15	different procedures at these stops and we
16	believe that it would increase the safety
17	of our community if our buses and other

20	In total with what we got exempt then
21	and now it would save us about 45 minutes a
22	day on all these stops. So, that's about
23	all I got.

10	there's no reason from our standpoint to
11	incur the actual risk.

9	everything on the train.
LO	So, our official stance is that we
11	object to it becoming exemption. One of
L2	our officers is a railroad engineer for one
13	of the major railroads and he thinks it
14	will get truck drivers confused when they
15	don't have to stop here, this is more of a
16	hazardous waste, don't have to stop here
1.7	but when they're crossing the tracks
18	elsewhere in Wood County or wherever he
19	takes his train through and maybe decide
20	they don't have to stop there either
21	because don't have to stop here in Lucas
22	County. I think that's where he's coming
23	from.
24	There are signals at 295, so when the
25	locomotive does come through they'll be
