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8 ALJ ADDISON: Please be seated. 1 2 3 Shawn Malone, being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 4 5 examined and testified as follows: 6 DIRECT EXAMINATION 7 By Ms. Miller: 8 Q. Good morning. 9 A. Good morning. 10 Q. How are you doing? 11 A. Wonderful. Thank you. 12 Good. If you would please state your Q. name and business address for the record. 13 14 Sure. My name is Shawn Malone, and the 15 business address is 700 Morrison Road, Gahanna, Ohio 16 43230. 17 MS. MILLER: Your Honor, permission to 18 approach the witness? 19 ALJ ADDISON: You may. 20 By Ms. Miller: 2.1 Mr. Malone, can you please identify for 22 the record what I'm handing you? 23 A. Yes; my prefiled testimony.

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Okay. And did you cause this testimony

A. Yes, I did.

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- Q. Okay. And, Mr. Malone, did you answer these questions truthfully and to the best of your ability?
 - A. I certainly did.
- Q. Okay. And do you have any corrections to make here for the record today?
 - A. No, I do not.
- Q. Okay. Mr. Malone, did you rely on the Application, AEP Ohio Exhibit 1, when preparing your testimony?
- 12 A. Yes, I did.
- Q. Okay. And are the conditions in the

 Joint Stipulation similar to that contained in

 Staff -- the Staff Report?
- 16 A. Yes, they are.
 - Q. Okay. And if you would please, just give us an overview of the major provisions of the Joint Stipulation.
 - A. Sure. This project was first brought about due to the weak infrastructure and aging infrastructure down in southeastern Ohio.
- Currently the transmission voltage down
 there is a 235 kV system. We're bringing in a new
 source which will be a 138, which is a much stronger

source to improve the reliability down in that area.

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Southeast Ohio is actually the worst performing region when it pertains to outages. They are unplanned outages to customers in the area, so this is -- we have a larger plan called the Marietta Improvement Project.

This is the first leg or first part of that project just to improve the reliability and replace the aging infrastructure in that area.

This project is going, as I mentioned

138 kilovolt, approximately eight miles, and it will

extend from our South Caldwell station, which is an

existing substation, down to our Macksburg

substation.

- Q. Okay. And, Mr. Malone, does the Stipulation represent a product of serious bargaining between capable and knowledgeable parties?
- A. Yes, it does. Both parties represented by counsel who are knowledgeable and capable in these matters, and very familiar with regulatory proceedings.
- Q. Okay. And does the Stipulation benefit consumers and the public at large?
- A. It does indeed. As I mentioned, it's an aging infrastructure down in that area, so it's going

to provide much greater reliability to the system in that area.

Additionally, those areas through which the lines traverse will receive taxes paid by AEP, and roughly, just for this section of line, it will be about 547,000 is the estimated tax benefit to those communities that will again be part of this line.

- Q. Great. And did AEP Ohio Transco take into account any public input when developing its preferred route and alternate routes for this project?
- A. Yes, we certainly did. We had two public information meetings that were both to those properties that were affected by the preferred, and the alternate route. They received actual physical letters mailed to their address, and then we also did public announcements to the local newspapers.

And then we took that input, and actually part of our supplement to our original Application was based on that. So we made minor line adjustments from property owners' requests.

Q. And, Mr. Malone, do you support the Joint Stipulation and Recommendation filed in this case?

A. I certainly do.

MS. MILLER: And just so that the record reflects, Mr. Malone's testimony was in fact marked as Exhibit AEP Ohio Transco Exhibit 6.

Thank you, Mr. Malone. No further questions.

7 ALJ ADDISON: Thank you. Mr. Lindgren, 8 any questions?

MR. LINDGREN: No, thank you. No questions, your Honor.

11 ALJ ADDISON: Thank you. I just have a 12 few, Mr. Malone.

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14 EXAMINATION

15 By ALJ Addison:

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- Q. You spoke a little bit about receiving customer input and reacting to that input.
- A. Correct.
- Q. Do you know of any efforts undertaken by the Applicant in response to those concerns raised or -- raised during the local public hearing held in Caldwell, Ohio?
- A. Yes. Actually we had some meetings with the property owners after that meeting, specifically a couple of property owners who requested line

adjustments on their property.

One had a potential home site that was going to be impacted by the line, and they also had a farm pond, and he wanted us to be away from that, so we made adjustments actually shifting the line slightly to the neighbor's property, but definitely avoiding those two home areas, the certain problem that he had on his property.

- Q. And I just want to clarify, I'm talking about the local public hearing that was held on November 2nd --
- 12 A. Yes.

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- Q. -- in Caldwell, and those --
- 14 A. Those comments?
- 15 Q. Yeah.
 - A. So the comments that I recall were the written comments that were posted, and when we read through those, most of those were aged, they had been previously brought up, and they were regarding notifications to the property owners. Is that what you're --
 - Q. Yes.
 - A. -- addressing?

So we met with the two property owners previously, and at one of the very early meetings

they had received a notification that we had the right to be on their property.

They introduced counsel and they said that we were to go through counsel to -- as part of our correspondence with them. So we gave our notifications to their counsel.

It seems to us that their counsel did not pass that along to them, so I think there was just a miscommunication in that we thought we fully gave the appropriate notices we were intended to.

We did it to the right channels they asked us to, but then they seem surprised. So I don't know why the communication broke down, but we, on our part, thought we did exactly what we were told to do and requested to do by the property owners.

Q. Thank you for that.

And just as a clarification, Mr. Malone, on Page 2 of your prefiled testimony you note that the Joint Stipulation and Recommendation, what's been marked as Joint Exhibit 1, was filed on November 15th. Should that be November 16th?

A. Well, I don't know that. I was going to say was it officially docketed?

MS. MILLER: Yes, ma'am, there's a correction there.

1 ALJ ADDISON: Thank you. Just wanted to 2 make sure the record is clear.

THE WITNESS: When it hit the actual docket --

By ALJ Addison:

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- Q. And, Mr. Malone, if you would like to turn to Pages 3 and 4 of your prefiled testimony, there you're discussing the requirements of Revised Code 4906-10. Do you see that?
- A. Yes.
- Q. My understanding is that that statute has subsections (A)(1) through (A)(8). Is that correct?
 - A. I honestly don't know, to be quite frank with you. I don't know. I'm sure it does, if you've looked at it.
 - Q. Well, perhaps if we look at the Joint Stipulation and Recommendation on Pages 7 and 8, you discuss all of the -- all of those subsections minus one, which is 4906-10(A)(8), and that's dealing with water conservation.

Was there any reason why the Stipulation didn't discuss that in particular for this particular project?

A. None that I know of.

Q. Are there any water conservation concerns regarding this project that have been raised?

- A. No, not that I'm aware of in any way, shape, or form.
- Q. Thank you. And if you could quickly explain just for my own purposes how the Applicant will work with the Ohio Historic Preservation Office during this process, during CWIP construction and construction activities?
- A. Sure. Most of that will actually be handled by Staff, in that will provide all of our documentation to Staff, and I believe Staff will then be responsible to get it to the Ohio Historical Preservation Office.

They will have impacts and they will make comments to Staff. Staff will share that with us, and if they feel that we're being impactful to a particular area, historical marker of some sort -- in the past we have always worked with them to come up with a solution agreeable to both us and them.

So they have the authority, and we recognize that authority, and we'll -- we'll work with them to come up with a reasonable solution that's acceptable to both parties.

ALJ ADDISON: Thank you very much, 1 2 Mr. Malone. I believe that concludes all of my questioning. Ms. Miller, did you have any additional 3 questions based on -- certainly. 4 5 MS. MILLER: If we could just adjourn 6 momentarily so we could confer with Staff on a point 7 that was in the Joint Stipulation. ALJ ADDISON: Absolutely. Let's take a 8 brief recess. 9 10 (Recess taken.) 11 ALJ ADDISON: Let's go back on the 12 record. Ms. Miller. 13 MS. MILLER: Yes, ma'am. So at this time AEP Ohio Transmission Company would like to move 14 15 to have AEP Ohio Transco Exhibits 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 16 6 admitted into evidence. 17 ALJ ADDISON: Any objections from the 18 Staff? 19 MR. LINDGREN: No objections. 20 ALJ ADDISON: Seeing none, they will be 2.1 admitted. 22 (EXHIBITS ADMITTED INTO EVIDENCE.) 23 MS. MILLER: Thank you, your Honor. And 24 also --25 ALJ ADDISON: Excuse me. I'm going to
