing gets repaired, nothing. And

that's how it is for me.

So eventually I will lose my job and
