{¶ 1} On October 20, 2016, National Power Source, LLC filed a renewal application for certification as a competitive retail electric service broker/aggregator in the state of Ohio.

{¶ 2} In accordance with R.C. 4928.08, as well as Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-24-10, National Power Source's application for certification is subject to a 30-day automatic approval process. Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-24-10 provides that, upon good cause shown, the Commission or an attorney examiner may suspend consideration of an application for certification. If an application for certification is suspended, the Commission shall act to approve or deny the application within 90 days of the suspension.

{¶ 3} The attorney examiner finds that good cause exists to suspend the 30-day automatic approval process for National Power Source's application for certification, in order for the Commission and Staff to further review this matter.

{¶ 4} It is, therefore,

{¶ 5} ORDERED, That the automatic approval process for National Power Source's application for certification as a competitive retail electric service broker/aggregator be suspended. It is, further,

{¶ 6} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon each party of record.
