- Q. By whom are you employed?
- A. I am employed by Columbia Gas of Ohio.

Would you state briefly your educational background and experience?

- A. I received my Bachelor of Arts

  degree from Marietta College in Political

  Science and Communications. In 2010 I received

  my Juris Doctor from Capital University Law

  School.
- Q. Can you tell us a little bit about your work experience?
- A. After law school I actually worked at two firms in the Columbus area practicing utilities law.

And after that time I then joined the Columbia Gas of Ohio legal team in real estate, then regulatory. And in April 2015 I moved to the Columbia Gas of Ohio regulatory department, and my current role as Director of Regulatory Policy.

- Q. And could you explain a little bit about your job responsibilities as the Director of Regulatory Policy?
- A. My job responsibilities are to prepare, review and shepherd through all of our regulatory filings at the Columbia Gas of Ohio regulatory department. The easiest way I like to explain to folks is that I do a lot of our non-financial filings. Customer complaint cases, Power Siting Board applications. And my counterpart deals with the financial filings.
- Q. And what's the purpose of your testimony today?
- A. The purpose of my testimony today is to support the stipulation filed in this proceeding.
- Q. And are you familiar with the criteria the Commission utilizes for the approval of settlements?
  - A. I am.

- Q. And is the stipulation a product of serious bargaining among capable and knowledgeable parties?
- A. It is. The stipulation was an agreement between the Commission's staff and

Columbia Gas of Ohio. Both parties did negotiate and come to terms that did amend the application in this proceeding.

- Q. And do you believe the stipulation as a package benefits ratepayers and the public interest?
- A. It does. The stipulation provides for additional regulatory funding in the deferral authority for Columbia's pipeline safety program.

The pipeline safety program itself is a benefit to the customers and to the general public. It provides for safety funding for four of our programs as well as provides the customers and our public with educational opportunities.

And also a program that goes after our most riskiest risks on our system from a distribution standpoint.

- Q. And do you believe the stipulation as a package violates any important regulatory principle or practice?
  - A. It does not.
- Q. And so what is your recommendation
  for the Commission today?
