Utilities Commission of Ohio has called for hearing

being in the matter of Tony Ford, notice of apparent

violation and intent to assess forfeiture. My name

is Nick Walstra. I'm the attorney examiner assigned

by the commission to hear this case.

We'll begin by taking appearances.

MR. BEELER: Thank you, Your Honor. On behalf of the Staff of the Public Utilities

THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you.

I'll note for the record that Mr. Ford, the respondent, is not present. It's a little -- it's 1:10 p.m. now. At this point, we will just proceed.

Mr. Beeler.

MR. BEELER: Thank you, Your Honor.

The Staff of the Public Utilities Commission in this case would move for a default judgment, and that's

according to OAC Rule 4901:2-7-14(E), which states that "a respondent who has requested an administrative hearing and fails to appear for the evidentiary hearing shall be in default. A respondent in default shall be deemed to have admitted the occurrence of the violation and waived all further right to contest liability for the forfeiture proposed in the notice of preliminary determination or to contest the making of the compliance order described in the notice of preliminary determination."

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And, Your Honor, I would note that today we have -- we do have a correction to the driver examination report and the notice of preliminary determination. We were going to delete one of the violations.

THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Okay.

MR. BEELER: So I'm going to put my witnesses on to just describe that correction, and then I will move for default judgment on the balance of the -- with the change. So the balance of the case, I'll move for default judgment.

THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: That sounds good. Call your first witness.

MR. BEELER: Thank you. At this time,

6 Staff will call Inspector Schneider to the stand. 1 2 3 MICHAEL SCHNEIDER, called as a witness, being first duly sworn, 4 5 testified as follows: 6 DIRECT EXAMINATION 7 BY MR. BEELER: Good afternoon. 8 Q. 9 Α. Afternoon. 10 Q. Please state your full name for the 11 record. 12 Michael Schneider, S-C-H-N-E-I-D-E-R. Α. 13 Q. Where are you employed? 14 I'm employed at the Ohio State Highway Α. 15 Patrol, Warren District headquarters. And, now, what is your position within 16 0. 17 the highway patrol? 18 Α. I am a motor carrier supervisor. 19 How long have you been in that Ο. 20 position? 2.1 Α. In this position? Seven years. 22 How long have you been with the patrol? Q. 38. 23 Α. 24 Okay. What are your duties in your 0. current capacity? 25

- A. My job is to supervise the motor carrier enforcement personnel in the Warren District.
- Q. Okay. What sort of training do you have in that area?
- A. I received my NAS training, my North
 American Standards training, back in October of
 1992, both Part A and Part B. I went through
 recertification school in '98, and I became a motor
 supervisor in 2001. I'm an NAS instructor -- Part
 A, Part B, and PVI.
- Q. And then you do continuing, yearly re-education courses, correct?
 - A. Yes. We do yearly in-service.
- Q. Okay. Just quickly, are your motor
 carrier inspections conducted to protect the safety
 of Ohio's traveling public?
 - A. Yes, they are.
- 19 Q. How many inspections do you think you 20 perform in a year?
- 21 A. About 400.
- MR. BEELER: Okay. May I approach the
- 23 | witness?

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- THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You may.
- 25 (Staff Exhibit 1 marked for identification.)

BY MR. BEELER:

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Q. I have what's marked as Staff
Exhibit 1. This is the driver/vehicle examination report with an inspection date of April 1, 2016.

Just take a quick look at that.

Do you recognize this document?

- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Is this document a patrol record?
- A. Yes, it is.
- Q. And is it kept in the ordinary course of the business of the patrol?
- 12 A. Yes, it is.
- Q. And it's the practice of the patrol to make the report?
- 15 A. Yes, it is.
 - Q. And you prepare this report on matters observed pursuant to a duty imposed by law, which there was a duty to report by you, correct?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. Is this document in the same condition as when you originally prepared it?
- 22 A. Yes, it is.
- Q. Okay. So I understand you have some corrections to make to this report today; is that correct?

A. Yes.

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- Q. What is that correction?
- A. I'd like to remove the violation of

 391.15A-NSIN from the report, which is driving under

 suspension.
 - Q. Okay. And why are you deleting that?
 - A. I have no proof that at that time he was under suspension.
 - Q. Okay. So you were mistaken that the day of the -- the day of this -- of the stop --
- 11 A. Yeah.
- 12 Q. -- at least as of today?
- 13 A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. But the remainder of the other
 two violations, which is failing to wear a seat belt
 while operating a CMV and operating a motor vehicle
 without carrying a valid medical certificate -those two violations are still valid?
 - A. Yes, sir, they are.
- 20 MR. BEELER: Thank you. No further 21 questions, Your Honor.
- THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you.
- MR. SCHNEIDER: Thank you.
- 24 MR. BEELER: At this time, Staff would
- 25 call its second witness, Alan Martin.

10 1 2 ALAN MARTIN, 3 called as a witness, being first duly sworn, testified as follows: 4 5 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BEELER: 6 7 0. Please state your name for the record. It's Alan A-L-A-N; Martin, M-A-R-T-I-N. 8 Α. 9 Ο. Where are you employed? Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. 10 Α. 11 And what is your position? Q. 12 I'm a deputy director. Α. 13 Q. How long have you been in that 14 position? 15 Α. 14 years. 16 Q. What are your duties in that position? 17 I oversee the Motor Carrier Safety Α. 18 Assistance Program for the state. I also oversee 19 the Civil Forfeiture Division and the Registration 20 Division of the Transportation Department. 2.1 Ο. What sort of training and continuing 22 education do you have in this area? 23 Α. Overall, I have a master's degree in 24 public administration. I've taken the Part A

course. I've taken a variety of hazmat courses so

that I have general understanding and awareness of how the process works -- the inspectors and how they do their job.

MR. BEELER: May I approach Your Honor?

THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You may.

(Staff Exhibit 2 marked for identification.)

BY MR. BEELER:

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- Q. I have what's been marked as Staff
 Exhibit 2, which is the notice of preliminary
 determination sent to the respondent, Tony Ford, on
 August 1, 2016. Do you recognize this document?
- A. Yes, I do.
 - Q. What is it?
- A. It's a notice of preliminary

 determination. It's sent to the carrier once we've

 had an opportunity to review the case and offer the

 respondent an opportunity for a conference.
 - Q. Did you review this document in preparation for today?
 - A. Yes, I did.
- Q. And is this document a commission record?
- 23 A. Yes, it is.
- Q. Kept in the ordinary business of the commission?

A. Yes.

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- Q. And it's the practice of the commission to make this report; is that correct?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. So I understand that a change is made -- one of the violations is deleted, according to Inspector Schneider. Can you please tell me, with that change, how does that affect this report?
- A. Yes. So the first violation that's listed on here, driving a CMV while disqualified, would be deleted from the violations listed.
 - Q. Okay.
- A. And what would remain are two \$100 violations for 391.14A-F and 392.16. These are what we call Group 4 violations, and they stand on their own with the dollar amount as listed on here. So the total would go from a \$300 total fine to a \$200 total fine.
- Q. So -- yeah. So with the change, we're essentially just going from \$300 to \$200, correct?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. All right. So that \$200 penalty -- is that consistent with the recommended fine schedule and recommended civil penalty procedure adopted by the Commercial Motor Vehicle Alliance?

- 1 Α. Yes. 2 And would you recommend the \$200 as the Q. correct amount to the commission? 3 4 Α. Yes. 5 MR. BEELER: No further questions. 6 Thank you. 7 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you. MR. BEELER: At this time, Your Honor, 8 Staff would move for the admission of Staff 9 Exhibit 1 and Staff Exhibit 2 into the record. 10 11 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: They will both 12 be admitted. 13 (Exhibits admitted into evidence.) 14 MR. BEELER: And, again, Staff would 15 renew its motion for default judgment for the balance of the remaining \$200 and the remaining two 16 17 violations from the report in this case. 18 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: The commission will take that under advisement. 19 20 MR. BEELER: Nothing further. 2.1 THE ATTORNEY EXAMINER: All right. 22 Thank you. We're adjourned.
