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5 1 Tuesday Morning, May 24, 2016. 2 3 4 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio has scheduled for a 5 6 hearing cases in the Matter of the Regulation of 7 the Purchased Gas Adjustment Clauses Contained Within the Rate Schedules of Eastern Natural Gas 8 9 Company, Pike Natural Gas Company 10 and Southeastern Natural Gas Company. 11 The case numbers respectively are 12 15-207-GA-GCR, 15-214-GA-GCR, and 15-215-GA-GCR. 13 This hearing also addresses the 14 uncollectible expense riders of Eastern Natural 15 Gas Company, Pike Natural Gas Company. 16 Their respective case numbers are 17 15-307-GA-UEX and 15-314-GA-UEX. 18 And finally the hearing addresses 19 the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Riders of 20 Eastern Natural Gas Company, Pike Natural Gas 21 Company and Southeastern Natural Gas Company. 2.2 Case numbers 15-407-GA-PIP, 23 15-414-GA-PIP and 15-415-GA-PIP. 24 My name is Doug Jennings, I am an Attorney Examiner and I have been assigned to 25

1 preside over the hearing. 2 At this point I would request 3 the parties enter an appearance on the record. MR. HOWARD: Thank you, your Honor. 4 5 If the Commission please, would you please have 6 the record reflect the appearance on behalf of 7 Eastern Natural Gas Company, Pike Natural Gas 8 Company and Southeastern Natural Gas Company, 9 through the law firm of Vorys, Sater, Seymour 10 and Pease, by Stephen M. Howard, 52 East Gay 11 Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. Thank you. 12 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you. 13 MR. LINDGREN: On behalf of the 14 Commission's Staff, Ohio Attorney General Mike 15 DeWine by Thomas Lindgren, Assistant Attorney 16 General, 30 East Broad Street, 16th Floor, 17 Columbus, Ohio 43215. 18 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you. Let 19 the record reflect that there is no one from 20 the general public at attendance at today's 21 hearing. 2.2 It's my understanding that the 23 parties have entered into a stipulation. 24 MR. LINDGREN: That is correct, your 25 Honor

2	you have a witness to support the stipulation	
3	you wish to call?	
4	MR. LINDGREN: Yes. The Staff would	
5	like to call Roger Sarver to the stand.

9	called as a witness, being first duly sworn,	
10	testified as follows:	
11	DIRECT EXAMINATION	
12	By Mr. Lindgren:	
13	Q. Good morning, Mr. Sarver.	
14	A. Good morning.	
15	Q. Would you please state your full	
16	name for the record?	
17	A. My name is Roger L. Sarver. My	
18	business address is 180 East Broad Street,	
19	Columbus, Ohio 43215.	
20	Q. And, Mr. Sarver, where are you	
21	employed?	
22	A. I am employed by the Public	
23	Utilities Commission of Ohio as an Energy	
24	Specialist.	
25	Q. What are your duties as an Energy

1 Specialist? 2 Α. My duties include the scheduling of 3 and the performance of the Gas Cost Recovery, the Uncollectible and the Percentage of Income 4 5 Payment Plan Financial Rider audits. 6 How long have you been in that Ο. 7 position? 8 Α. Almost 28 years. 9 Ο. Thank you. Are you familiar with 10 the facts of the cases that are before us today? 11 Α. Yes. 12 Ο. Thank you. And are you familiar 13 with the terms of the Stipulation and 14 Recommendation that the parties to this case 15 have signed? 16 Yes, sir. We worked with the Α. 17 company and its consultants to reach a 18 settlement. 19 Thank you. In your opinion is Ο. 20 the settlement a product of serious bargaining 21 among capable and knowledgeable parties? 2.2 Α. Yes. 23 Ο. And does the settlement as a package 24 benefit ratepayers and the public interest? 25 Α. Yes. Through these audits, the GCR,

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1	UEX and PIP, there are what I will call some	
2	errors, adjustments, inclusion of costs that	
3	were not previously recorded or recognized for	
4	recovery into the calculations of the companies'	
5	GCR, and the end result is adjustments that	
6	reflect the costs the utilities have incurred to	
7	provide those services to its customers.	
8	Q. Thank you. And are you familiar	
9	with the regulatory principles and practices	
10	that apply in this type of case?	
11	A. Yes, sir.	
12	Q. Then does the settlement package	
13	violate any important regulatory principle or	
14	practice?	
15	A. No, sir.	
16	Q. Thank you. And is there anything	
17	else that came to your attention in the course	
18	of these audits that you would like to make	
19	the Commission aware of?	
20	A. Yes. After the conclusion of the	
21	filing of the Staff Report Staff had brought to	
22	its attention by the Company costs associated	
23	with serving three schools in Scioto County.	
24	These schools are served through a	
25	combination of local distribution companies with	

1	the gas entering in through Columbia Gas of
2	Ohio, being transported to Knox Energy, and then
3	Knox Energy transports it across its system to
4	Pike, who then serves the local distribution
5	companies, or serves these schools.
6	And what Staff was unaware of when
7	it initiated these audits was of these
8	customers, of their costs and how they were
9	being recognized for cost recovery through Pike
10	Waverly's gas cost recovery mechanism.
11	So, we did not note that in our
12	audit report, we did not, other than in
13	paragraph under the gas cost recovery matters,
14	under C, we do make mention of the company
15	failing to include the costs, and down below
16	recognizing the Staff was unable to tie the gas
17	cost, the gas supply cost, charged by Knox.
18	So we couldn't tie those out.
19	Then we made another observation for
20	future audits vital to be able to audit the cost
21	of gas purchased from unregulated cooperatives
22	and, therefore, all costs sought for recovery
23	through Pike and Eastern's GCR filings going
24	forward should be verified through
25	documentations from non-Knox and non-affiliated

1 parties. 2 Do you have anything to add? Ο. 3 Well, Staff in its review have noted Α. some similarities to this in other audits its 4 5 done in the past. And Staff questions the need 6 to insert a third local distribution company in 7 servicing the schools when Knox Energy's system is in the immediate vicinity. 8 9 Staff found in other audits the 10 least number of entities, pipelines and LDCs the 11 gas must pass through before reaching customers 12 results in lower GCR costs. Staff would like to raise this 13 14 concern with the Commission that the 15 proliferation of the practice of inserting 16 additional entities into the procurement of gas 17 and/or its delivery only results in the layering 18 of costs to natural gas customers. 19 We have seen it in the past, and 20 what we would like to do is bring to the 21 Commission's attention along with the companies' 22 that we hope that this practice does not become 23 the norm. 24 Thank you. Do you have anything Ο. 25 further to add?
