{¶ 1} The Dayton Power and Light Company (DP&L) is an electric distribution utility as defined in R.C 4928.01(A)(6), and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

{¶ 2} Pursuant to the directives of R.C. 4928.143(F), the Commission is required to evaluate the earnings of each electric utility's approved electric security plan to determine whether the plan or offer produces significantly excessive earnings for the electric utility.

{¶ 3} On May 13, 2016, DP&L filed an application for the administration of the significantly excessive earnings test, as required by R.C. 4928.143(F) and Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-35-10 for 2015.

{¶ 4} Thereafter, on August 2, 2016, a stipulation and recommendation between DP&L and Staff was filed in the docket that purports to resolve all of the issues in the case.

{¶ 5} Accordingly, this matter should be set for hearing on June 14, 2017, at 10:00 a.m., at the offices of the Commission, 180 East Broad Street, 11th Floor, Hearing Room 11-C, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793. Testimony in support of the stipulation should be filed by June 12, 2017.

{¶ 6} It is, therefore,

{¶ 7} ORDERED, That a hearing be scheduled in accordance with paragraph 5. It is, further,

{¶ 8} ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
