I am writing to address some concerns with the new AEP proposal to increase mandatory residential fixed fees, case number 16-1852-EL-SSO.

My family utilizes AEP for out general electric power at our house. I am a college graduate from 2011 with a double major and have had trouble finding work in either of my fields. I am currently working in retail in order to pay off my student loans, however, I am still living at home because I cannot afford to move out and pay my loans at the same time. Being on this kind of income means a five dollar increase in our monthly bill will very negatively impact us across the entire year.
