{¶ 1} Pursuant to R.C. 4927.21, the Commission has authority to consider written complaints filed against a telephone company by any person or corporation regarding any rate, service, regulation, or practice relating to any service furnished by the telephone company that is in any respect unjust, unreasonable, insufficient, or unjustly discriminatory.

{¶ 2} AT&T Corp. (AT&T) and TSC Communications, Inc. (TSC) are telephone companies as defined in R.C. 4905.03 and, as such, are subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

{¶ 3} On May 16, 2016, AT&T filed a complaint against TSC alleging that TSC has assessed unlawful charges for intrastate access service.

{¶ 4} On May 31, 2016, AT&T and TSC jointly moved for an extension of time for TSC to plead. TSC's response to the complaint is due by June 16, 2016. The parties request that TSC be granted until June 30, 2016, to file a response to the complaint.

{¶ 5} The attorney examiner finds that the motion for an extension of time is reasonable. Accordingly, TSC should be granted until June 30, 2016, to file a response to the complaint.

{¶ 6} It is, therefore,

{¶ 7} ORDERED, That the parties' motion to extend until June 30, 2016, the time for TSC to file a response to the complaint be granted. It is, further,

{¶ 8} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties and interested persons of record.
