{¶ 1} Staff served a notice of preliminary determination (NPD) upon Curtis Holliday (Respondent), in accordance with Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-12, alleging a violation of the Commission's transportation regulations.

{¶ 2} On January 9, 2017, Respondent filed a request for an administrative hearing in the above-captioned case in accordance with Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-13.

{¶ 3} A prehearing settlement conference was held on February 28, 2017; however, the parties were unable to settle this matter.

{¶ 4} Accordingly, this matter shall be set for hearing on May 16, 2017, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Commission, 180 East Broad Street, 11th Floor, Hearing Room 11-D, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

{¶ 5} Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-14(E) provides that a respondent who has requested an administrative hearing and fails to appear for the hearing shall be in default. The rule additionally states that a respondent in default shall be deemed to have admitted the occurrence of the violation and waived all further right to contest liability for the forfeiture proposed in the NPD.

{¶ 6} At the hearing, Staff must prove, by a preponderance of the evidence, the occurrence of a violation, pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-20(A).

{¶ **7}** It is, therefore,

{¶ 8} ORDERED, That this matter be scheduled for hearing in accordance with Paragraph 4. It is, further,

{¶ **9}** ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
